




















## People














#### **COUNSELORS**










Frau Taylor and Ms. Lockwood, as librarians, are also part of this year's support staff.

#### PE/HEALTH



#### **FOREIGN LANGUAGE**






### Sophomores






While being a step below seniors, it was still better than two or three steps below as they were in previous years. Being a step below meant something better for next year — being SENIORS!

## A New Beginning at BHS




BHS came alive as teachers started back to school on August 17. Students were registered for school on the week of August 10.




















#### Through Rain and Shine . . .




