Edward Balbo Sigonella MHS Class of 2021

Department of Defense Education Activity Student Selected for United States Senate Youth Program



January 9, 2020, Washington, D.C. —The United States Senate Youth Program (USSYP) announces that high school student Mr. Edward Vincenzo Balbo will represent the Department of Defense Education Activity in the nation's capital during the 58th annual USSYP Washington Week, to be held March 7 - 14, 2020. Edward Balbo of Sigonella, Italy was selected from among the DODEA's top student leaders to be part of the 104 national student delegation will also each a \$10,000 college scholarship for undergraduate study.

The USSYP was created by Senate Resolution 324 in 1962 and has been sponsored by the Senate and fully funded by The Hearst Foundations since inception. Originally proposed by Senators Kuchel, Mansfield, Dirksen and Humphrey, the impetus for the program as stated in Senate testimony is "to increase young Americans' understanding of the interrelationships of the three branches of government, learn the caliber and responsibilities of federally elected and appointed officials, and emphasize the vital importance of democratic decision making not only for America but for people around the world."

Each year this extremely competitive merit-based program brings the most outstanding high school students - two from each state, the District of Columbia and the Department of Defense Education Activity - to Washington, D.C. for an intensive week-long study of the federal government and the people who lead it. The overall mission of the program is to help instill within each class of USSYP student delegates more profound knowledge of the American political process and a lifelong commitment to public service. In addition to the program week, The Hearst Foundations provide each student with a \$10,000 undergraduate college scholarship with encouragement to continue coursework in government, history and public affairs.

Edward Balbo, a U. S. resident of Oregon, is a junior at Sigonella Middle High School in Sigonella, Italy, where he serves as president of the Junior Class. Averaging a 4.21 GPA, Edward has been active in many models of government including serving as the Minority WHIP at Model United States Senate, a delegate at Model UN, and a DoDEA Military Kid representative in the 2016 inauguration. Edward feels that the Senate Youth Program will be a deep learning experience about how America functions and a catalyst for his goal of majoring in political science.

While in Washington the student delegates attend meetings and briefings with senators, members of the House of Representatives, Congressional staff, the president, a justice of the Supreme Court, leaders of cabinet agencies, an ambassador to the United States and senior members of the national media.

In addition to outstanding leadership abilities and a strong commitment to volunteer work, the student delegates rank academically in the top one percent of their states among high school juniors and seniors.

Separated by Coronavirus Pandemic, Students from Navy Base in Italy Go Online to Sing Moving Rendition of Bon Iver Song

Within days, an online assignment recorded by students at Sigonella Middle High School during the countrywide lockdown in Italy has resonated well beyond their small circle.

The choir students' a capella performance of "Heavenly Father" by the indie folk band Bon Iver struck a strong emotional chord, particularly because the students are in Italy, where hundreds are dying daily from severe lung disease caused by the coronavirus.

Antone Leustek, the music teacher for seventh through 12th grade at the Department of Defense Education Activity school, edited and posted a video compilation of the students' individual recordings to the school's Facebook page over the weekend.

The days keep us apart, but music brings us together," he captioned the video. "Stay strong Italy. Stay strong."

The video has reached more than 187,000 people and garnered nearly 2,000 comments from around the world, Leustek said.

"Love love love this, too, all the way from Seattle," one woman commented. "My granddaughter is one of these beautiful children. Sharing your gifts of music & hope in a time of uncertainty is so appreciated."

The students recorded the song for an assignment that aimed to get them ready for a concert in May, if school reopens by then, the teacher said.

The 15 students — many of them in middle school — had four days to film themselves and get a good take, Leustek said Monday from his home in Aci Trezza, where he's been conducting online music classes since the Sigonella school closed more than two weeks ago because of the virus.

Plugging their headphones into an online tool called SmartMusic that fills in the other parts of the song, the students recorded themselves and uploaded their videos.

"Once I had all the files, I was like, 'Oh, let's see what it sounds like if I put it together," Leustek said.

The song's message, finding solace in a time of hardship, applies to the situation in Italy, he said.

"After I started putting things together, the way it started sounding, I was like, 'Wow ... it's one of those coincidental things that seem like fate.' We didn't know it was going to be this powerful," Leustek said.

Freshman Calvin Crumbley, 14, carried the song's haunting solo.

"I didn't expect it to be that big, for it to blow up like that," Crumbley said. "I just want to give credit to my teacher for putting this all together and for my choirmates, for working hard and for us all getting it done."

Amanda Erno, 18, a junior, said the song "holds hope and brings the community together."

"I think it really showed everyone in our choir, that even though we're not together, we can still produce something that's amazing, and connect with so many people," she said. Erno, who hasn't left her home in about two weeks, said taking online classes has been challenging.

But as military kids, she said, "We're just adapting, which is something that we're superused to."

Pyatt's Dominant Season was Inspiration for Current, Future Jaguars

The impact Amari Pyatt had on the Sigonella wrestling program will be felt long beyond the two memorable years he spent with the Jaquars.

Pyatt, the 2020 Stars and Stripes wrestling Athlete of the Year, has "definitely raised the bar for our wrestling program," Sigonella athletic director Michelle Chandler said. His remarkable two-year run "has sparked interest" in the Division III program, Chandler said, both among Pyatt's Sigonella classmates and younger potential prospects in the community.

Those future Jaguar wrestlers will have a lot to live up to.

Pyatt won his second straight DODEA-Europe
championship in the 170-pound bracket in February,
completing one of the more impressive seasons in recent
memory. The senior won all 25 of his matches - 23 by pin
and the other two by technical fall.

But Pyatt's dominance was even more thorough than that suggests. Sigonella coach Justen Estes pointed out that none of his opponents earned an offensive point against Pyatt this season; the only points those overmatched foes recorded were conceded by Pyatt in the interest of setting up further attacks.

That overwhelming offense is by design, as Pyatt's title defense this winter was paradoxically built around relentless offense. After initially adopting a more reactionary, defensive posture on the mat, Pyatt and his coaches quickly adjusted to a more proactive approach. "I realized that that's not going to play in my favor," Pyatt said. "We changed the goal from defending to going to get another one, which means that I can be the offensive person and I can go chase after what I want." What he wants now is to succeed at the next level. Pyatt recently accepted an offer to wrestle at Iowa Wesleyan University, an NCAA Division III program. It's a comfortable fit for Pyatt, who spent time in neighboring Nebraska before moving to Sigonella and has been on the radar of the Wesleyan coaching staff for years. Whatever he achieves beyond DODEA-Europe, Pyatt's legacy at Sigonella is secure. Estes said the Jaguar captain logged "countless hours" bolstering the skills and confidence of his teammates and "leading by example" with his own brilliant efforts on the mat. "I feel like I represented the school very well," Pyatt said.

TIME PERSON OF THE YEAR

At 16 years old, Greta Thunberg is the youngest recipient of Time's Person of the Year title. The Swedish climate activist started the movement, Fridays for Future, and gained international attention giving a speech at the U.N. Climate Action Summit. She inspired 4 million people to join a global climate strike on Sept. 20 in what was the largest climate demonstration in human history.


