# The Administration






As I write these words, school year 1982-83 is just beginning. And we are having a wonderful start.





In a continuing effort to offer students all possibilities for selfexpression and improvement, our staff was always there.





Even though the juniors showed excellence in many events, it wasn't enough to overcome the senior spirit.


The class of "83" was finally superior, taking the spirit stick for the first time in four years.


# Daisy Mae and Lil' Abner Strike Again!

Saturday, November 19 was the date of the Sadie Hawkins dance here at BHS. The scene was set in the cafeteria, and the church, jail, and lots of straw set








### **Student Council**

# Croppers, Quad-paks, and Picas











#### Freshman Feelings
