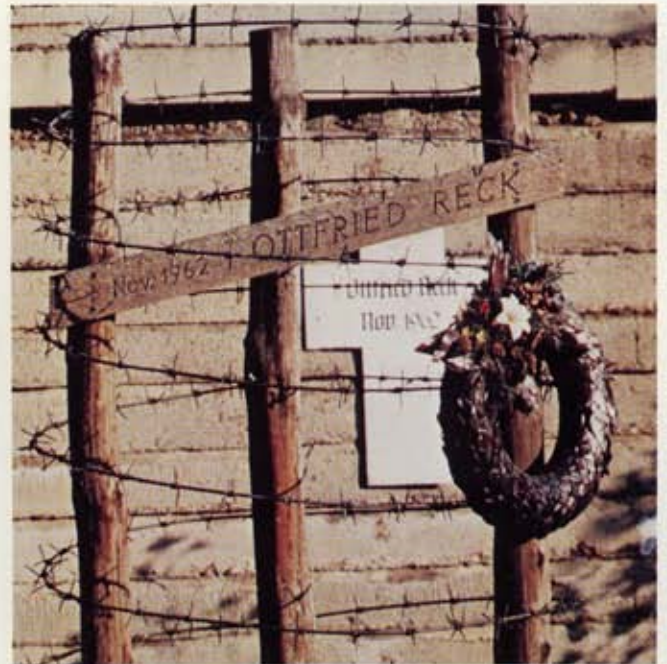

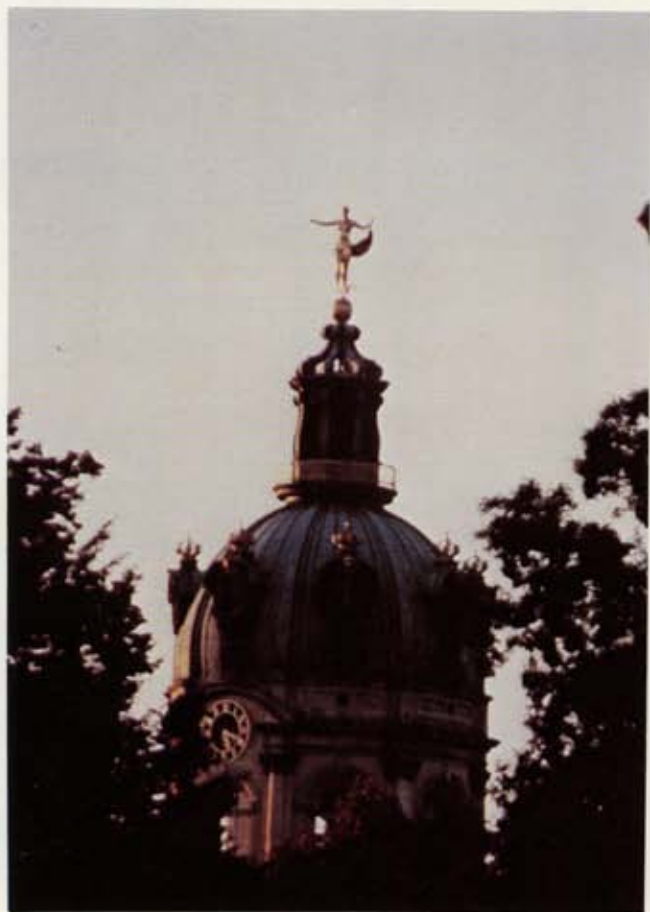

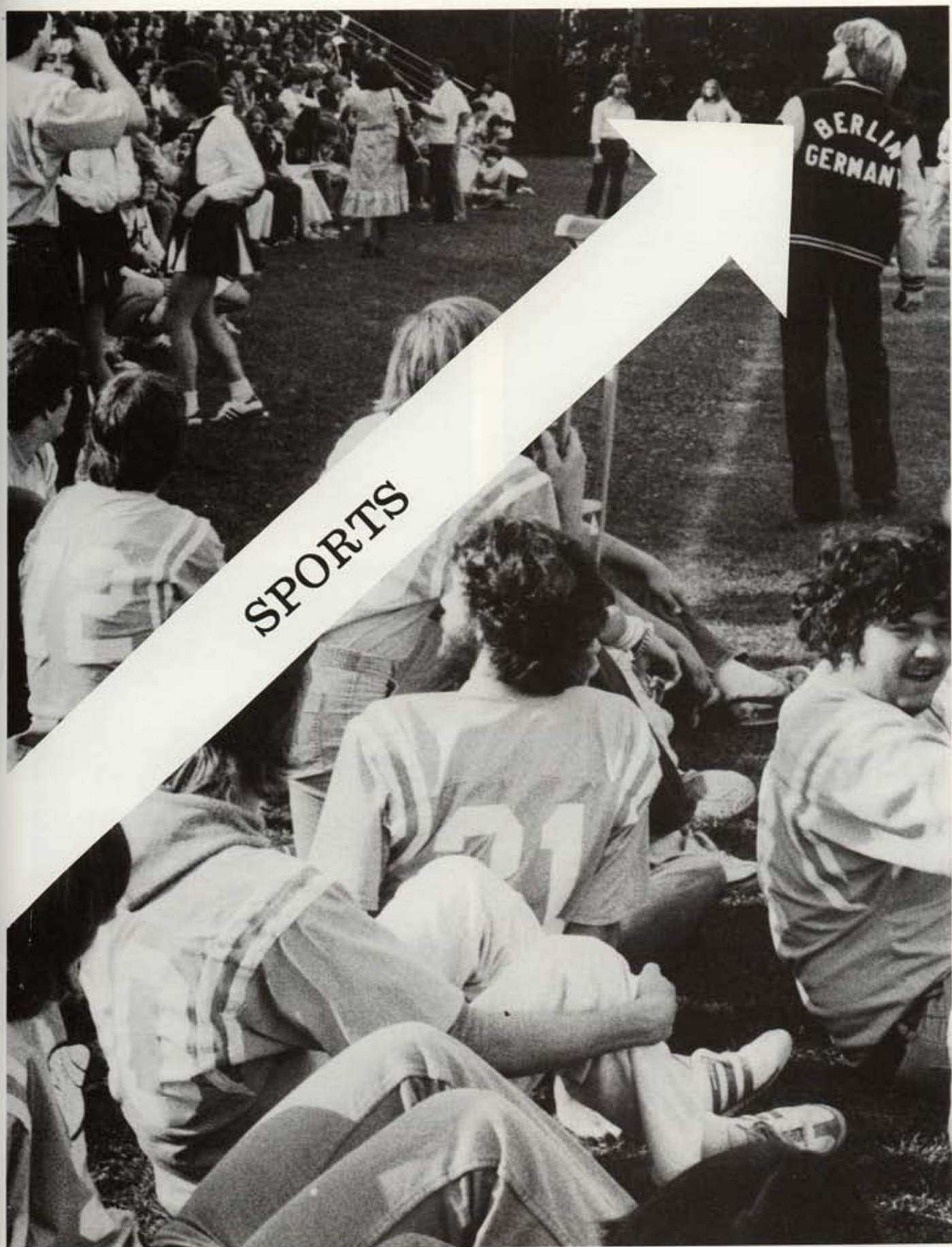














# Varsity Volleyball

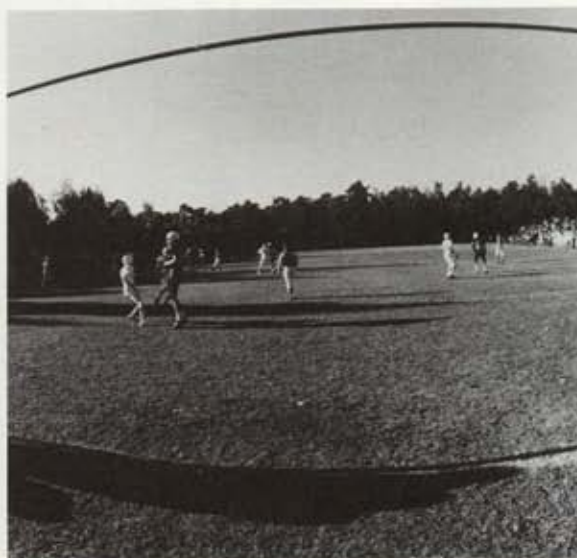

Berlin's number one Varsity men's runner, Orlando Rivera, captured 13th place in the men's class "B" Varsity race with a time of 24:38. Brent Norum, Berlin's number two runner, captured 15th place at the regionals with a time of 24:54.

Berlin's Varsity girl's sensation, Christy Schlifer, who took third place overall, was second in class "B" schools, with a time of 13:51, her fastest all season. This performance qualified her for the European Finals on Nov. 10th, in which she took 4th place.
