



Drill Team

Theatre Arts





This year's class has had well over fifty students who work together rehearsing and performing plays.


After a group has presented its play, the actors are open to criticism by fellow students. Then the group has a second chance to present its play, after a period of improvement through the use of those comments.














Intermediate Band





Mr. Brisky, this year's advisor, has done a great job in providing new and interesting jobs for students.



Lettermen's Club








This year's Junior High newspaper, the HOTSTUFF, surprised the school; they put out an exceptional, well-written paper full of valuable information.

The Imprint Staff this year did an excellent job of informing and keeping the students in touch with both academic and extra curricular events that happened in and around the school.




















Upper Heyford Football Season "73"







With the end of the season comes brighter prospects for next year. Because we, the Hadites, can only get better.









With one year of football behind them, these players with the valuable experience they've gained, will form the nucleus of the Hadite Varsity that will be a much improved team next year.






The girls put in a lot of hard tiresome practice in order to achieve their high quality game, and deserved the many victories they had.



The top Heyford girls played in an all-star tournament featuring the top girls from all over England.


