# 2009 BREAKING NEWS



Bernard L. Madoff, the accused mastermind of a \$50 billion Ponzi scheme, leaves Federal Court in New York, January 14.



President Obama called for health care reform in his State of the Union speech. He called on Congress to invest in preventive care, eliminate Medicare fraud, reduce costs and provide insurance to all Americans.



The Maersk Alabama is seen at the port of Mombasa, Kenya, April 13. U.S. Navy snipers rescued the Maersk Alabama's captain in a dramatic high-seas shootout with Somali pirates.



Richard Heene's balloon is held for evidence in the Larimer County Sheriff's evidence area in Fort Collins, Colorado, October 18. Heene later admitted that the incident was a hoax.



Iran's President Ahmadinejad said the Iranian government approved a plan November 29 to build 10 industrial scale uranium enrichment facilities in defiance of U.N. demands to halt enrichment.



Early detection in the spring alerted the nation to the possibility of an H1N1 flu pandemic. By fall the virus commonly called swine flu was widespread in 43 states. Hard-hit schools and businesses were closed to prevent further spread as the government struggled to make enough vaccine available.

An Obama administration official said November 13 that accused Sept. 11 mastermind Khalid Sheikh Mohammed and four other Guantanamo Bay detainees would be sent to New York to face trial in a civilian federal court.

The new Navy assault ship USS New York, built with World Trade Center steel, passed near the Statue of Liberty November 7 in New York City.



The recession that began in 2007 and raged through most of 2009 was officially declared over in September. Government-supported bailout programs of \$700 billion included millions to the financial and auto industry. Consumers traded old vehicles for subsidized new cars in the Cash for Clunkers program. In spite of the recession ending unemployment was still more than 10%.

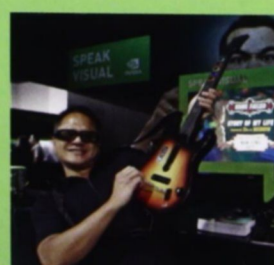

### WORLD SERIES

The New York Yankees defeated the Philadelphia Phillies in 2009, four games to two, to win the franchise's 27th World Series championship. It was the 105th edition of Major League Baseball's championship series. Hideki Matsui was named Most Valuable Player of the series, a first for a Japanese-born player. He also is the first player to win it as a full-time designated hitter.

### SUPER BOWL XLIV

The New Orleans Saints defeated the Indianapolis Colts 31-17 February 7 to win the 2010 Super Bowl at Dolphin Stadium in Miami. The Saints already had a 7 point lead when Saints cornerback #22 Tracy Porter intercepted a Peyton Manning pass and carried it 74 yards for a touchdown, insuring the victory. It was the Saints first Super Bowl win. Saints quarterback Drew Brees was named the games most valuable player.

### NBA CHAMPIONSHIP

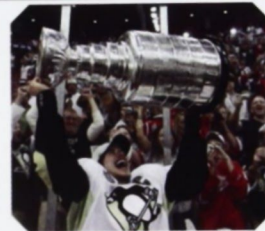
In the 2009 NBA Finals the Los Angeles Lakers, top-seeded champions of the Western Conference, defeated the Orlando Magic, third-seeded champions of the Eastern Conference, four games to one. The Los Angeles Lakers returned to the Finals for the 30th time in franchise history, an NBA record. Head coach Phil Jackson captured his 10th NBA championship as a coach, surpassing Red Auerbach for most championships by an NBA coach.

### STANLEY CUP

The 2009 Stanley Cup Final was a best-of-seven playoff series that determined the National Hockey League champion for the 2008-09 season. The Eastern Conference champion Pittsburgh Penguins defeated the Western Conference champion Detroit Red Wings, four games to three. Evgeni Malkin was the first Russian player awarded the Conn Smythe Trophy as the Most Valuable Player of the playoffs. It was the 116th year of the Stanley Cup's presentation.

Real Salt Lake defeated the Los Angeles Galaxy during the MLS Cup November 22, at Qwest Field. Real Salt Lake played the L.A. Galaxy to a 1-1 tie through overtime and won the MLS cup (5-4 on penalties) to complete the upset.

Tiger Woods became the first player in PGA TOUR history to win seven times on the same golf course at the Bridgestone Invitational.

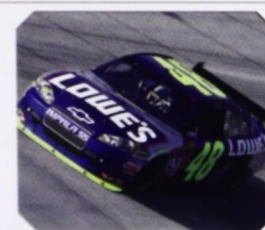

### NASCAR SPRINT CUP

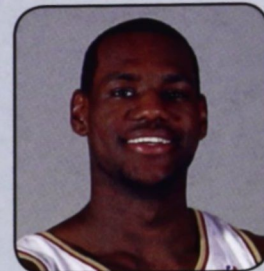
