
LEADERS OF TOMORROW PRACTICE TODAY



Drama Class Does Many Presentations.



Hurricane Hugo's destruction swept across the Caribbean killing 27 people and left 150,000 homeless.

A suddenly opened gate at an English soccer stadium caused a stampede that killed 95 fans.

Scandals forced the resignations of Japanese Prime Minister Noboru Takeshita and short-lived successor, Sosuke Uno.


