Mrs. Heath, our LRC Assistant, Has been at Sembach for two years. She enjoys it here with the kids and people about her.

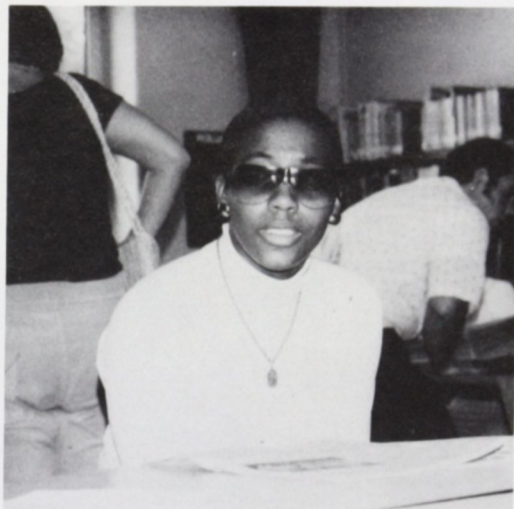

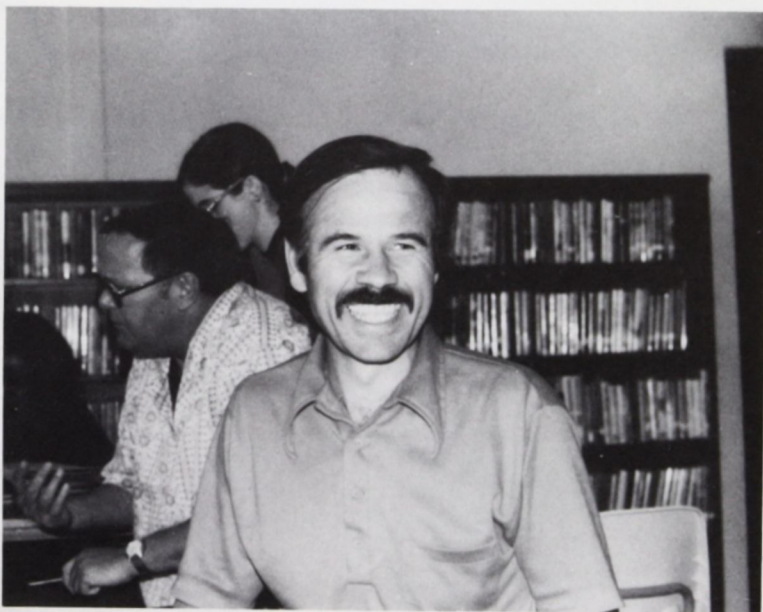


Making Each Day Better

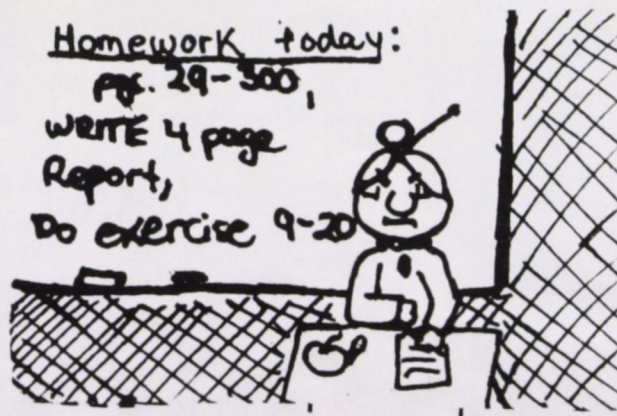

Ms. Grant is our 8th grade science teacher. She graduated from Lemar University, Texas, and enjoys Sembach.



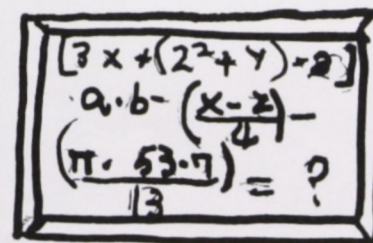
Miss Salucci our 7th grade English teacher, attended Chico state college in California. Working with her 130 students, she thinks this year will go by very successfully.



Mr. McConell, S.J.H.S. 'P.E. teacher, has been at Sembach since 1972. He became a teacher after graduating from Rocky Mt. college.

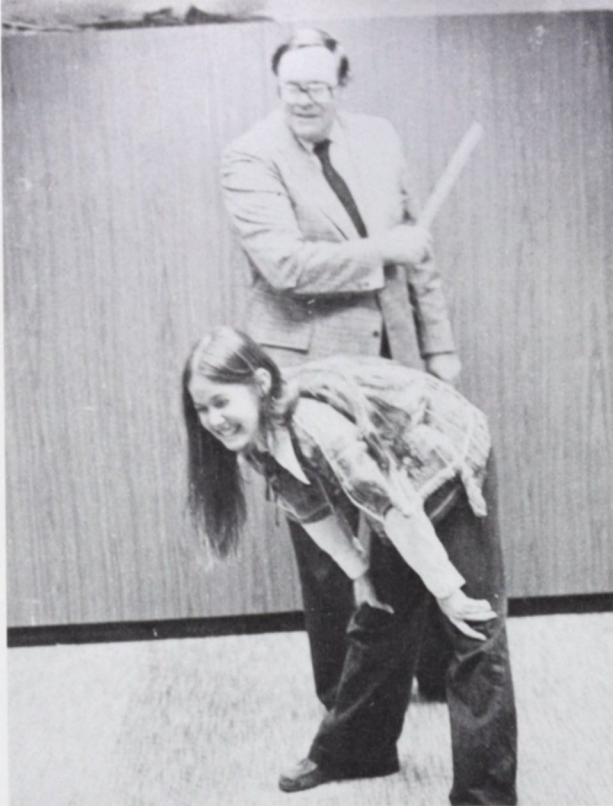


Mrs. Sabin, the elementary and Jr. High nurse, is from Oregon. She graduated from the University of Oregon. Her favorite sport is skiing.

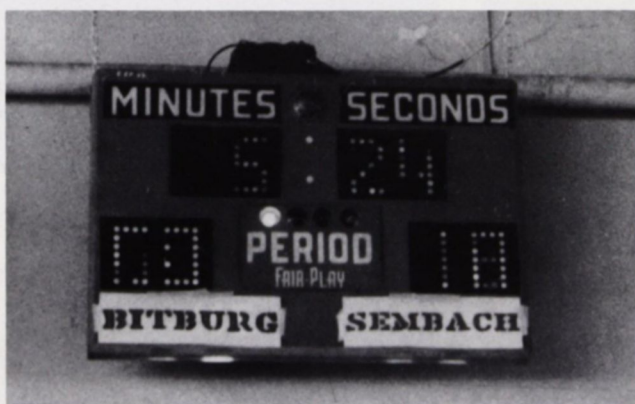

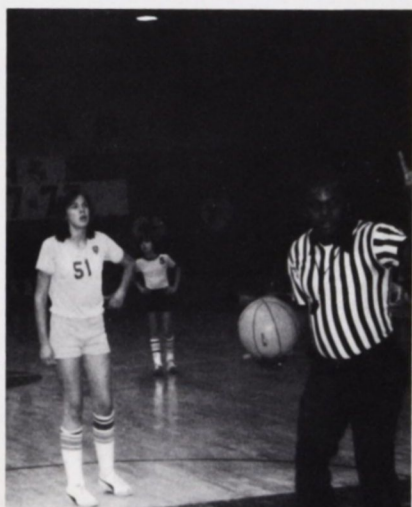
