Seniors Show Class During Homecoming



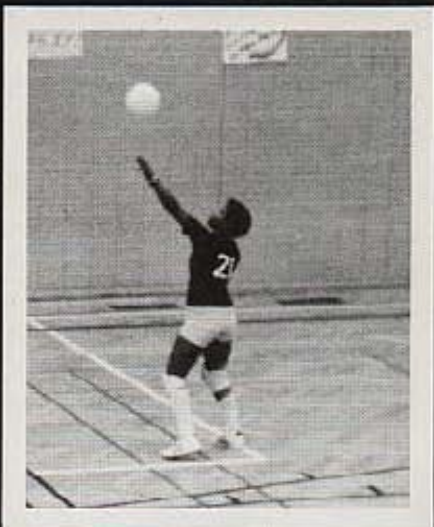

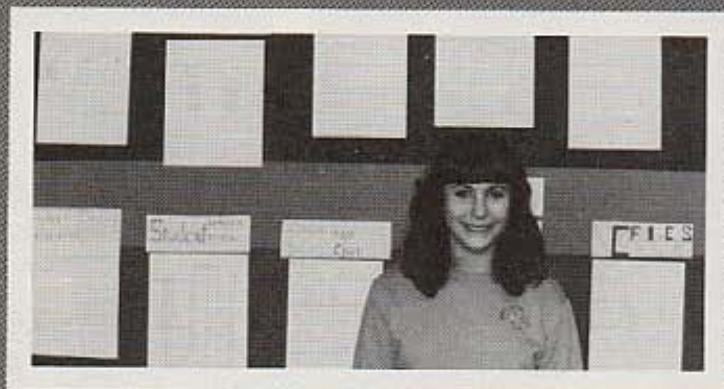
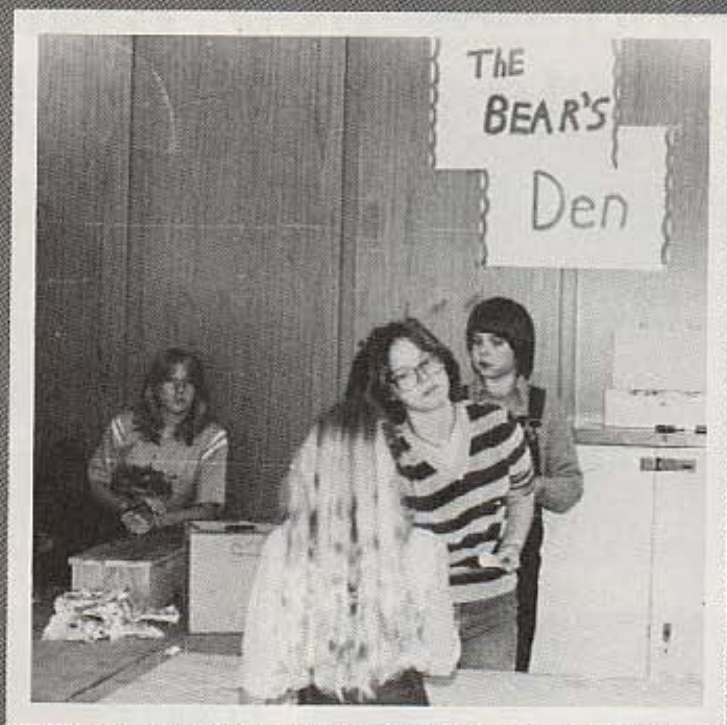
On the first day of the tournaments, after Dr. Jack served the first ball, Berlin came out on top.

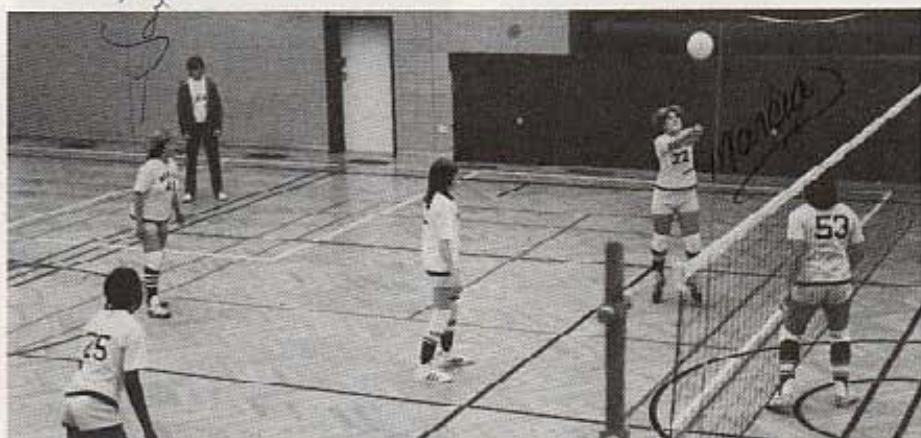
