

For it is daily international involvement which keeps the corridors open and Berlin free, and it is the personal involvement of thousands of Berlin merchants, technicians, truck drivers, diplomats and pilots, each with the other, that puts food on our tables and clothes on our backs.

Involvement in mankind is not a disposable option like a weekend at the beach; it's one of the conditions of life in Berlin. Get involved and use involvement as you would a tool to broaden your intellectual and social horizons. This experience can be a valuable lesson which will serve you well always.

Seniors Show Class During Homecoming





The parade was held before the Varsity Homecoming game. The six class floats followed the Marching Band through the BB housing area.





The drama production, Bell, Book, and Candle, was performed at the Andrews Music and Theater Center the 13th, 14th, and 15th of November, and was a great success.








British Take Berlin by Storm






Faculty, Students Battle in V-Ball


Berlin Hosts V-Ball Tournament

On the first day of the tournaments, after Dr. Jack served the first ball, Berlin came out on top.






This year's Junior High Gyp Joint was set up to enable the Seventh and Eighth grade classes the opportunity to participate in a variety of school activities.


This year, under the new leadership of Ted Colquhoun, the Berlin Bear-A-Cudas posted a very exciting and victorious season.
