


To those of you that sit there and talk about him, you should know the facts. Drew was going fast while driving home and he lost control.


earbook is probably one of the most unknown, yet most important pieces of Patch American High. Who on earth could imagine a school year going by with no autographs or embarrassing pictures?






STUTTGART PIRANHAS Southern Division Champions
