
# Spirit Week







The sophomore class kept up the yearly tradition of starting their bench later than every other class.







The Würzburg High School Cross Country Boys and Girls teams have had a great year.

Coached by Mr. Johnson and Ms. Chambers, the boys placed second at Würzburg, first at Ansbach, third at Hanau, Frankfurt International School and Kaiserslautern, and fourth at Heidelberg and Division 1. The girls placed second at Hanau and Frankfurt International School, and fourth at Heidelberg and Division 1.

The best female cross country performer at Würzburg High School in ten years, Maria Garcia (season best time 19:53) had 2 first place finishes (Ansbach and Hanau), 3 second places, placed fourth in Division 1 and fifteenth at European finals. Heidi Berquist (season best time





Thanks to Coach Sullivan there are pictures of track stars in action.















#### MODEL UNITED STATES SENATE

MUSS is a worthwhile and unique simulation activity that allows students from DoDDS (Germany, the Azores, Italy, Iceland, England, Turkey and Bahrain) to come face to face with the procedures of the US Senate. Participants from WAHS are: Allison Atterberry (Majority Whip Don Nickles), Stephan Bayer (Computer and Security), Katharine Bayer (Press Corps), Angie Carrillo (Ecology Lobbyist), Eric Dowly (Senator Bob Graham D-FL), Alexandra Mateo (Senator John Rockefeller D-WV), Robert Newton (Frank Lautenberg D-NJ), Patrick Otwell (Wildlife Lobbyist), and Rachel Wolfe (Senator Conrad Burns R-MT). The person responsible for organizing this event is Mrs. Karen Webber, who is not only the WAHS sponsor but the Director of the European MUSS program as well.

Before coming to Bad Kissingen, one hundred students are assigned the roles of US Senators. Others attend as lobbyists, press, cabinet members, the President and Vice-President. Each student prepares a bill on topics from one of the seven committees issues which include foreign relations, environmental affairs, internet regulation and welfare. The students are required to research domestic and global issues in Keeping with the viewpoints of their role.

During the course of four days, senators and lobbyists meet in committees and as the full Senate to discuss and debate bills. The President meets with his Cabinet and delivers the State of the Union Address in the Opening Ceremony. The reporters are Kept busy meeting the deadlines for the production of a daily newpaper, The Capitol Press. MUSS is a unique DoDDS program that provides and enjoyable and excellent opportunity for students to learn first hand about their government.
