Can you find Liberia? We can’t either.

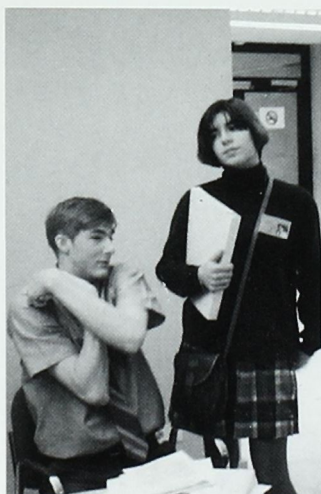

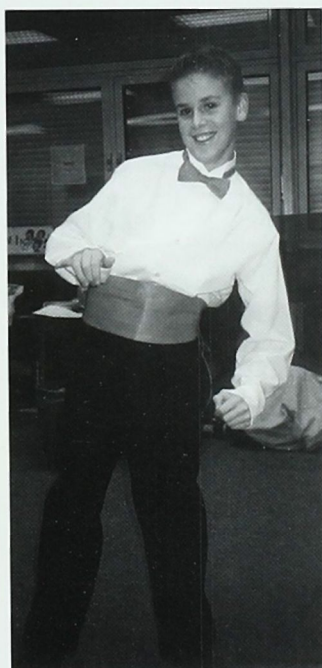

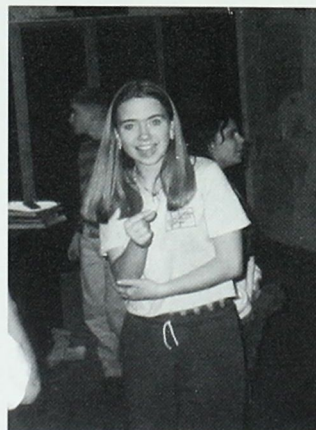

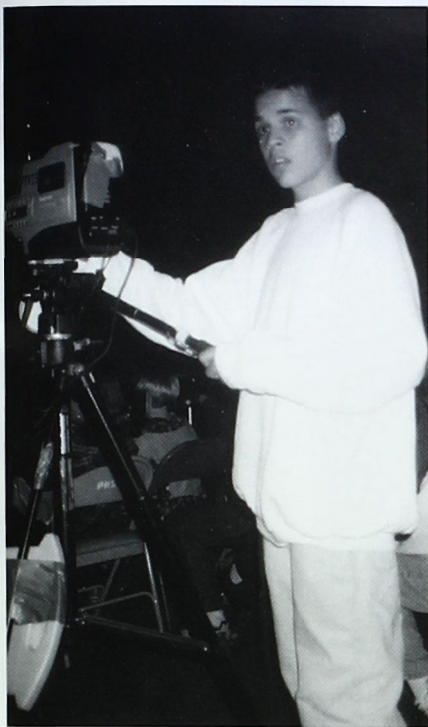

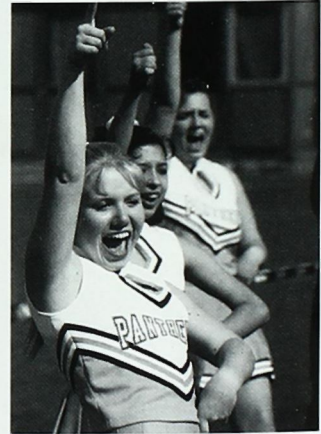

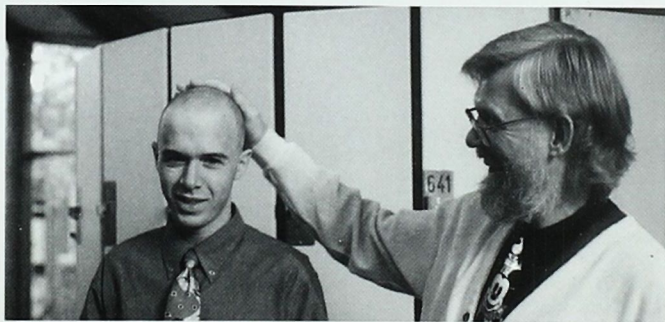

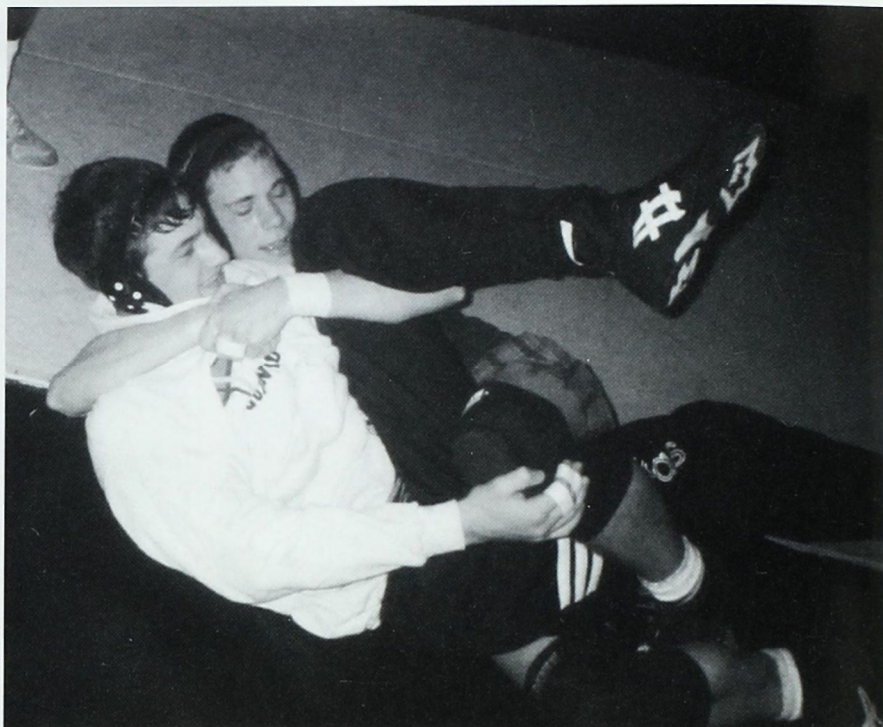

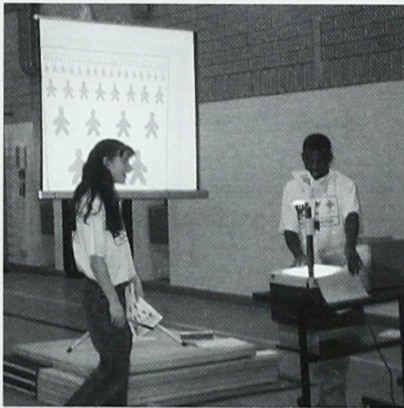




# HIV/AIDS PEER EDUCATORS
