THE WALL COMES TUMBLING DOWN

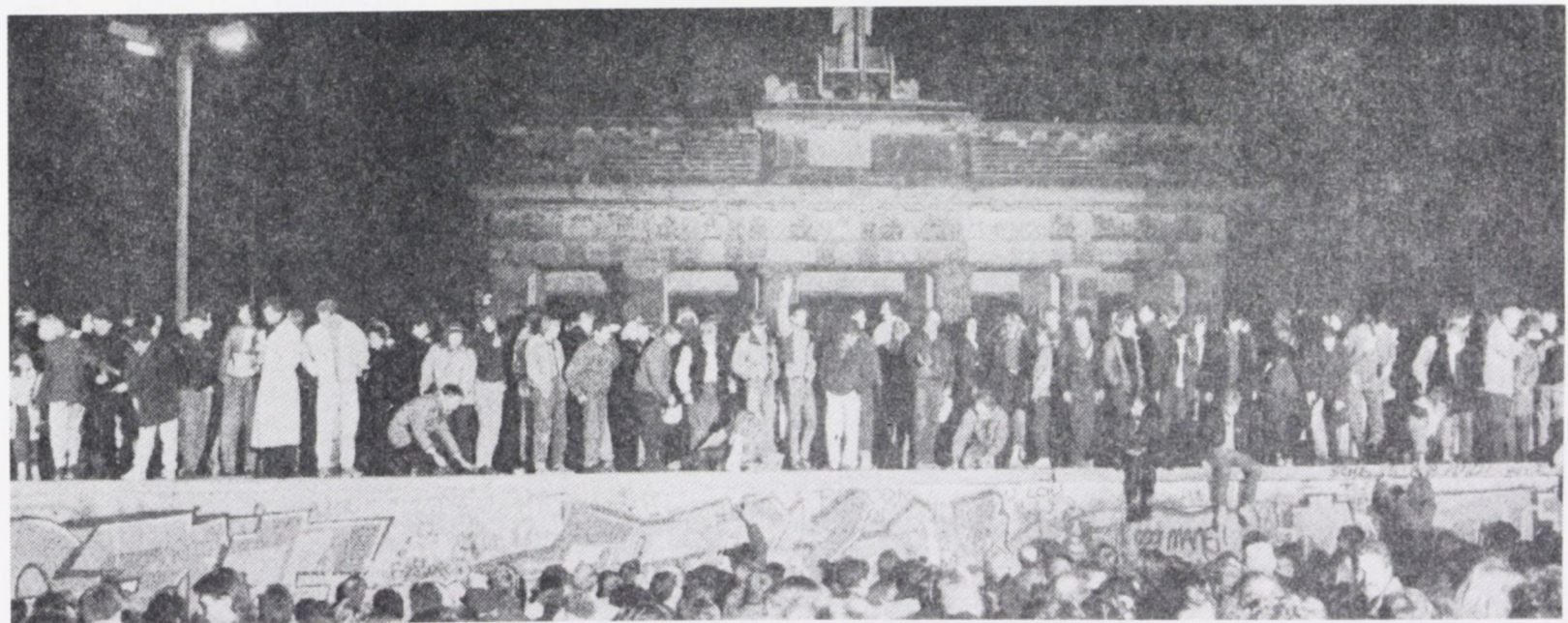
After weeks of East Germans leaving for the west through Czechoslovakia and Hungary, the East German government announced on Thursday, Nov. 9, 1989, that the border crossings would be open for free travel until new regulatory laws were written. On Friday, Nov. 10, 1989, it was announced that the borders would be permanently open for travel, including the long-standing symbol of the Iron Curtain, the Berlin Wall. Thousands rejoiced in the streets all over the world as East and West Berliners shouted "Open the Gate! Open the Gate!" Loved ones were reunited under the first sign of hope in over 28 years, since the building of the Wall in August of 1961. Along with the Wall crumbling, many other exciting things happened. For instance, the Brandenburg Gate was re-opened, and the famed Bernauer Strasse was no longer a dead end - it now joins East and West. Also, the Cold War, which has been a part of Berlin for the past 40 years has ended; East and West have come together after many years of hoping and praying. And we were here.

Patch High coach dies after surgery

STUTTGART, West Germany (S&S) — Rodger Bowman, a football coach at Patch High School for the past four years, died Monday in Brooke Army Medical Center, San Antonio, of complications following heart surgery.

Bowman, an Army major assigned to the personnel office at the U.S. European Comd, underwent surgery in March to replace his aorta, the body's main artery. But his heart rejected the artificial aorta, and he had to have a series of repeat operations.

He was allowed to visit relatives on a pass this past weekend. On Sunday morning, he felt sick and was returned to

the hospital, where he underwent further surgery. He died at 3:15 a.m. Monday.

Bowman, 42, was a volunteer assistant coach at Patch High School in 1985 and 1986. He took over as head coach in 1987. That team won only one of seven games, but his 1988 team compiled a 5-2 record and just missed qualifying for the DODDS Big Schools playoffs.

The native of Oak Grove, La., played offensive tackle for four years at Northeast Louisiana State.

He is survived by his wife, Beverly; and three children, Tim, 18, Ashley, 14, and Marcus, 8.

A memorial service has been sched-

uled for 4:30 p.m. Friday at the Patch Barracks chapel. His family requests that any memorials be sent to the National Heart Association.

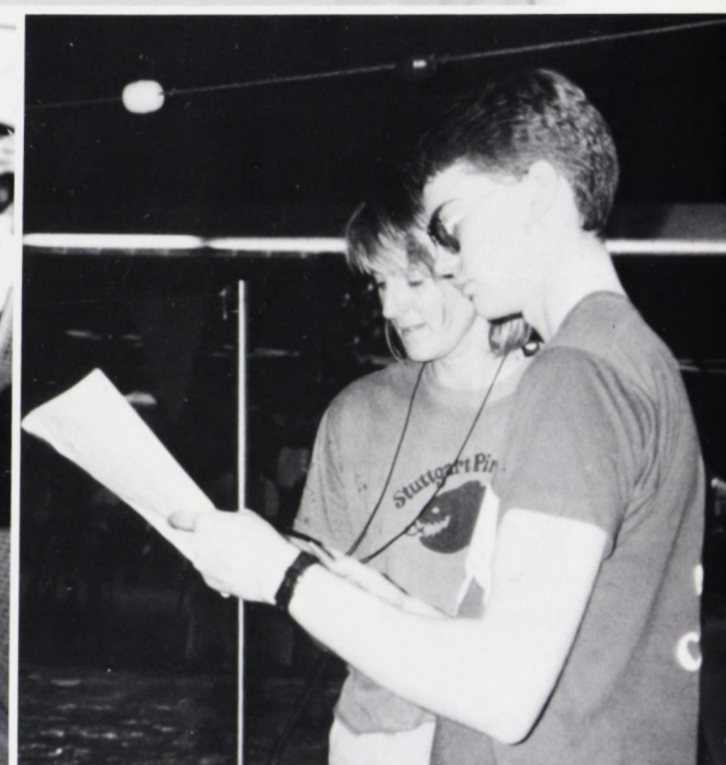
