












HOMECOMING 1986







THE YEARBOOK STAFF of KAHS is a hard-working group; putting together a yearbook consists of a lot more than sending a bunch of pictures to the publisher. The book must be planned in detail, with attention to theme, events, and activity sections and space for each allotted on a diagram called a ladder. Photo schedules have to be set up to cover as many events as possible. Sponsors and coaches have to be contacted. Photos have to be shot, processed, and selected. The nearly 700 candid photos in this book were selected from more than 2000 photos taken. Each photo must then be stamped, cropped, and its position indicated precisely on special 4-copy sheets called quad-paks. Every word in the yearbook must be written, typed, proofread, and its position indicated on the quad-pak. Headlines must be written and fitted. All this has to be done by mid-January to insure that the book is received by students in the spring. Meanwhile, funds have to be raised. Because of the high cost of printing and the small number of copies that are run, the actual cost of the yearbook is around \$30,00 per copy. Our thanks to the community groups who sponsored pages — their help allowed us to sell the book to the student body at a price much lower than than the actual cost.




KNIGHTS FOOTBALL
