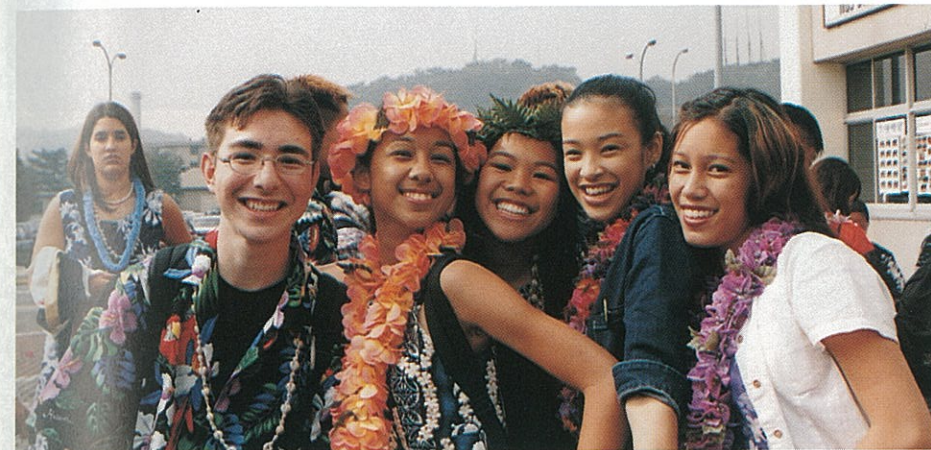
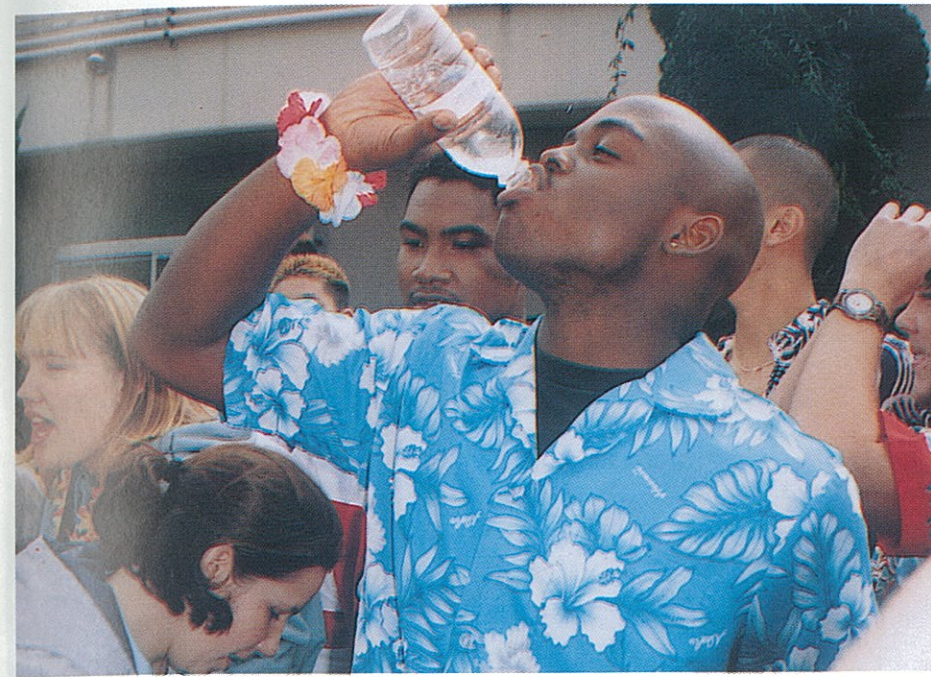
SPIRIT WEEK

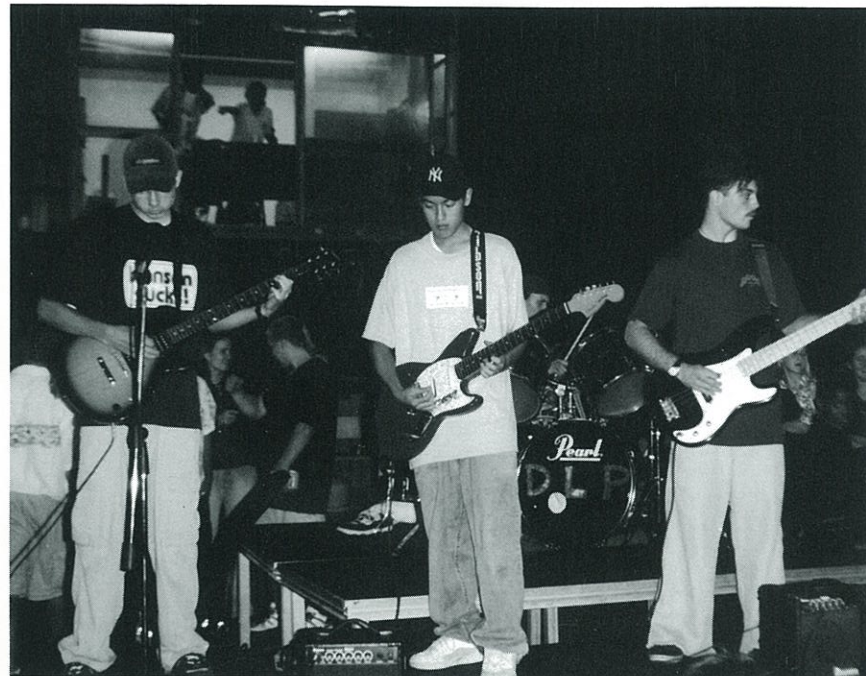

CARNIVAL AND FLOATS '98

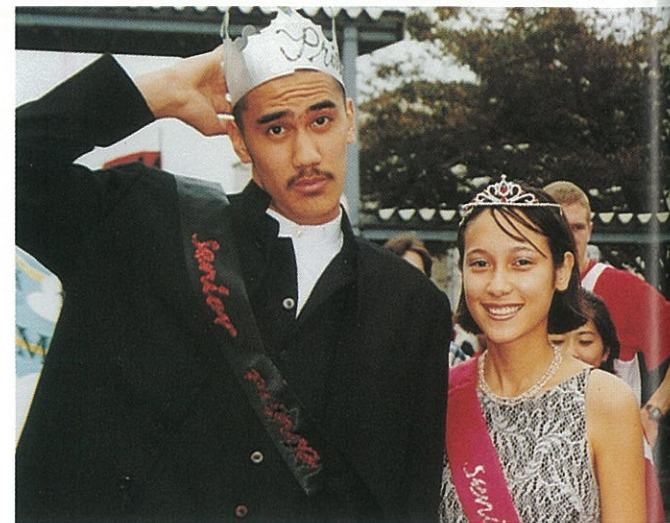
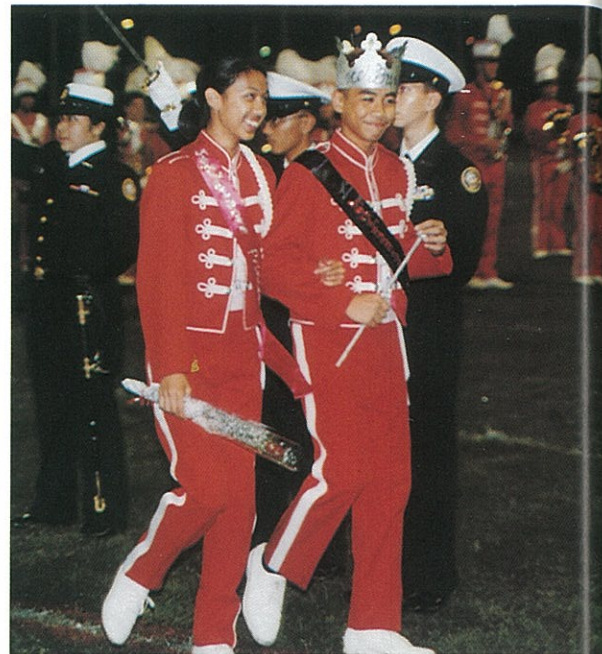

Homecoming means spirit!!!

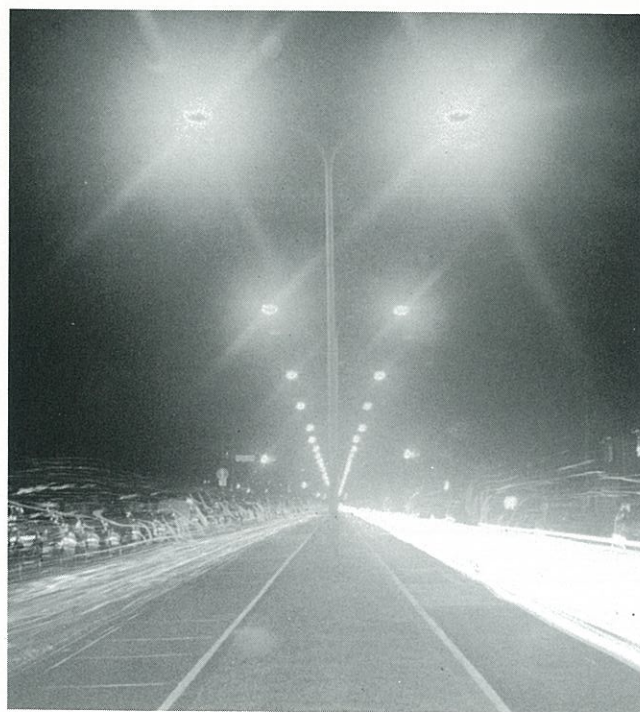

Choosing the right direction

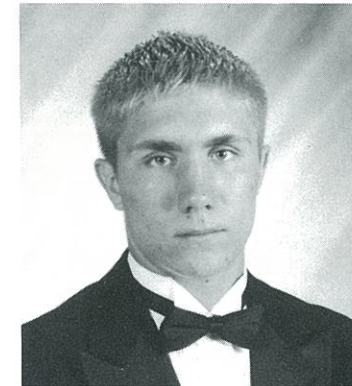
Ever since Roshandra Ellington was seven years old, she has been determined to pursue a career in international corporate law.

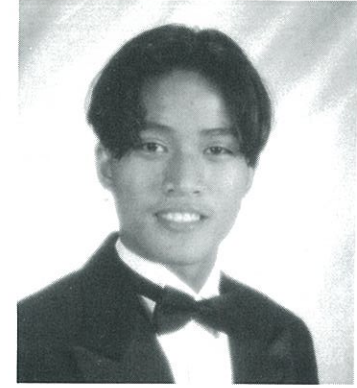
Choosing The Right Direction

Nick is making plans to reach his goal, and is choosing his own direction.

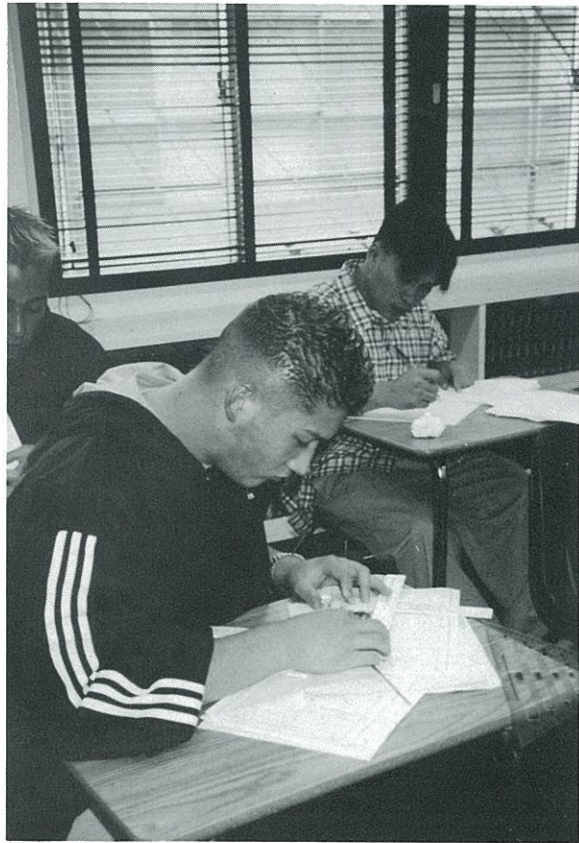

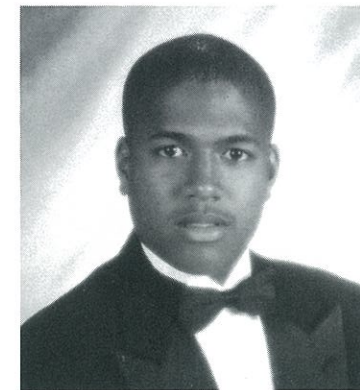
Choosing The Right Direction

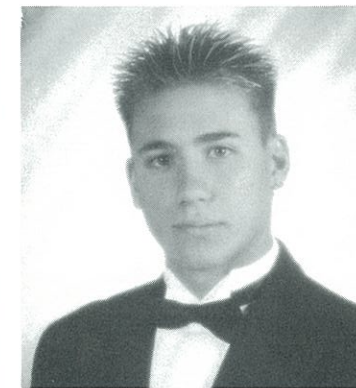
Choosing the Right Direction

Carren Bell knows her goal in life and is determined to reach it. She has made her plans, and is choosing her own direction.



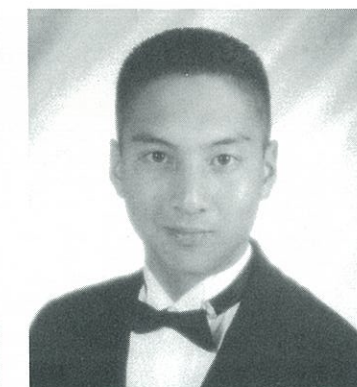

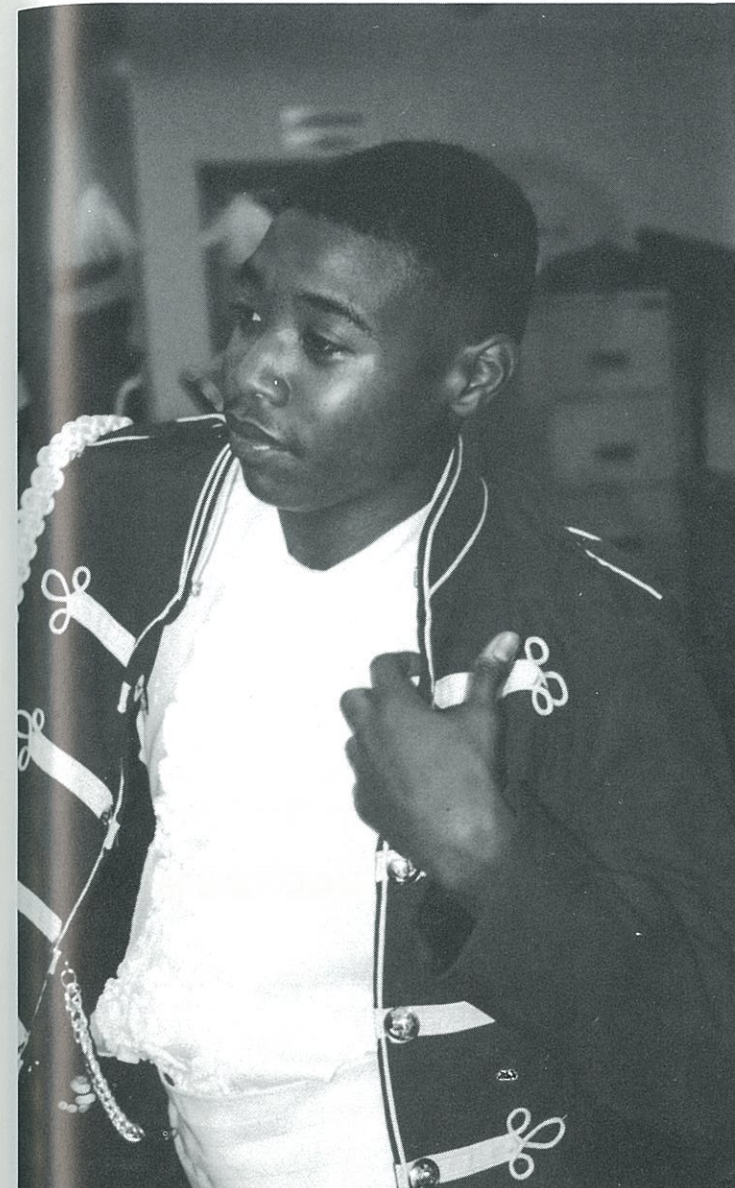

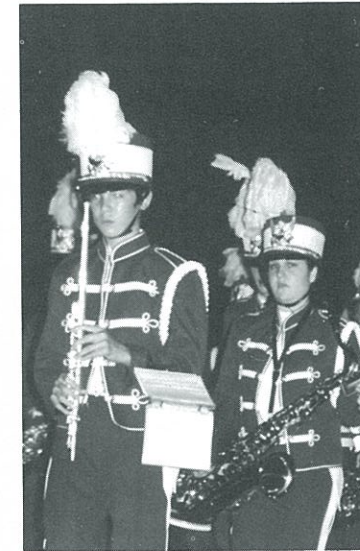

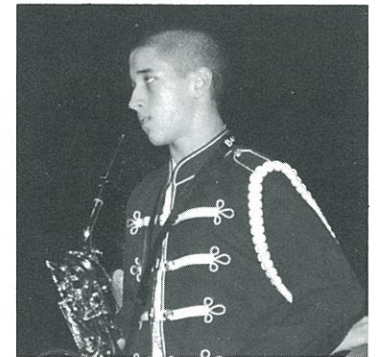

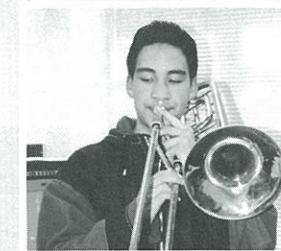

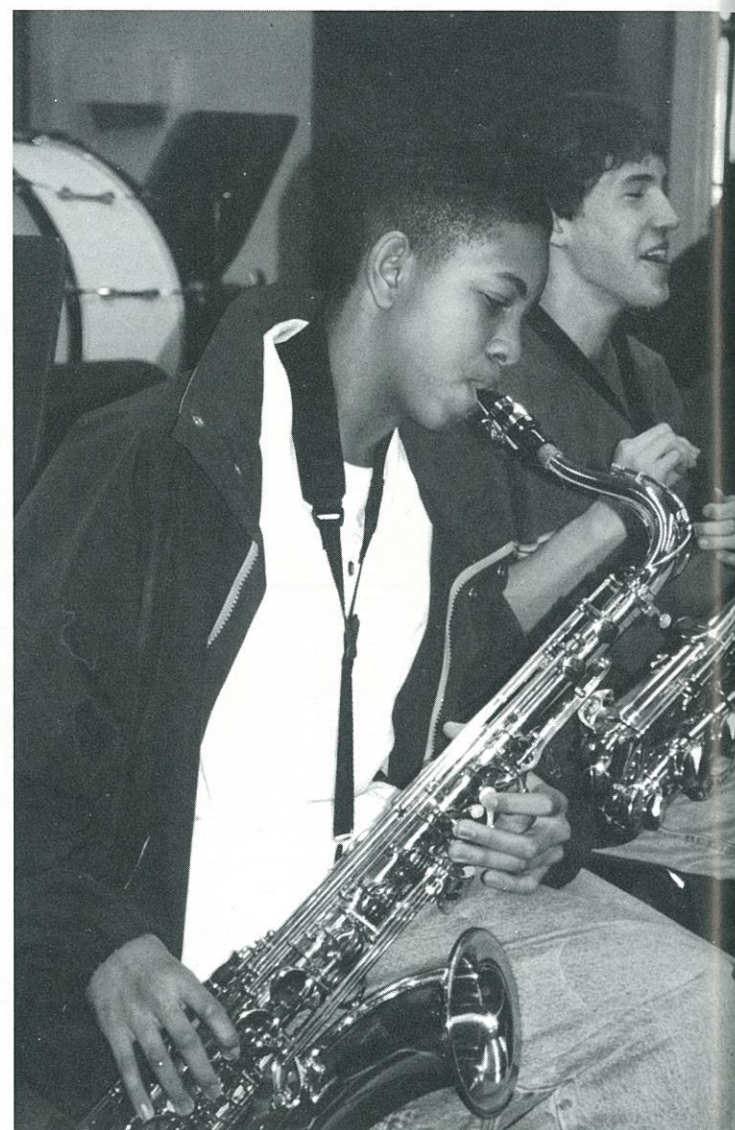

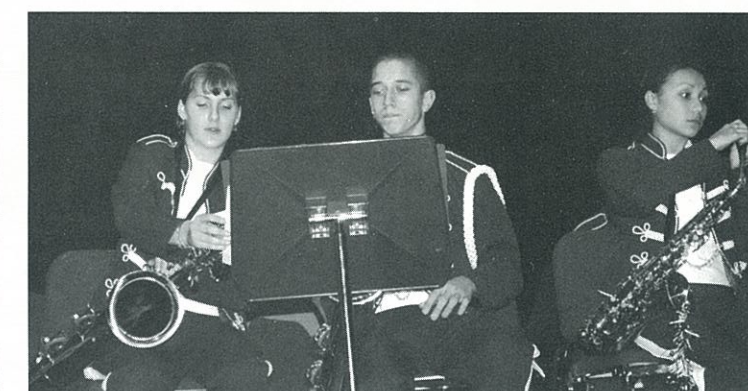
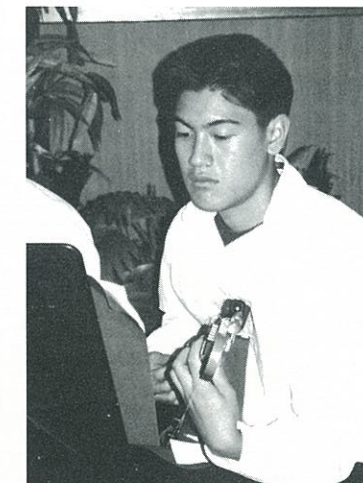

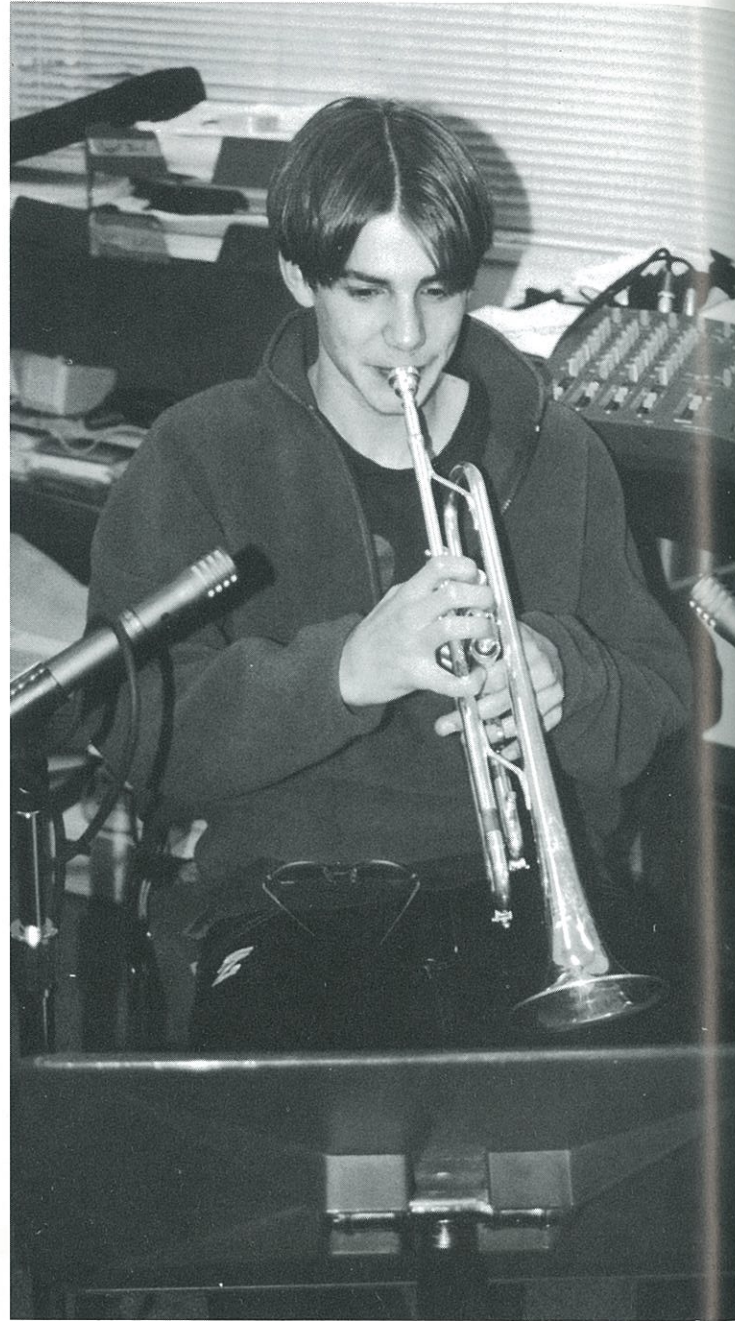

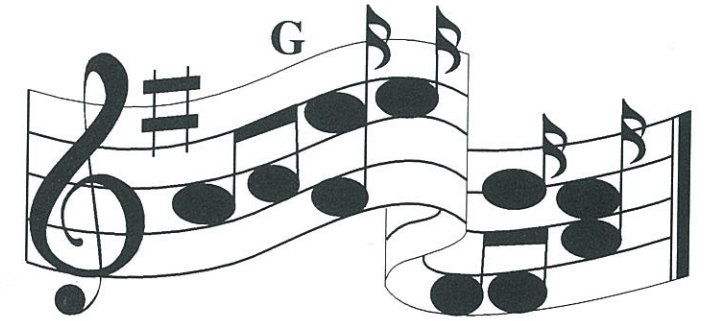

From chanting to Mozart to

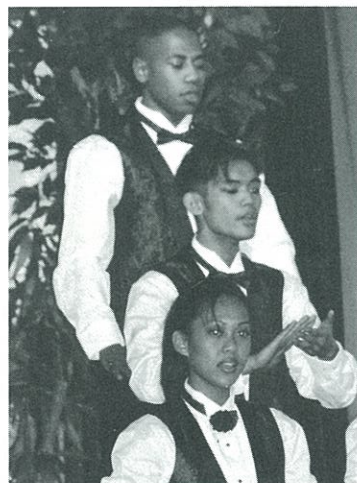

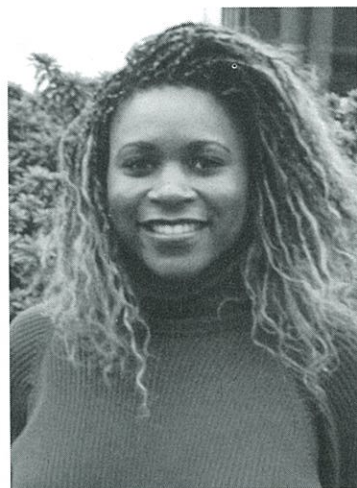

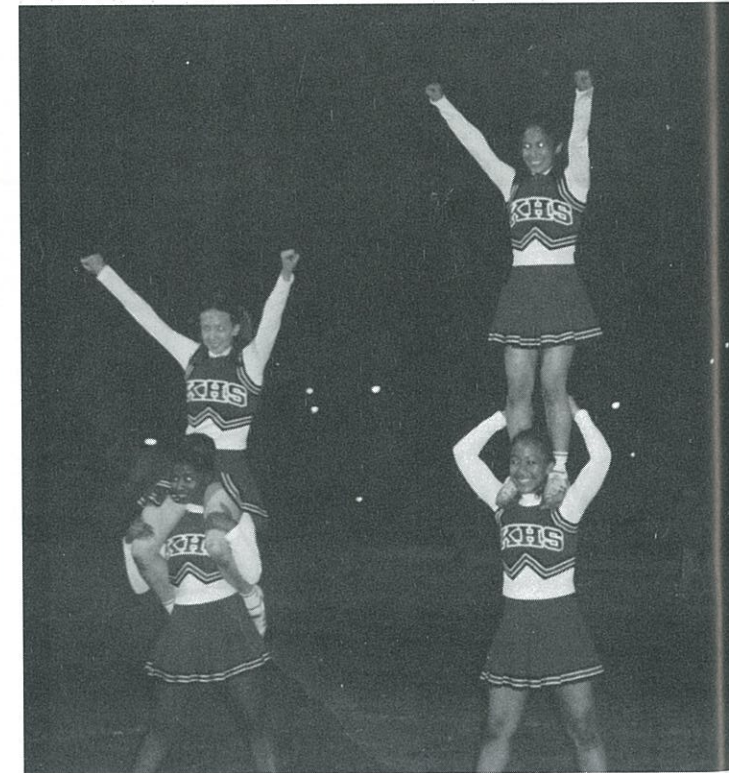

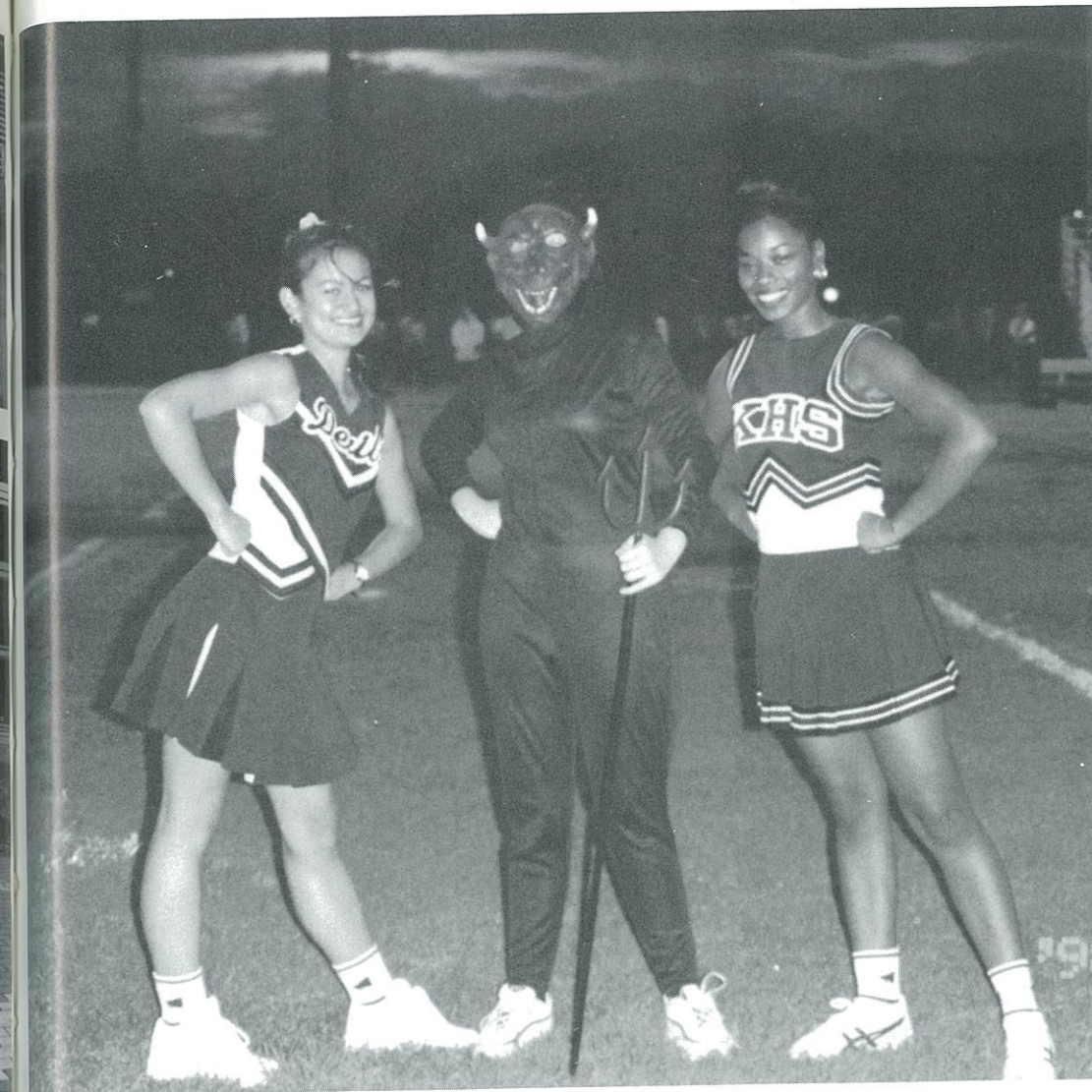

The cheerleading squad was under the supervision of Lt. Barbara Miller and Ms. Kenney who showed the team a great amount of support and dedication.



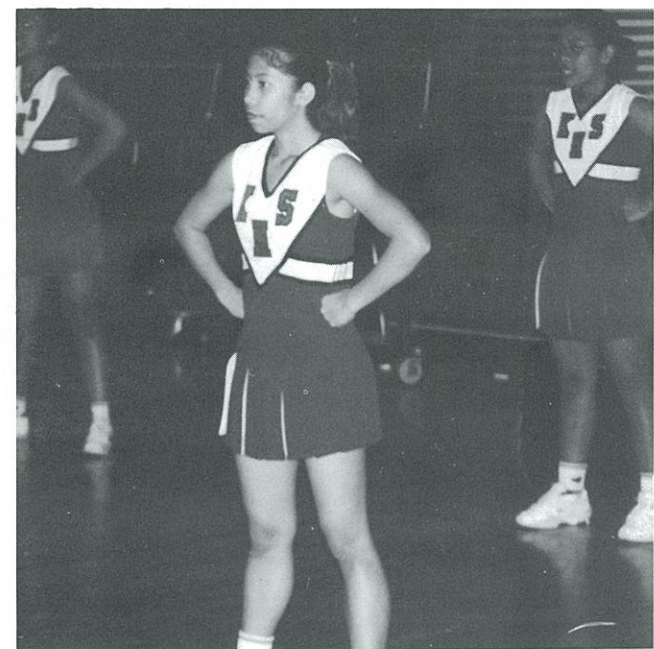

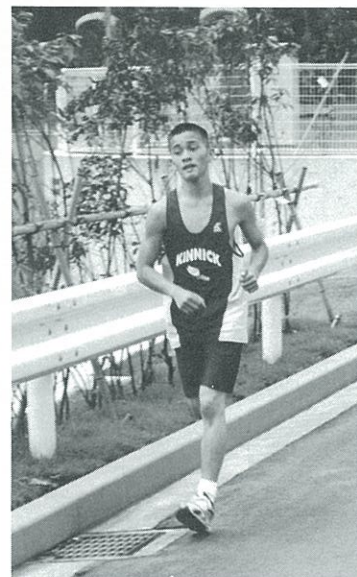

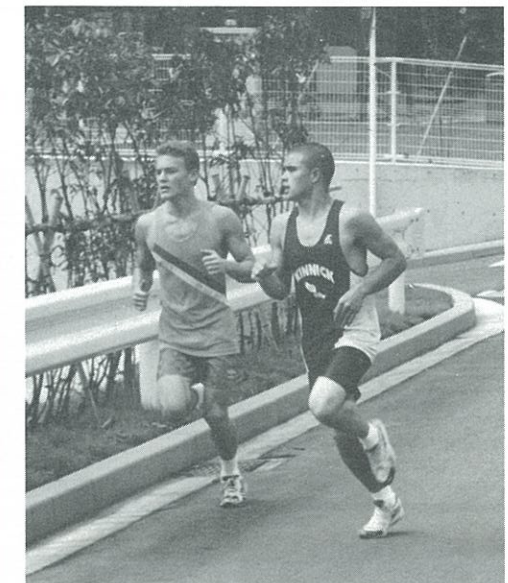

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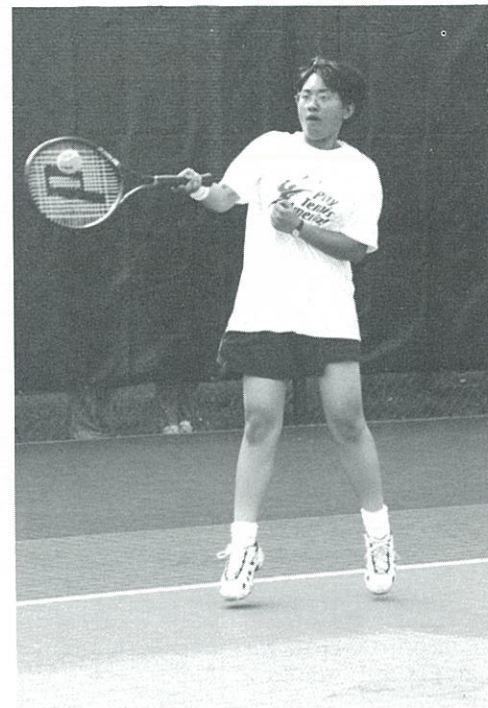
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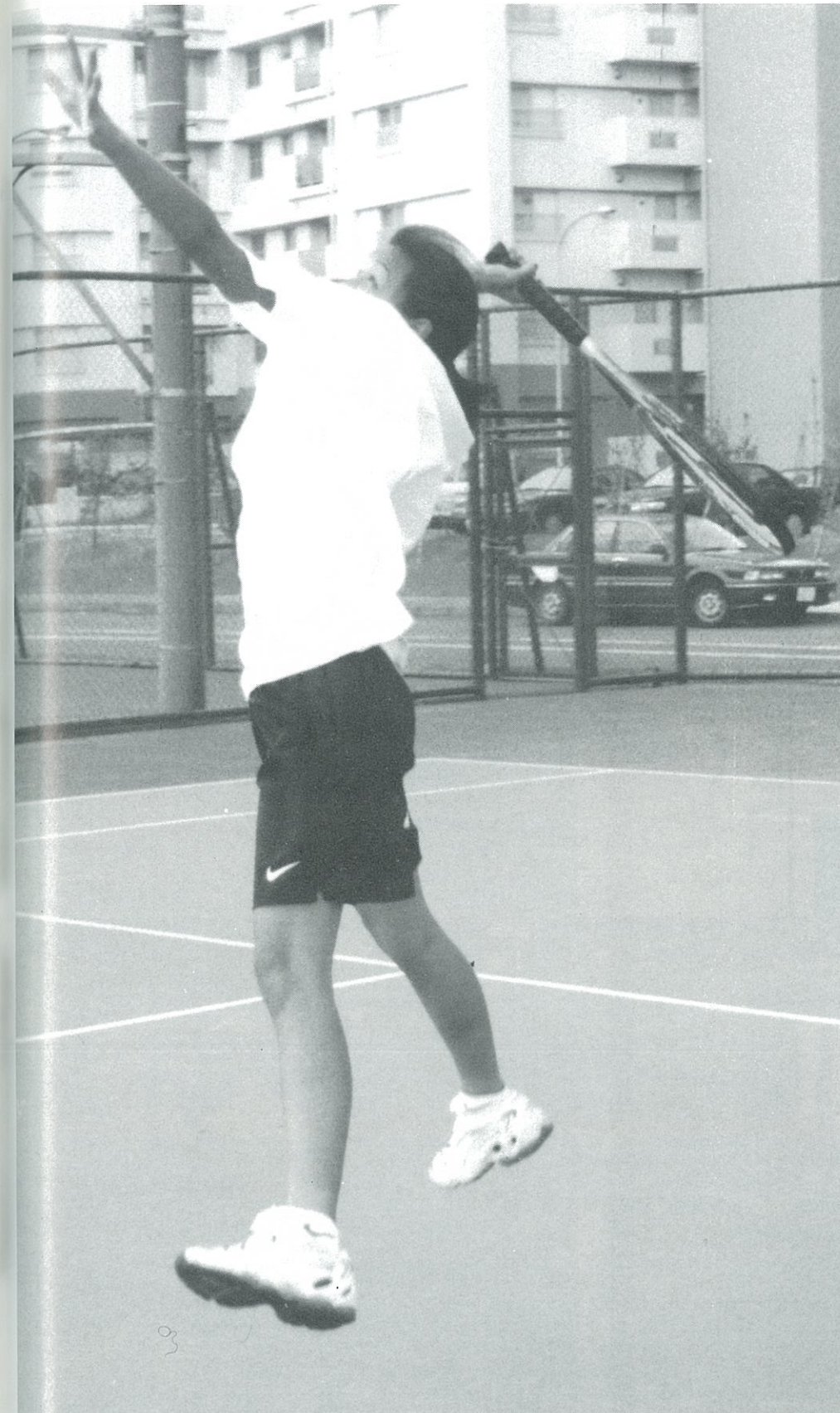
GIRL'S TENNIS

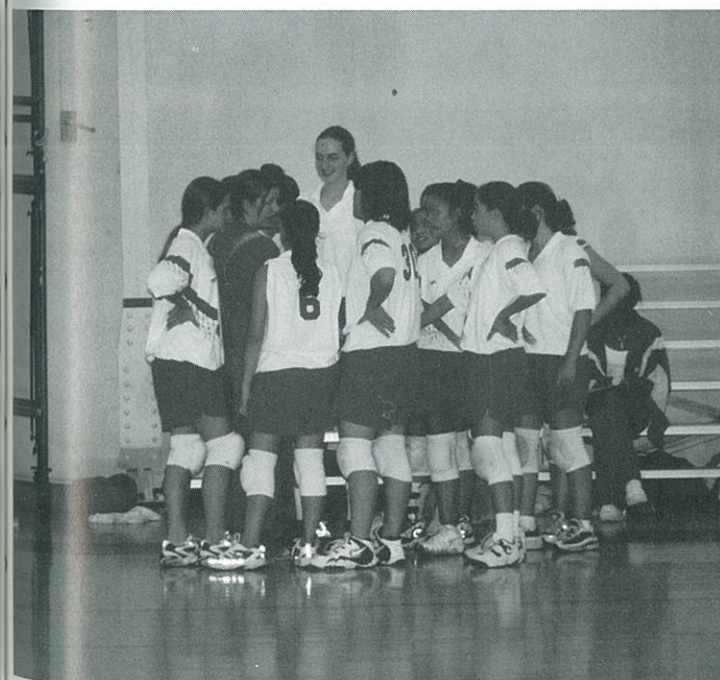

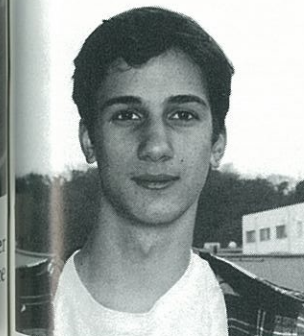

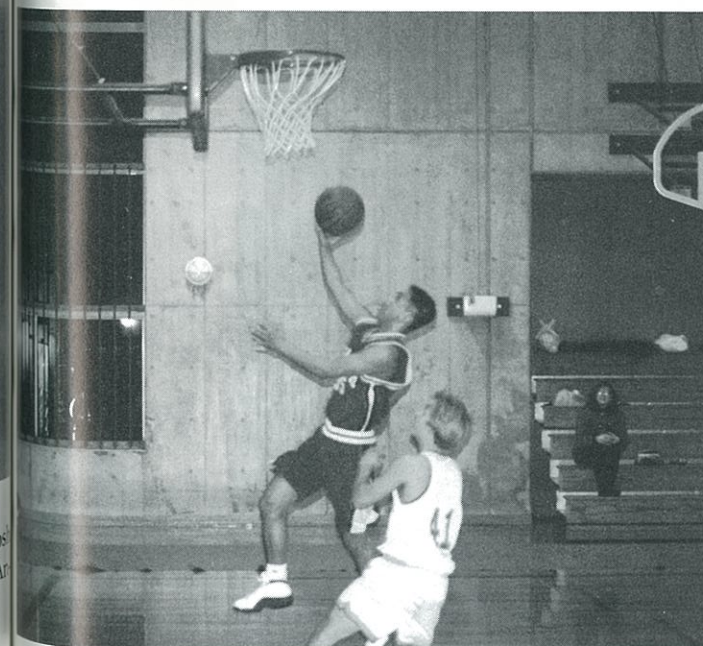
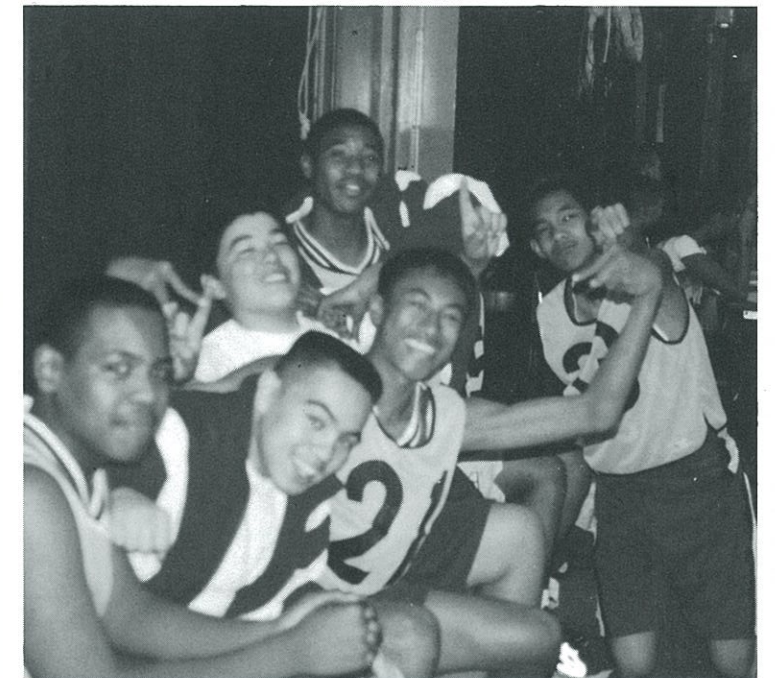
JV BOYS BASKETBALL

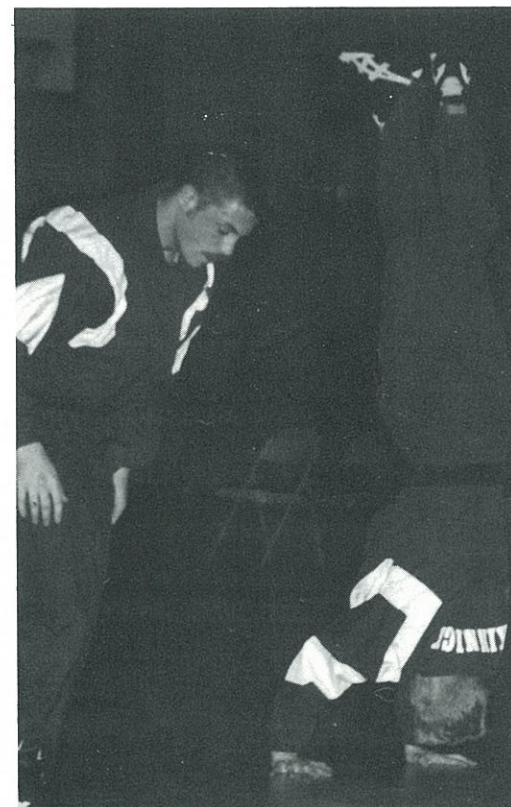

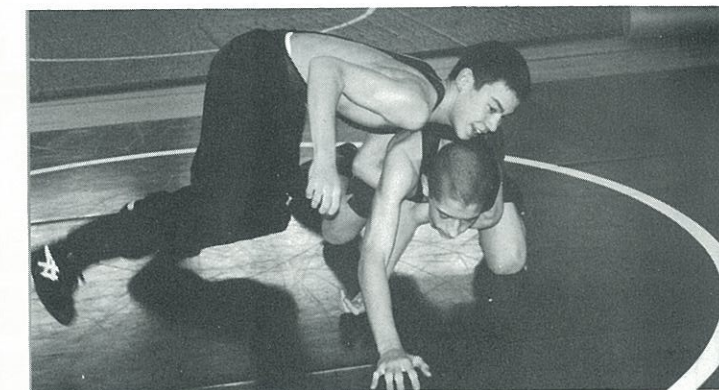
