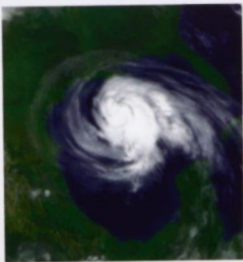
The Results Are In; Obama-Biden Win!



The 2008 presidential election was a contest of historic firsts. Barack Obama was elected the first African American president defeating Senator John McCain, who would have been the oldest man to be elected president. The election also marked the first time in 48 years a sitting senator has been elected since John F. Kennedy's election in 1960.



Sen. McCain chose Alaska Governor Sarah Palin as his running mate. It marked the first time the Republican Party had chosen a female candidate for the office and would have made Gov. Palin the first female vice president.



Hurricane Ike

Ike was the third most destructive hurricane in U.S. history. Sept. 5 saw Ike develop to a category 4 storm with winds reaching 145 mph. Damage was estimated at \$27 billion in the Texas gulf coast area.

Economic Troubles

In December it was confirmed that the U.S. economy was in recession. News of the housing and credit crisis dominated newscasts and was the main focus of the presidential campaign.



Congress passed a \$700 billion rescue plan for banks and other financial institutions. The auto industry also suffered a severe slow down and also went before Congress requesting a bail out package. The meltdown had spread around the world by year's end and the growing economies of China and India slowed down as well.

Miracle on the Hudson

Capt. Chesley Sullenberger made an emergency landing in the Hudson river after hitting a flock of birds on take-off from New York City, which resulted in the loss of both engines. The skill of the aircrew resulted in all 155 persons on board surviving the Jan. 15, 2009, incident.



Iraq and Afghanistan

U.S. troops in Iraq continued to turn security duties over to Iraqi soldiers. Plans to remove U.S. troops from Iraq after the surge were being discussed. The focus of the "War on Terror" began shifting to Afghanistan. Troops from Iraq will be diverted to Afghanistan.

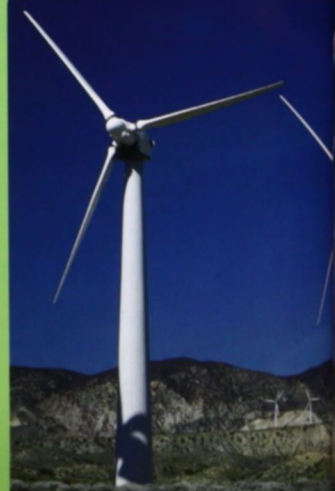


Going Green!



Gasoline prices topped \$4/gal. in some areas of the U.S. in 2008 and coupled with the issue of climate change focused more attention on the research into alternative energy sources. Auto makers are committing to produce improved hybrid, electric and fuel cell technology for cars.

Wind power is becoming more common. Wind farms are being built around the country. Rock Port, Missouri, became the first city in the U.S. to use wind turbines to generate 100% of the town's energy needs. Other areas of alternative energy generation receiving attention are electricity generated by tidal surges and clean coal technology.



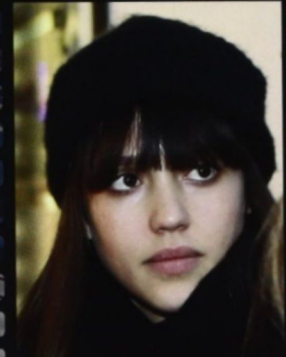
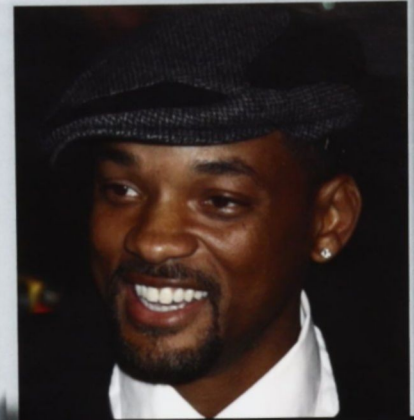
Entertainment & Fan Favorites

Will Smith continued his winning ways collecting two Peoples Choice Awards. Smith was victorious in the male movie and action star categories.

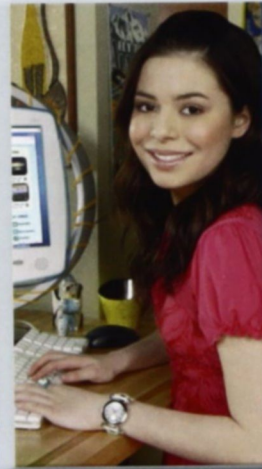
The 2008 Kids Choice Award for favorite female singer went to multi-talented Miley Cyrus a.k.a. Hannah Montana.

The House That Ruth Built To Be Replaced!

Sept. 21, 2008, was the last major-league baseball game played in Yankee Stadium. The 85-year-old sports icon will be replaced by a new Yankee Stadium adjacent to the original Yankee Stadium in time for the 2009 season.



Beijing, China, hosted the 2008 Olympic Games in August. Michael Phelps from the USA became the first athlete to win eight gold medals at the same Olympics. The USA finished with the most medals, 110, and a total of 36 gold medals. China led the gold medal count with 51.



The Philadelphia Phillies won the 2008 World Series over the Tampa Bay Devil Rays in 5 games after a nearly 50-hour rain delay.



The Boston Celtics defeated the Los Angeles Lakers in 6 games for the NBA Championship. It was Boston's 17th championship.



Pittsburgh Steelers wide receiver Santonio Holmes catches the game-winning touchdown, as Arizona Cardinals safety Aaron Francisco tries to tackle. Super Bowl XLIII featured an exciting game in Tampa, Florida, on February 1, 2009, with the Steelers defeating the Cardinals 27-23.



The Stanley Cup was won 4 games to 3 by the Detroit Red Wings over the Pittsburgh Penguins.



Jimmy Johnson won the 2008 Sprint Cup for the third straight year in NASCAR.



After an amazing June 16th win at the US Open, Tiger Woods took himself out of competition for the rest of the 2008 golf season because of a serious knee injury.
