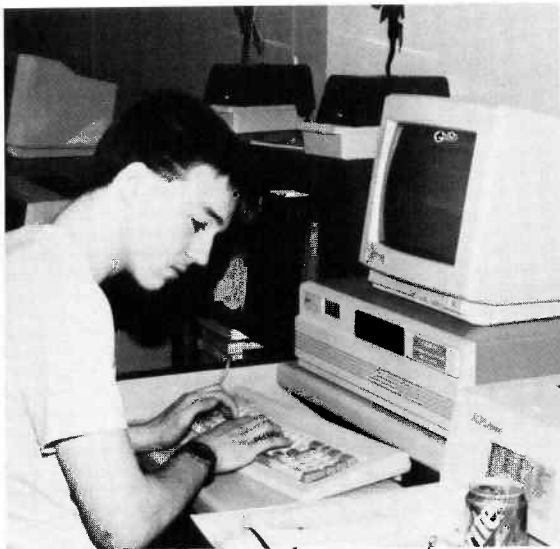
LEADERS OF TOMORROW PRACTICE TODAY

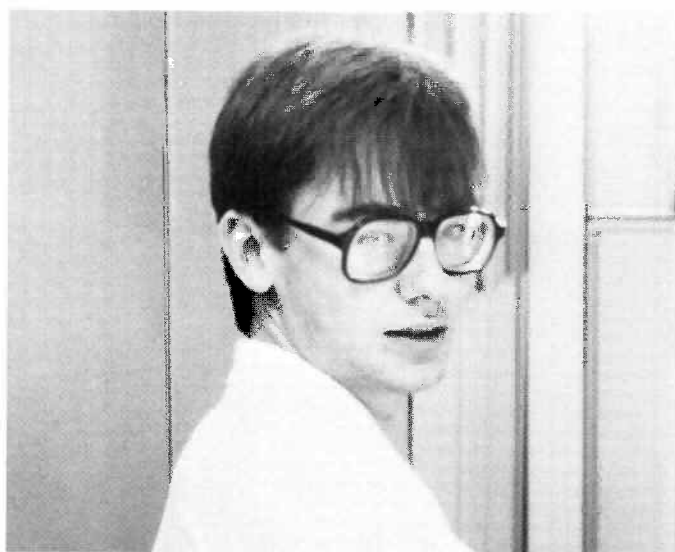

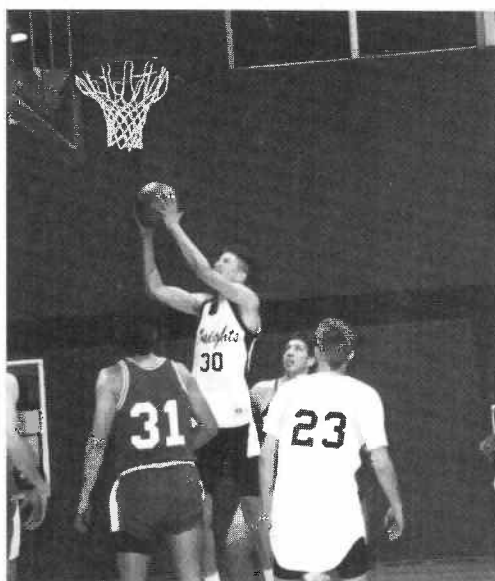

The team finished their season on a high note with Michelle Haase placing 5th on balance beam and Tanja Jimenez placing 6th on bars in the Central European Championships.

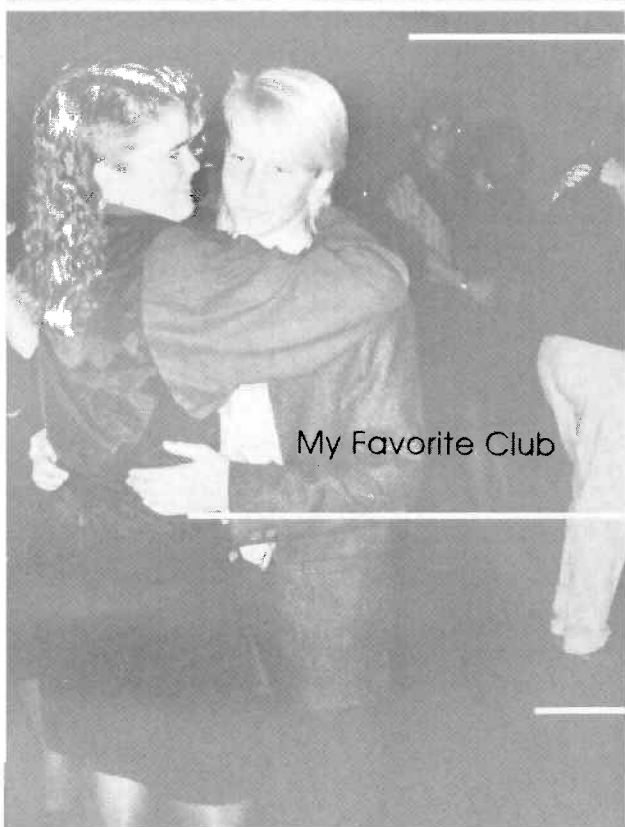




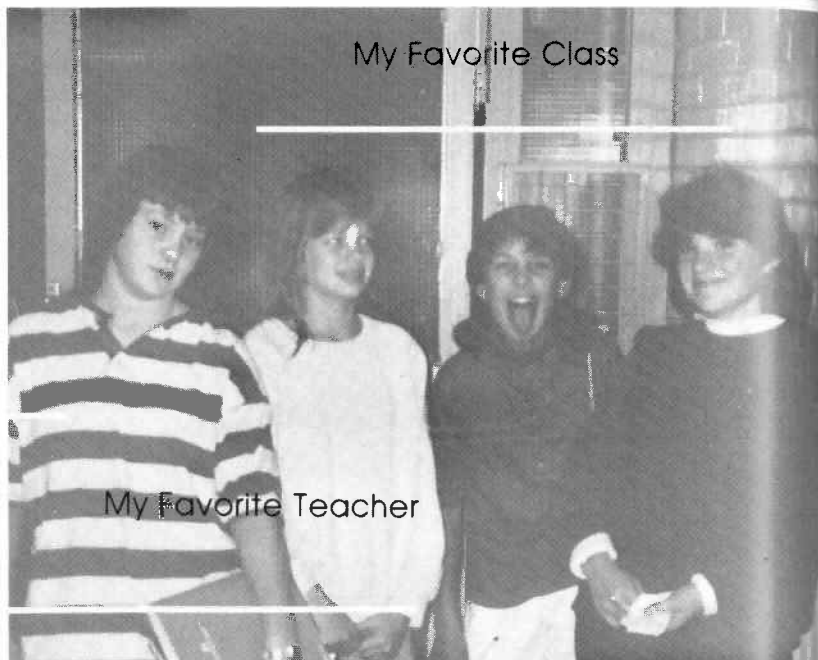

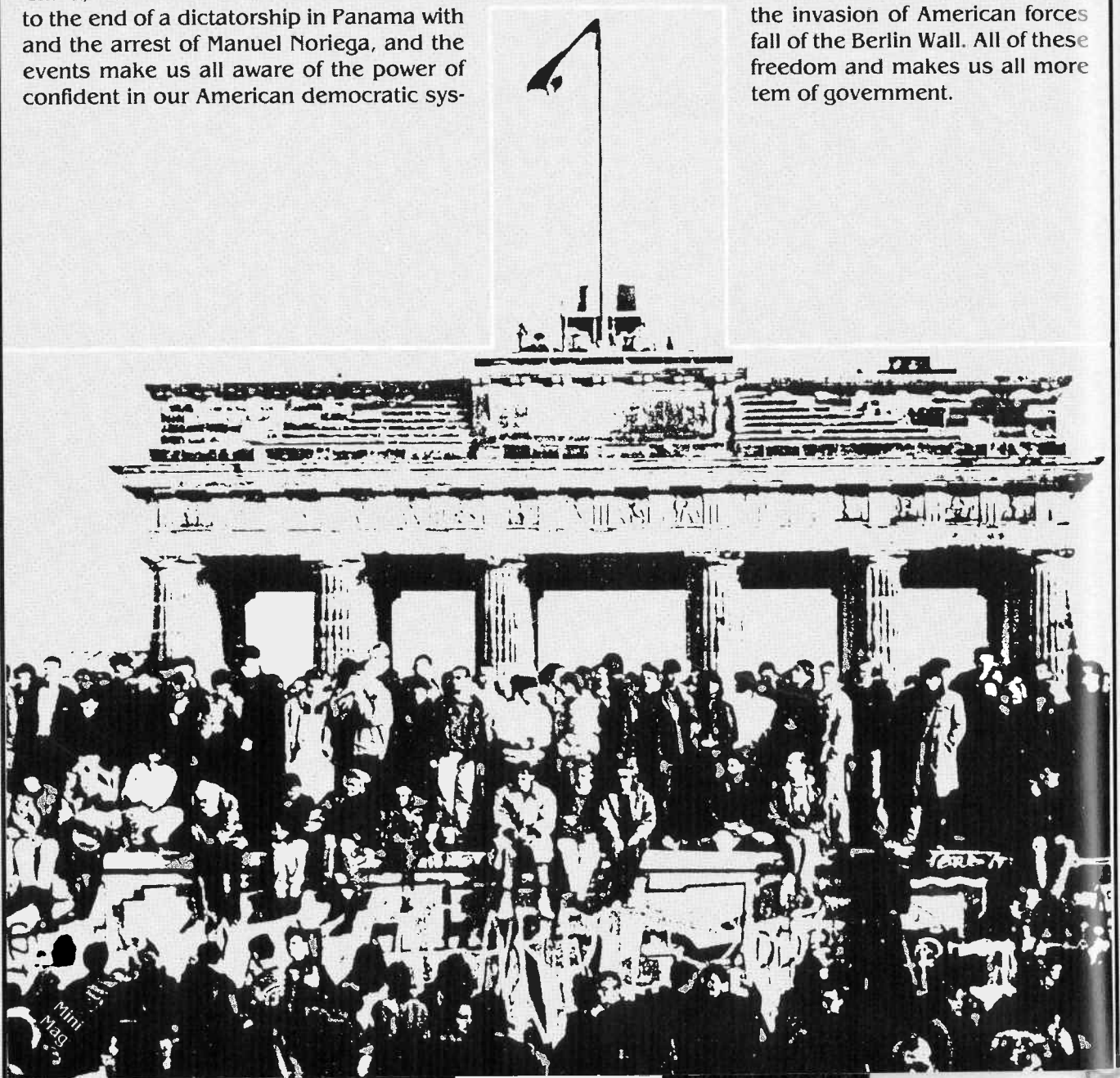
THE WALL CAME TUMBLING DOWN

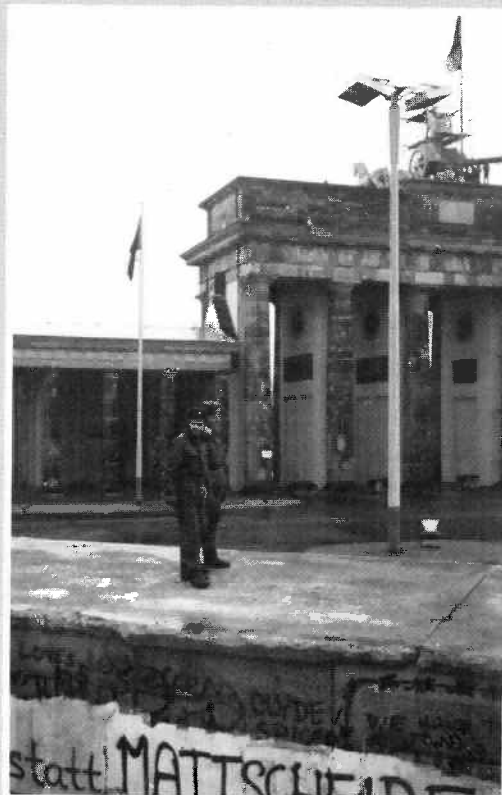
