THE WALL COMES TUMBLING DOWN

After weeks of East Germans leaving for the west through Czechoslovakia and Hungary, the East German government announced on Thursday, Nov. 9, 1989, that the border crossings would be open for free travel until new regulatory laws were written. On Friday, Nov. 10, 1989, it was announced that the borders would be permanently open for travel, including the long-standing symbol of the Iron Curtain, the Berlin Wall. Thousands rejoiced in the streets all over the world as East and West Berliners shouted "Open the Gate! Open the Gate!" Loved ones were reunited under the first sign of hope in over 28 years, since the building of the Wall in August of 1961. Along with the Wall crumbling, many other exciting things happened. For instance, the Branden burg Gate was re-opened, and the famed Bernauer Strasse was no longer a dead end - it now joins East and West. Also, the Cold War, which has been a part of Berlin for the past 40 years has ended; East and West have come together after many years of hoping and praying. And we were here.




