Homecoming Week



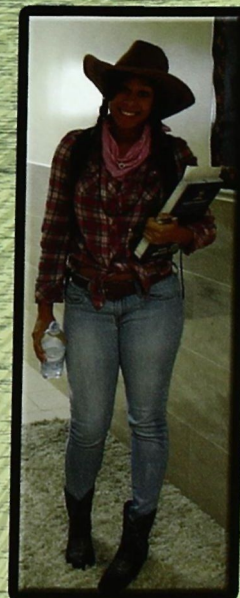

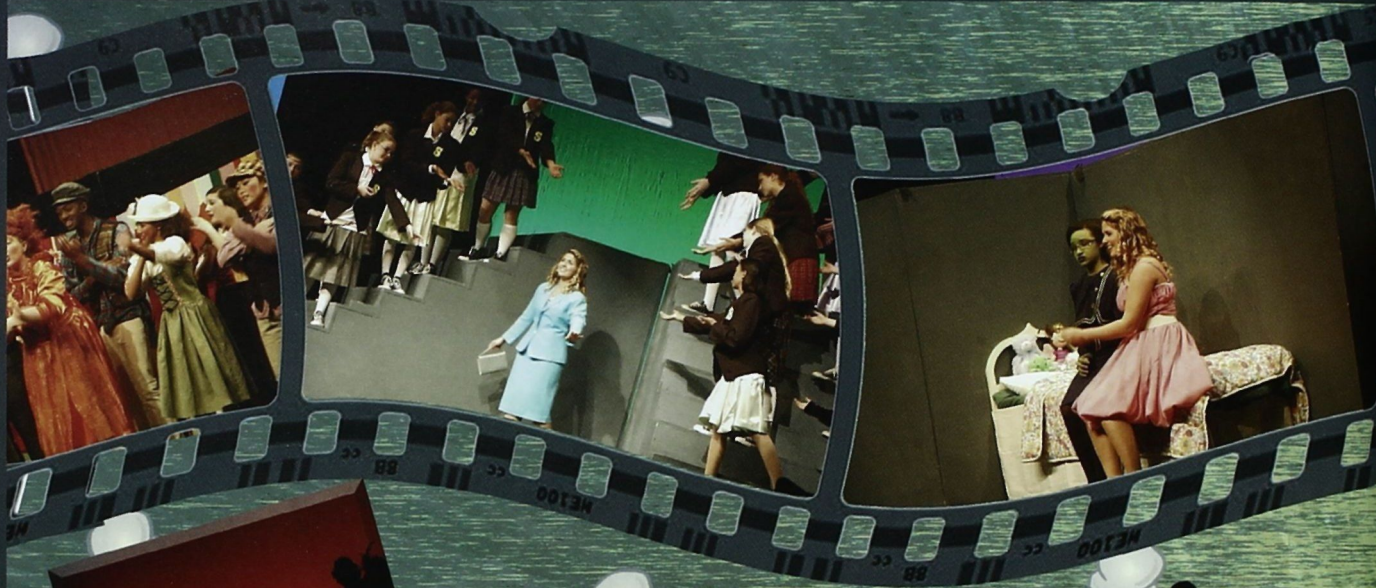
Homecoming Day

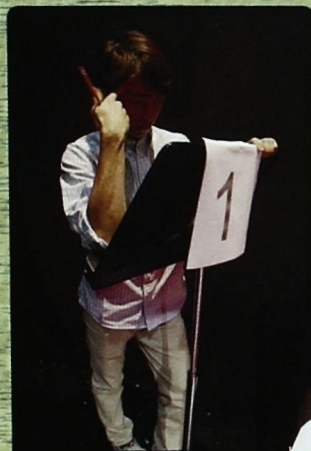


CHOICES

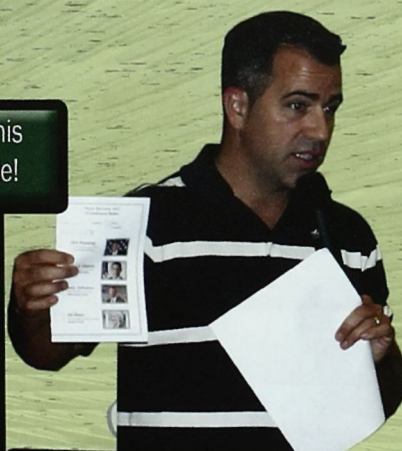

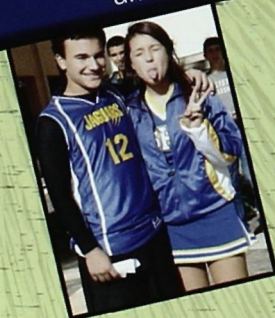

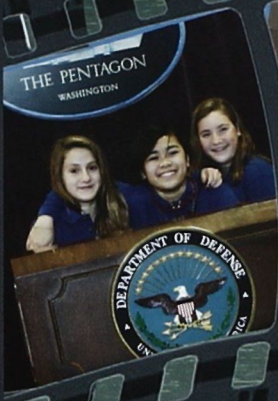
Hoorah Navy

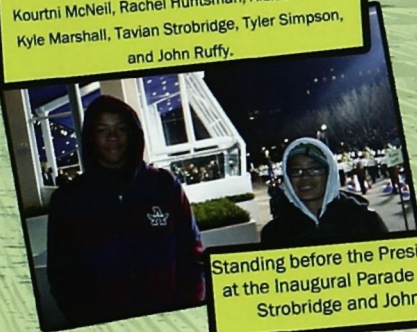

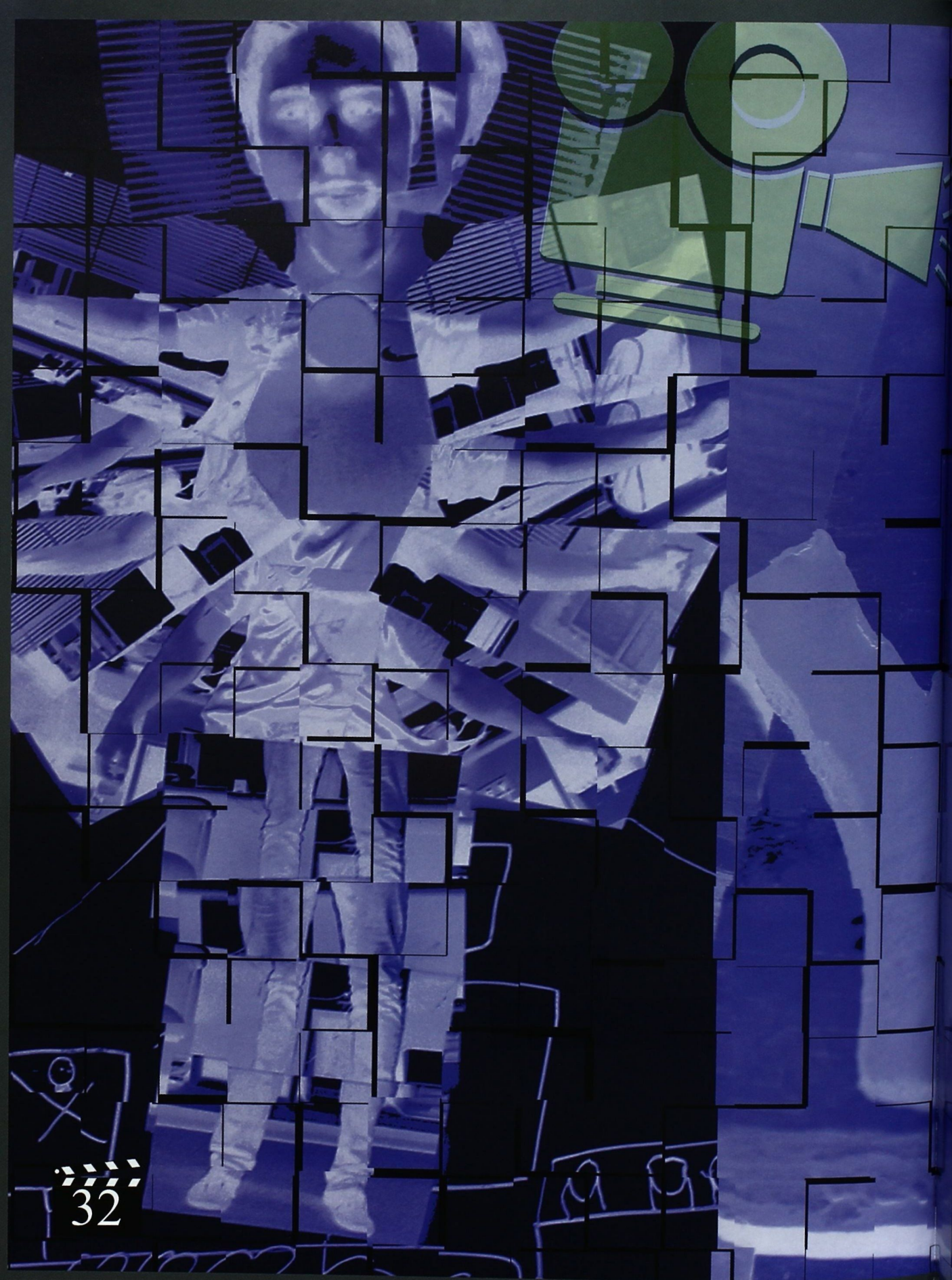
Groups of Friends

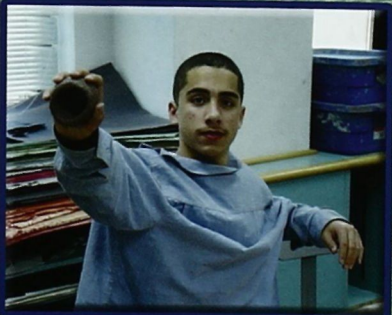

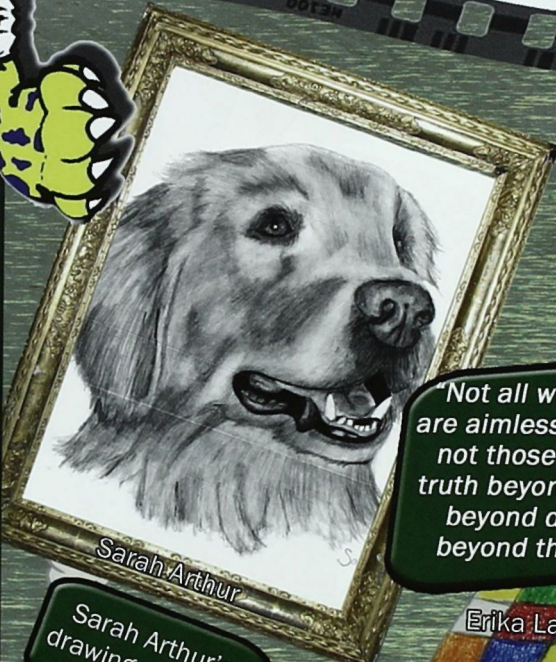

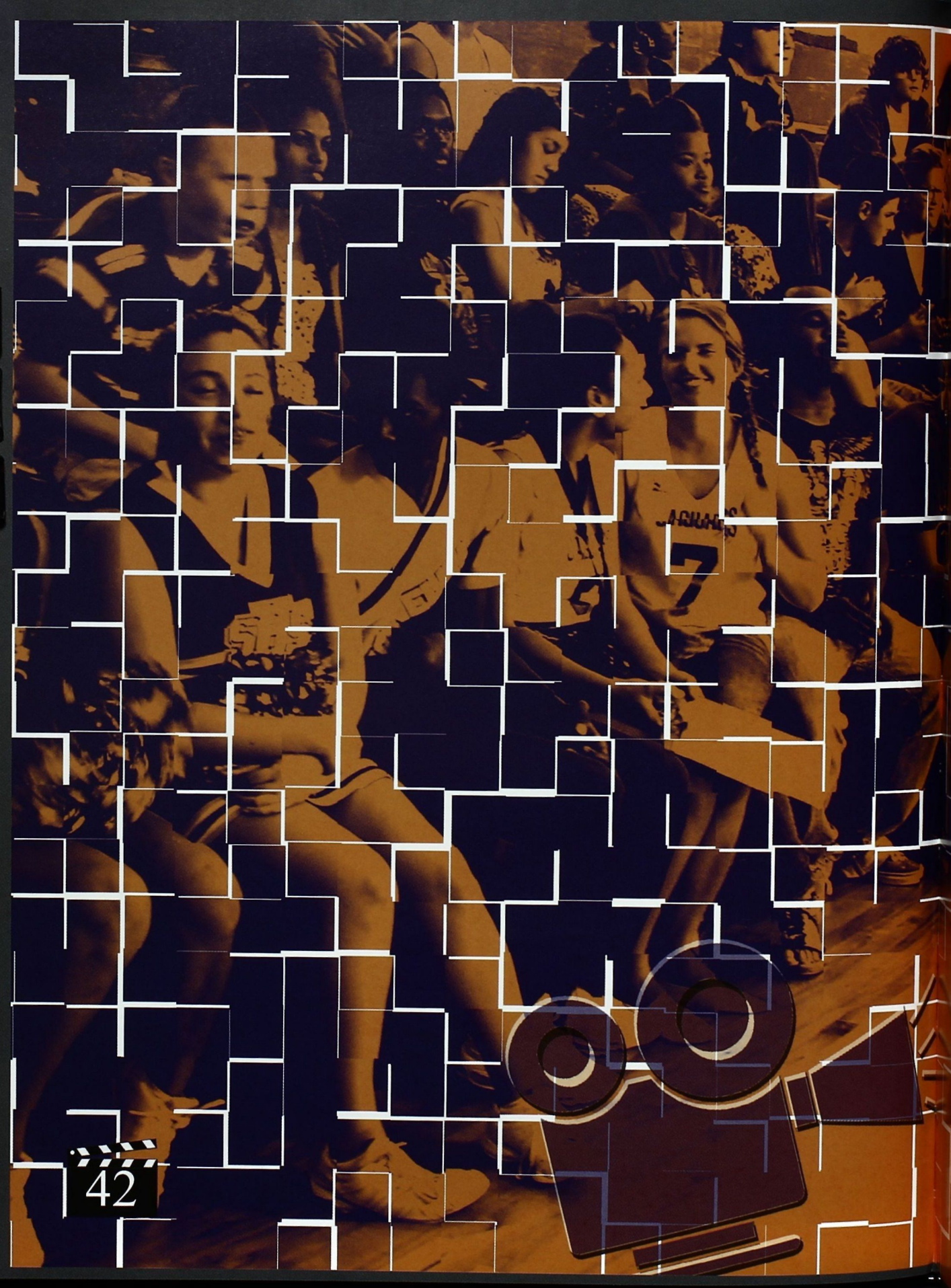

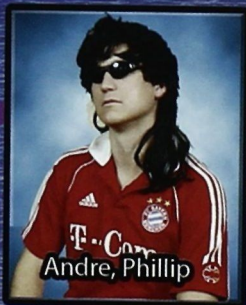
Sigonella Students,

election

President Barack Obama was re-elected to a second term in the White House on Nov. 6 when he defeated Republican candidate Mitt Romney. President Obama received 332 electoral votes, surpassing the 270 votes needed to win the presidency. Romney received 206 electoral votes. The voters kept a divided Congress where Republicans have the majority in the House of Representatives and the Democrats remain in control of the Senate.



Superstorm Sandy caused massive devastation along the East Coast on Oct. 29. The storm killed more than 100 people in 10 states, left 8.2 million

people without power, and caused billions of dollars in damage. Sandy halted transportation systems across the region and closed down the federal government, the NYSE, schools, major airports, and hospitals.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency reported that 95,000 people were eligible for emergency housing assistance in



the hardest hit states of New York and New Jersey. Less than two weeks after Sandy hit, a nor'easter tore through the same area on Nov. 7 bringing more heavy rain, high winds and record snowfalls.



This year the Midwest experienced the worst drought since the 1950's. It could have a significant impact on the economy. In September,

more than half of the nation's corn crops were listed as poor or very poor. The Mississippi River also hit record low water levels.

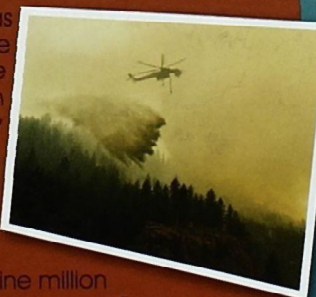

Astronaut Neil Armstrong, the first man to walk on the moon, died Aug. 25, at age 82. Armstrong not only made history with his famous footprint on the moon's surface, but also left behind a legacy with his famous words: "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."

2012 was one of the worst wildfire years on record. By October, more than 48,000 fires had scorched nearly nine million U.S. acres, and some fires were still burning. Fighting the fires has cost more than a billion dollars.

2012 SUMMER OLYMPICS



Michael Phelps won more Olympic medals than any Olympian in history, winning 22 overall. In addition to the all-time Olympic medal record, Phelps also holds the all-time record for most gold Olympic medals (18).



Serena Williams became the second woman in history to achieve a Golden Slam, winning the 2012 Olympic singles gold medal in addition to the four major tennis tournaments in one year.



The Miami Heat defeated the Oklahoma Thunder 121-106 in Game 5 of the NBA Finals to clinch the world championship. After losing the first game of the series, the Heat won four straight games to earn the team's second NBA championship. LeBron James was named the tournament MVP.



The Los Angeles Kings completed their Cinderella run at the National Hockey League Stanley Cup championship when they defeated the New Jersey Devils, 6-1. It is the first Stanley Cup victory in the team's history.



Brad Keselowski won the 2012 NASCAR Sprint Cup Series championship, earning owner Roger Penske's first title in the premier series. Keselowski, 28, is only the second driver to win both a NASCAR Nationwide and NASCAR Sprint Cup Series championship.



The National League champion San Francisco Giants won game 4 of the Major League World Series against the Detroit Tigers at Comerica Park in Detroit, Michigan. The Giants won 4-3 in 10 innings, sweeping the Tigers to win the series. Pablo Sandoval was named World Series MVP.



The Baltimore Ravens defeated the San Francisco 49ers 34-31 in Super Bowl XLVII to become the 2012 season NFL champions. Ravens quarterback Joe Flacco was named Super Bowl MVP.



The 2012 Summer Paralympics was a major international multi-sport event for the disabled that took place Aug. 29 to Sept. 9 in London, England. A total of 4,294 athletes from 164 National Paralympic Committees attended, making it the largest Paralympics ever.
