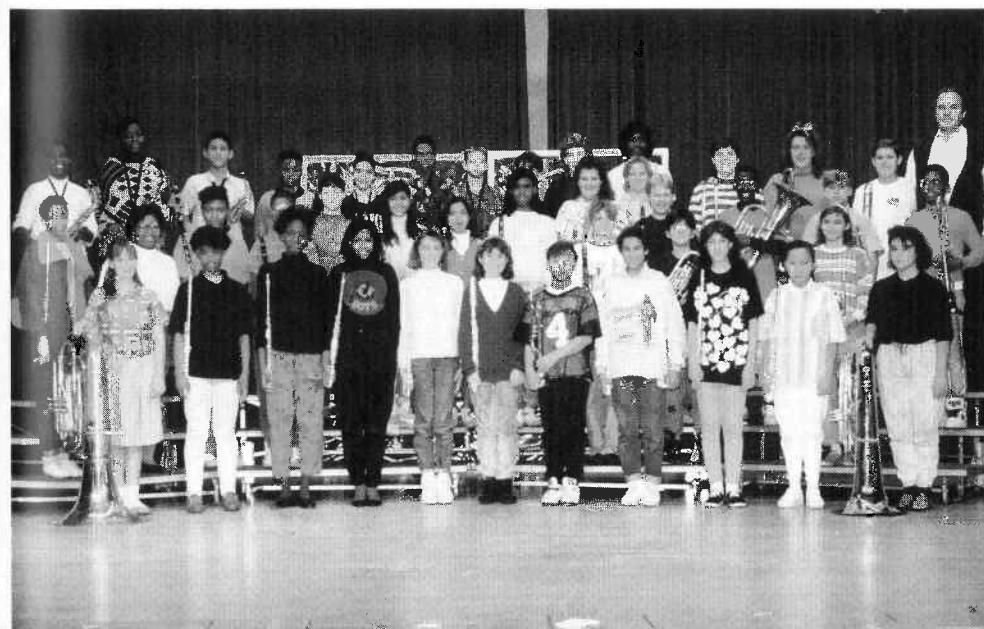
## Chorus

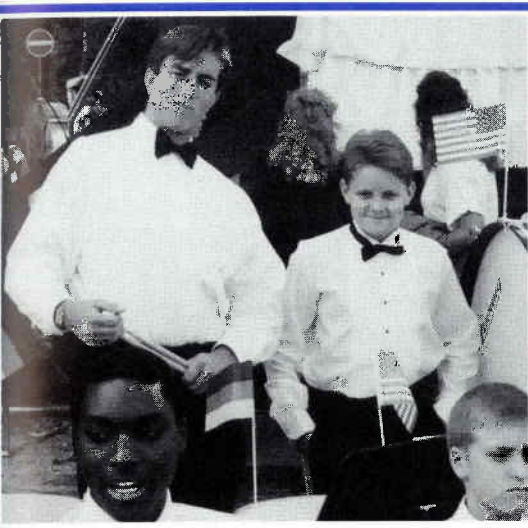

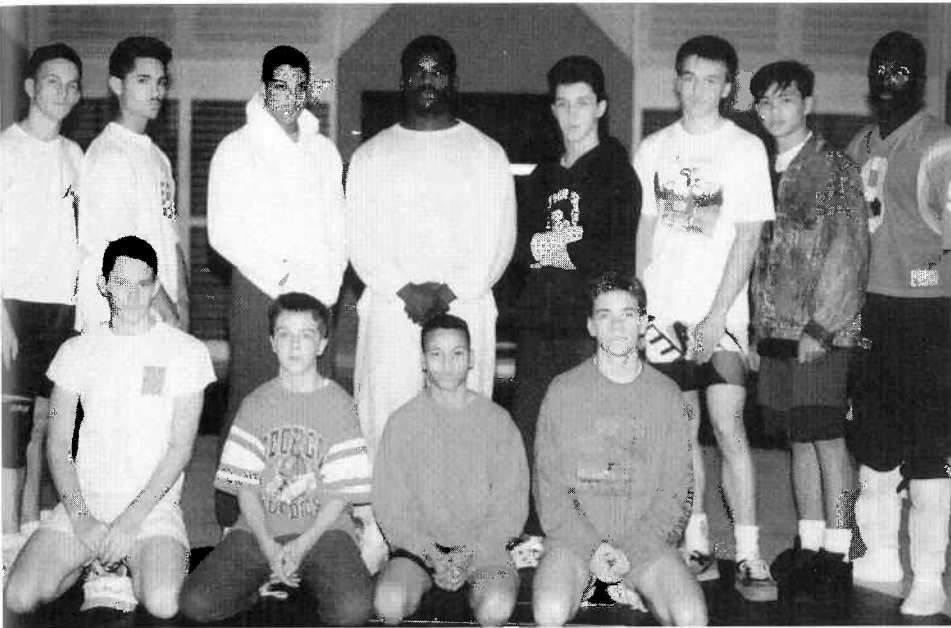

# Reunification

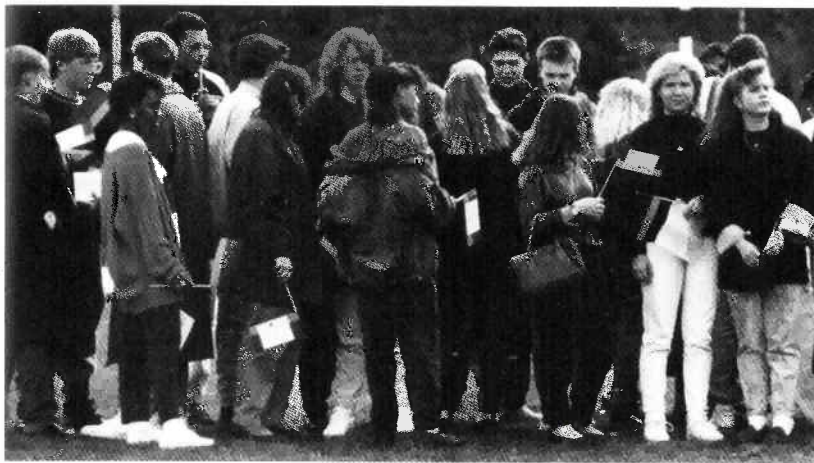
