



























## LOCK-IN



Many students choose to brown-bag it either because it's easy or because they know


ROTC, the cafeteria's nearest competitor, offers students the opportunity to buy fresh grilled burgers and wurst.



Whatever students do for lunch, they can't wait for it to start, and it always seems to end too soon.








## Crackdown-Or **Breakdown?**



Revolts in the Baltic States, lack of food, and the return to previous oppressions caused many problems in the Soviet Union this year. Edward Shevardnaze, Soviet Foreign Minister, resigned in order to warn Mikhail Gorbachev (left) that force will not halt the chaos. Gorbachev, though starting many reform in the USSR, faced his darkest hour so far.



Newspapers everywhere announced the resignation of Margaret Thatcher, Prime Minister of Great Britain for 11 years. She was soon replaced by John Major. The "Chunnel," a tunnel under the English channel, links the UK and France. For the first time since the Ice Age, England is no longer an island.





Aug. 2 - Iraq's army overruns Kuwait following Iraqi grievances. President Bush orders economic embargo against Iraq. Nov. 9 - VII Corp was notified that many troops would be deployed to the Gulf.

## **SNOW WHITE**



inside with a warm mug of cocoa, where it's nice and cozy."












































# Wild Times





























# DEAD POET'S SOCIETY


And now we present . . . Sean Hamover, the Panther Press editor! Mike Manzano does something amazing with the computer, much to the delight of others.
