

They demonstrated in Mainz, the capital of the Rheinland Palatinate. The West German Communist propagandists joined the fight to halt the construction. In spite of the opposition the French began construction of a more modern airfield in June of that year.

Construction continued around the clock with night-time illumination. The pouring of the 8,500 foot long runway began in early Septem-

## A Short History of Sembach Air Base

The year was 1919 and the Treaty of Versailles had been signed giving French occupation troops control of the eastern half of the present flight line. The first base consisted of ten iron barracks and twenty six wooden hangars with canvas coverings. The French occupied the airfield until the general withdrawal of all French forces from the banks of the Rhine. The airfield was abandoned June 15, 1930.

For nine years local farmers used the land as hay fields when in 1939 the German government ordered the field held as a possible Luftwaffe fighter base. Because of the brevity of the French campaign in the first year of World War II the area was returned to the farmers.

Early in 1951 there were rumors in the village of Sembach concerning the surveying of the former airfield by Americans. In April 1951 German surveyors visited the area in the company of French officers. The local farmers protested the construction of a hard-surface airfield.



















ber 1951 and was finished at the end of the month. By December the taxiways were finished. The flightline was completed in April 1952 with the construction of the road leading to the Bundesstrasse 48 (Snake Hill Road). That same month the construction of multi-story barracks and office buildings on land to the north of the flightline was announced. Protestors and dissident farmers kept the surveyors off the land for several months.

The Minister President of the Rhineland Palatinate finally negotiated an alternate site. A sandy hilly area, with little agricultural value, farther north became the site for the administration/housing area. It was known at "Heuberg". Work began in October 1952. More than 2500 workers labored day and night, operating bulldozers, dump trucks, and cement trucks. The present barracks and administrative buildings were completed in the spring of 1953. While all the construction and surveying was conducted by the French, Sembach was built for American NATO forces. The American flag was first raised July 8, 1953. The third and final phase of construction was conducted in the summer of 1954 when the present housing area was built.

The 66th Tactical Reconnaissance Wing operated RF-84 Thunder jets and RB-57 Canberras until 1958. The 38th Tactical Missile Wing moved to Sembach August 20, 1959 making it the prime air force missile base in Europe until 1966

On January 8, 1976 the 601st TCW returned to Sembach after being moved to Wiesbaden in 1973. The 601st is responsible for air surveillance.

The 17th Air Force moved its headquarters to Sembach in 1972. It provides surveillance of U.S. Air Forces assigned to Central Europe. Included are six tactical wings, one tactical fighter squadron, one air base grouo, and one operations group. 17th AF interfaces

with the U.S. Army Europe to insure day-today support and deployments consistent with war time objectives.

At the end of the Desert Storm conflict the 66th Electronics Control Wing returned to close shop and return to Arizona. With their departure in May of '91 the flight operations ceased. However Sembach continues to play a significant role in NATO defense. In April '92 Sembach's present mission was firmly established when the 601st TCW became the 601st Operatons Group. At the same time the 66th Support Group was disbanded and a new 601st Support Wing created to continue the daily operations of Sembach Air Base, as well as many geographically separated facilities throughout Europe.

In early 1992 the airfield closed and all the planes were shipped to Arizona. The airfield is going to reopen in August of '94 because the runway at Ramstein is being repaired. It will close again in November of '94. The proud tradition of Sembach support continues!




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
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## Art 1993-1994





















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## Ribbon Art





Ribbon drawings are one part of a shading unit, which teaches students how to do gradation of value and to show light hitting an object.

Shading is one of the more difficult concepts to teach but Mrs. Edwards tries to do it step by step so her students can have success with it.

First students are shown how to draw the ribbons so they appear to be weaving in and out of each other. Then they are instructed in how to create a light dark pattern. Next the charcoal pencil is used to make the dark areas and a stump is used to smudge the lighter values. The final part is to use colored pencils to give the ribbon a hue. The highlighted areas are left white.

The result is a rather realistic looking shaded ribbon drawing.




- Q: Do you create your own music? If yes, which instrument and where.
- A: I am really more of an interpreter of the piano greats, but I have sat at my piano and improvised. If I had a Midi-Music System, I might have an avenue to be more creative.
- Q: Do you like teaching music?
- A: I am really curious about all types of music, but I'm not skilled enough to enjoy listing to certain very different cultural styles for pleasure!
- Q: Do you like music?
- A: Life without music would make no sense music makes life more meaningful.
- Q: Do you do the same things every year in all of your music classes? Yes or No. Explain.
- A: Yes and no. Each year I try to add some new teaching techniques and some new elements in the music. Examples: This year I tried to use Keyboards in my chorus. It was only partially successful, but I learned something about how to make it better. AND, I tried to teach more scales this year, more theory of music and more listing skills of Classical music in bands and chorus.
- Q: Do you think people enjoy your class?
- A: Yes, I've been told often by my students that they would love to be in band all day. Students often write me to say that my class has given them something very important in

- Q: Do you think you get through to the students? Explain.
- A: Well, the proof is sometimes hard to come by, but this year I can name one occasion when I know I've accomplished something. At Bad Kreuznach, the German teachers raved about the ability and discipline of my Advanced 7 and 8 grade Bands.
- Q: How do you teach music? Do you teach by the book or by your own knowledge and use the book?
- A: I think that the book for band is a must to follow for beginners, then at the intermediate stage, I use my knowledge more. In chorus, I use my knowledge and books, charts, etc. as aids!
- Q: How long have you been teaching music?
- A: 17 years!
- Q: What is the strongest point in your program?
- A: Probably that my advanced bands reach such a high level of performance skills and that my concerts are so well disciplined. (especially compared to other schools)
