Discover yourself; drama allows this. You can reach out and grasp the many facets of life. Rehearsals, rehearsals, rehearsals - a must for every successful performance. They are best when actors are on time, prepared, and attentive. Acting is cumulative. It's a combination of acquired technique through study and experience, enjoyment of make-believe, imagination, sincerity, personal charm, ability to take directions, and talent. Memorizing is a skill and becomes easier the more you do it. Lines are not the only thing an actor memorizes. He also memorizes movements, fellow cue lines, and the performance outline as a whole. Awareness is developed - awareness that the theater involves team work between actors and production staff; that the body expresses feelings and can be made to respond on cue; that a bond can develop between the actor and the audience.

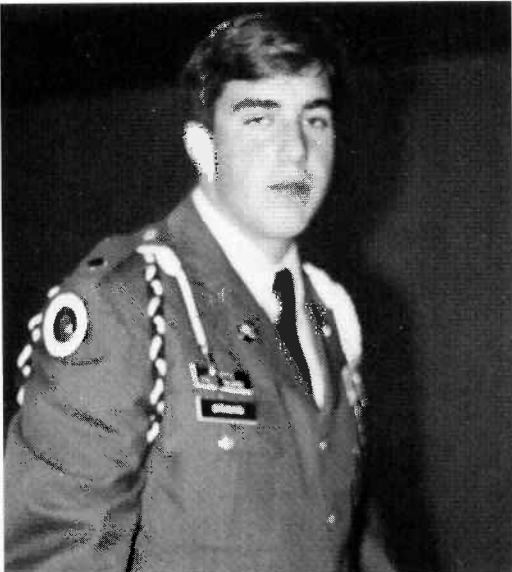

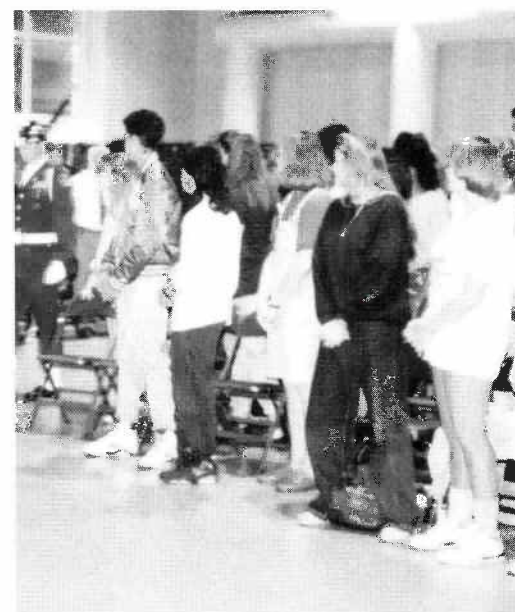

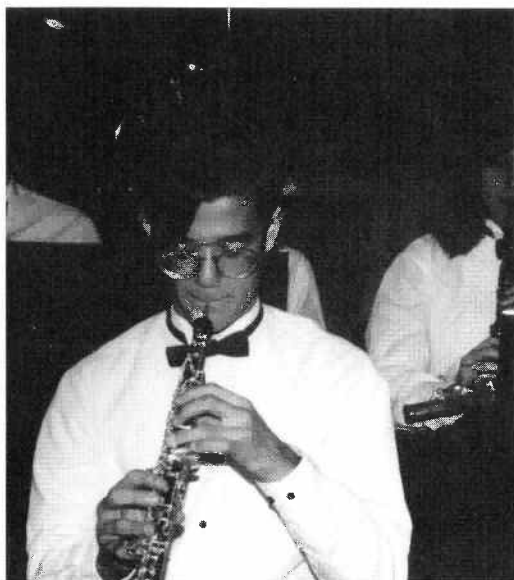
This year, for the first time, the band was able to participate in the Ramstein Air Force Base Honors Band. Some students also attended the DODDS Honors Band.

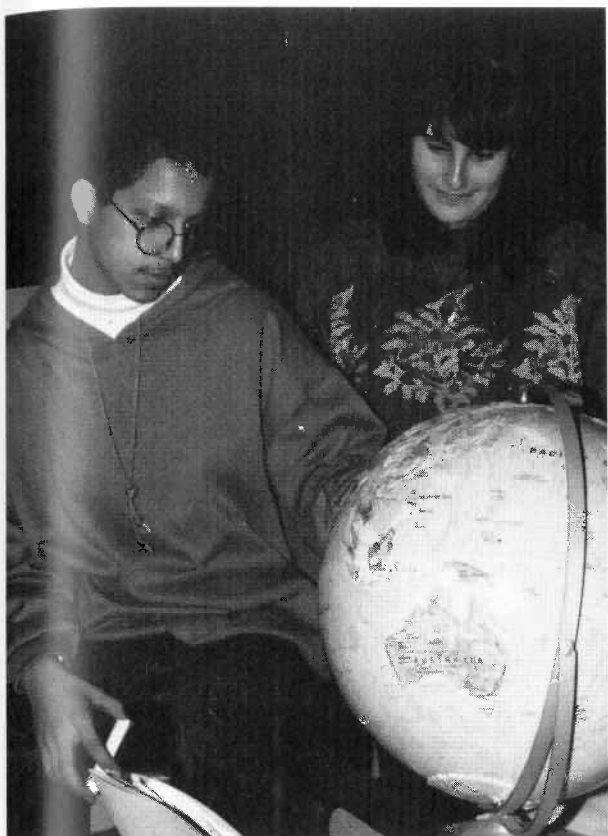

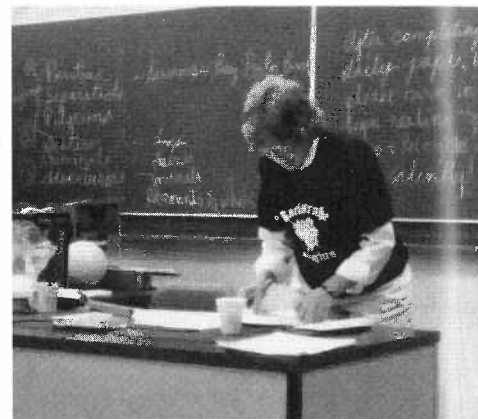


Will the work ever end?

Ms. Clark, the yearbook sponsor, said, "This staff is one of the best staffs I've ever had. they're dedicated, hard-working, and they care about their school."

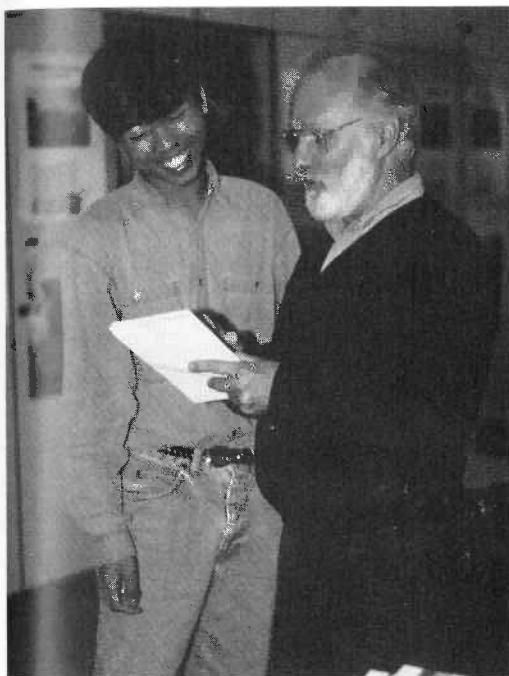
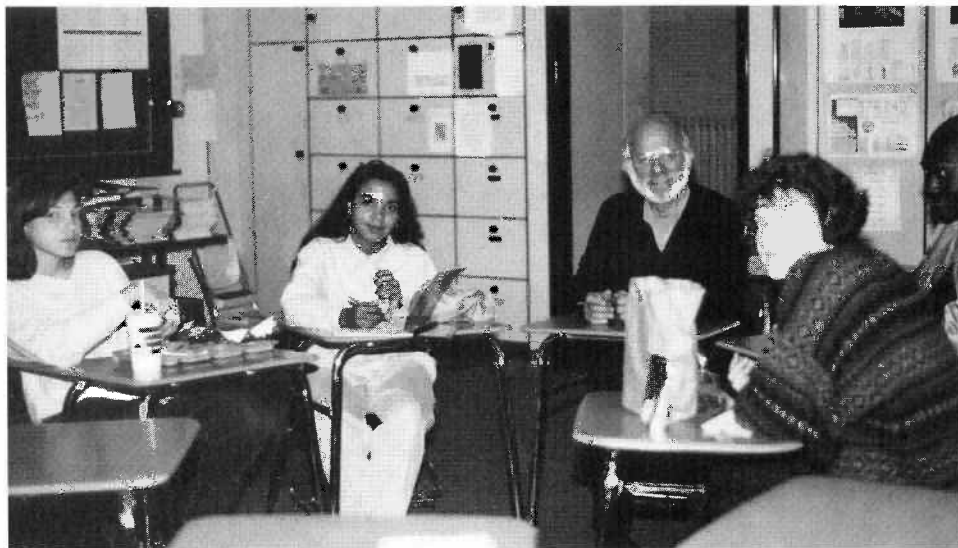
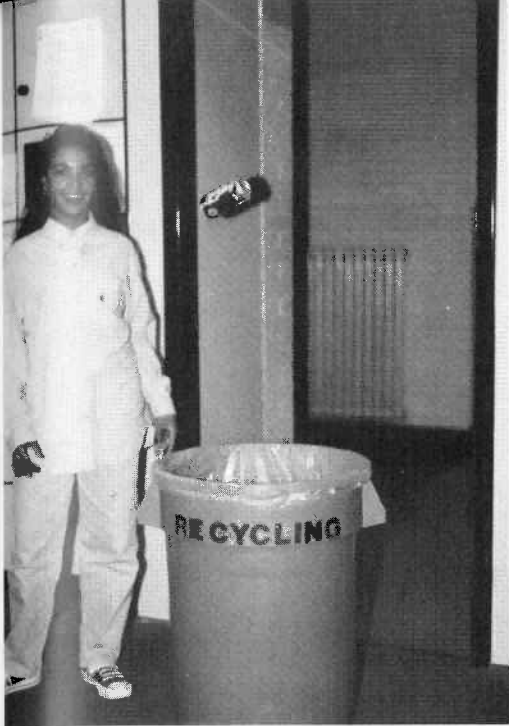

The team did very well this year. They won some games, and they lost some games, but it didn't diminish their spirits any. Mr. Fritz hopes to have a great team next year, as well.

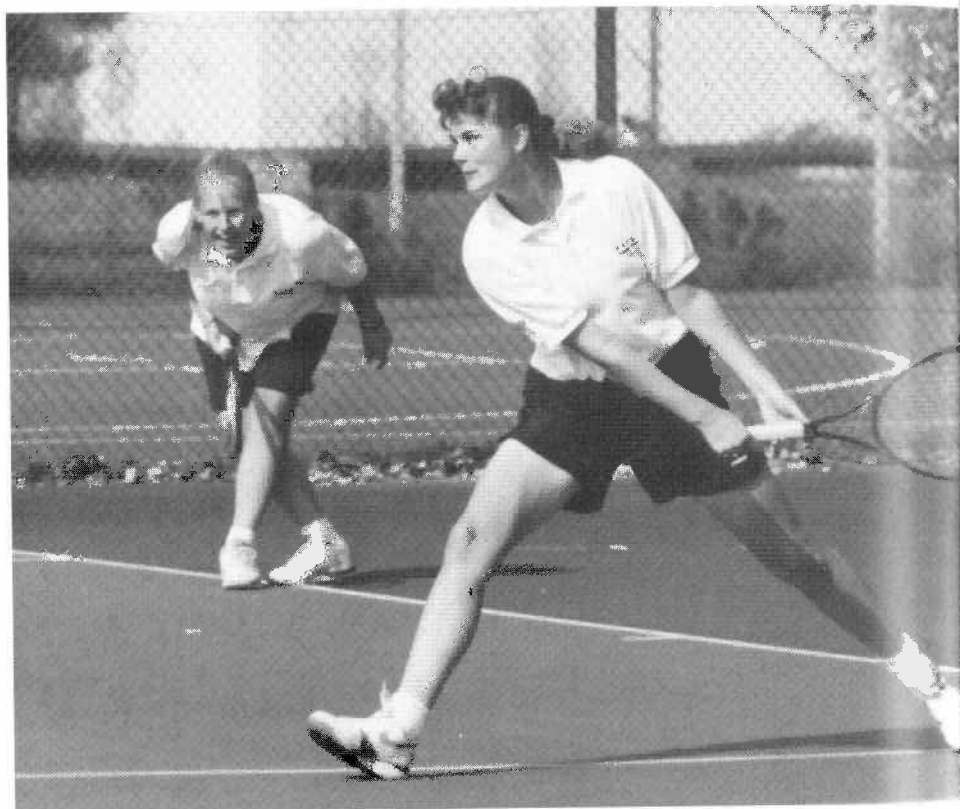

Soviet Union No More

On Jan. 1, 1992, the Soviet Union did not exist.
