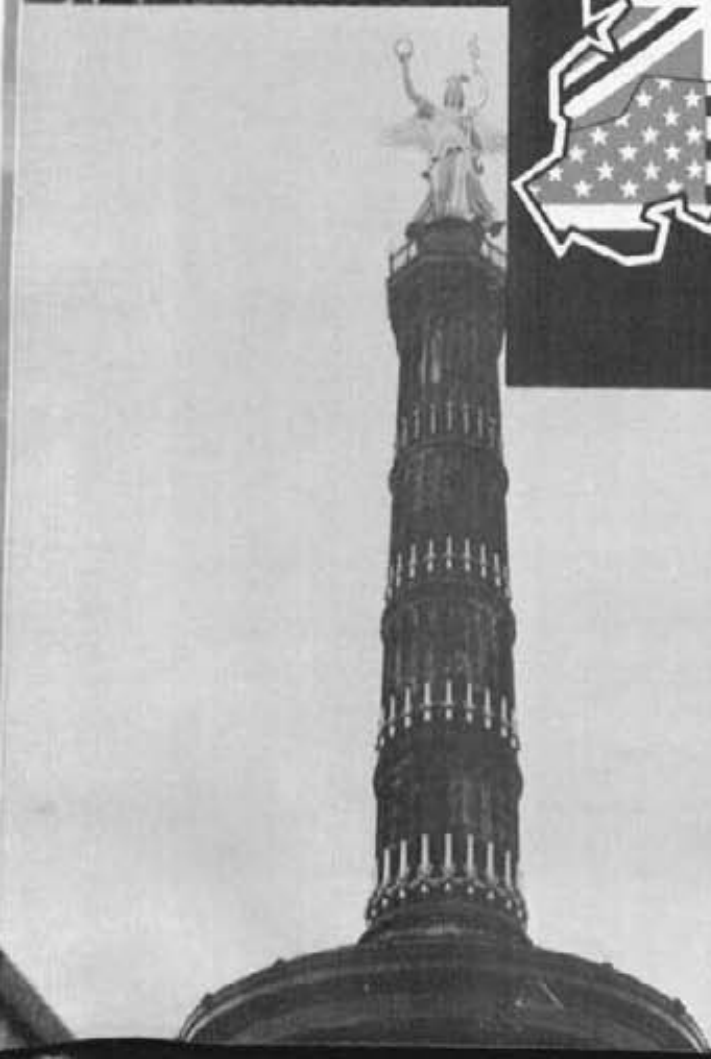

If you decide to take the chance of not buying a ticket you better watch out for the "blue coats" or you may be paying a 40 mark fine.

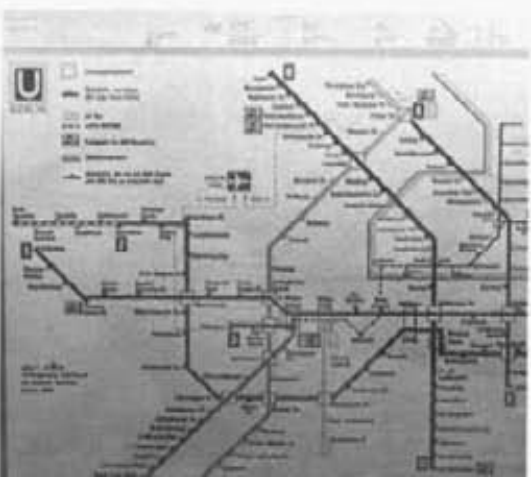

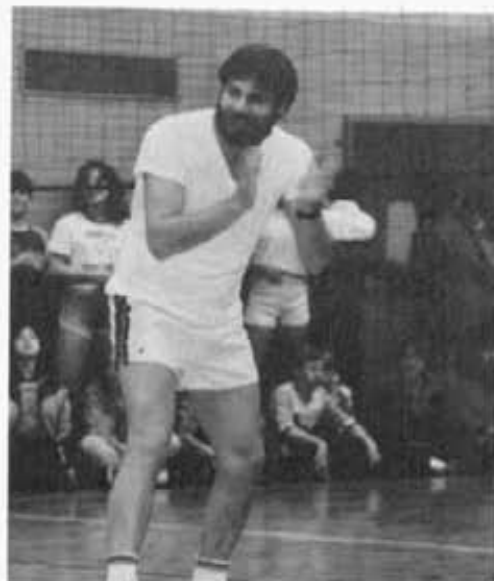

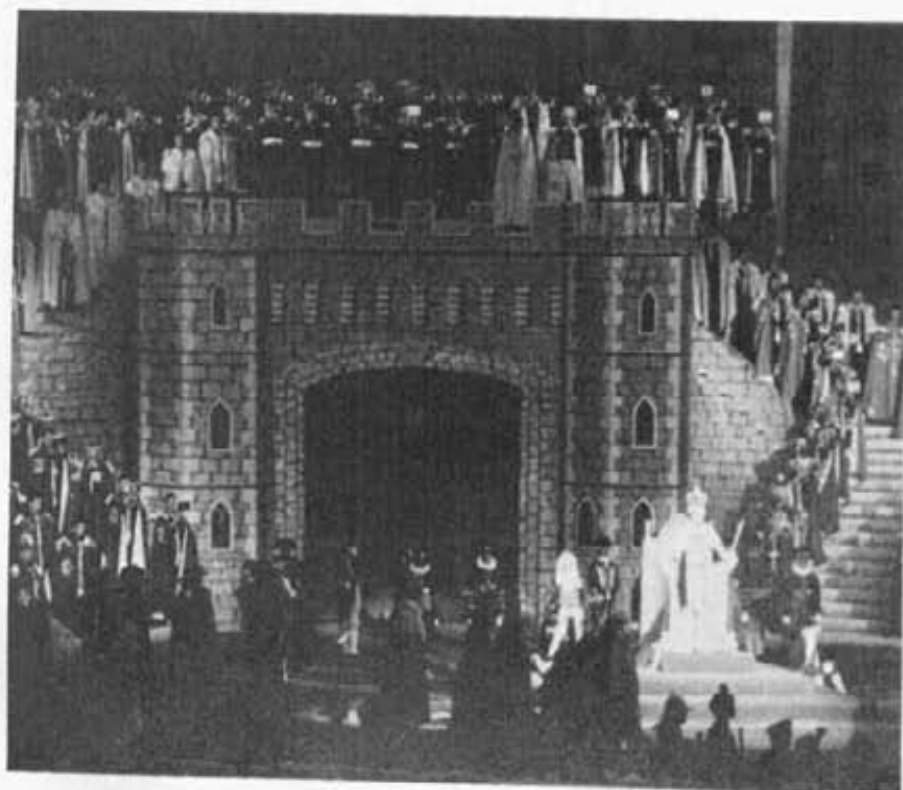

There was much enthusiasm shown by the whole school through participation in this important part of Spirit Week.

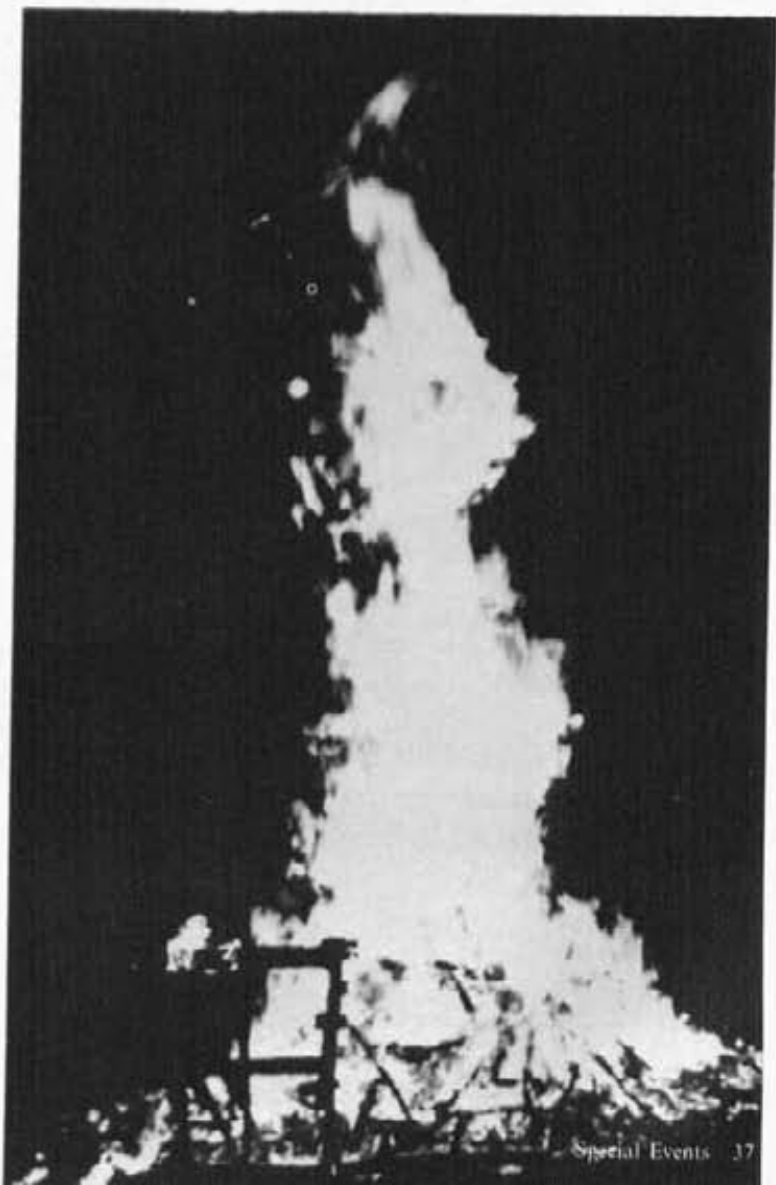
Bearin' Down . . .

THE BERLIN WALL .



... Freedom is Precious!



On August 12, 1961 at 12:30 a.m. a long line of trucks, with headlights blazing, formed on the east side of Bernauer Strasse. At 12:37 both AP and UPI sent out a flash, "Vopos are unrolling barbed wire along the whole length of the frontier between East and West Berlin". By one a.m. the East Zone Press Agency had declared the border closed.

During the first few days many escapes took place due to the crude construction of the wall. Soon after, the Wall was rebuilt using wooden planks. This made it harder, but escapes still took place. Next the Wall was built out of concrete blocks. This Wall gave way to the wall that stands today. The Wall stands between 9 and 12 feet high and is topped by a concrete cylinder making scaling impossible.

The Wall stands today as a symbol, to the free world, of the communist threat.
