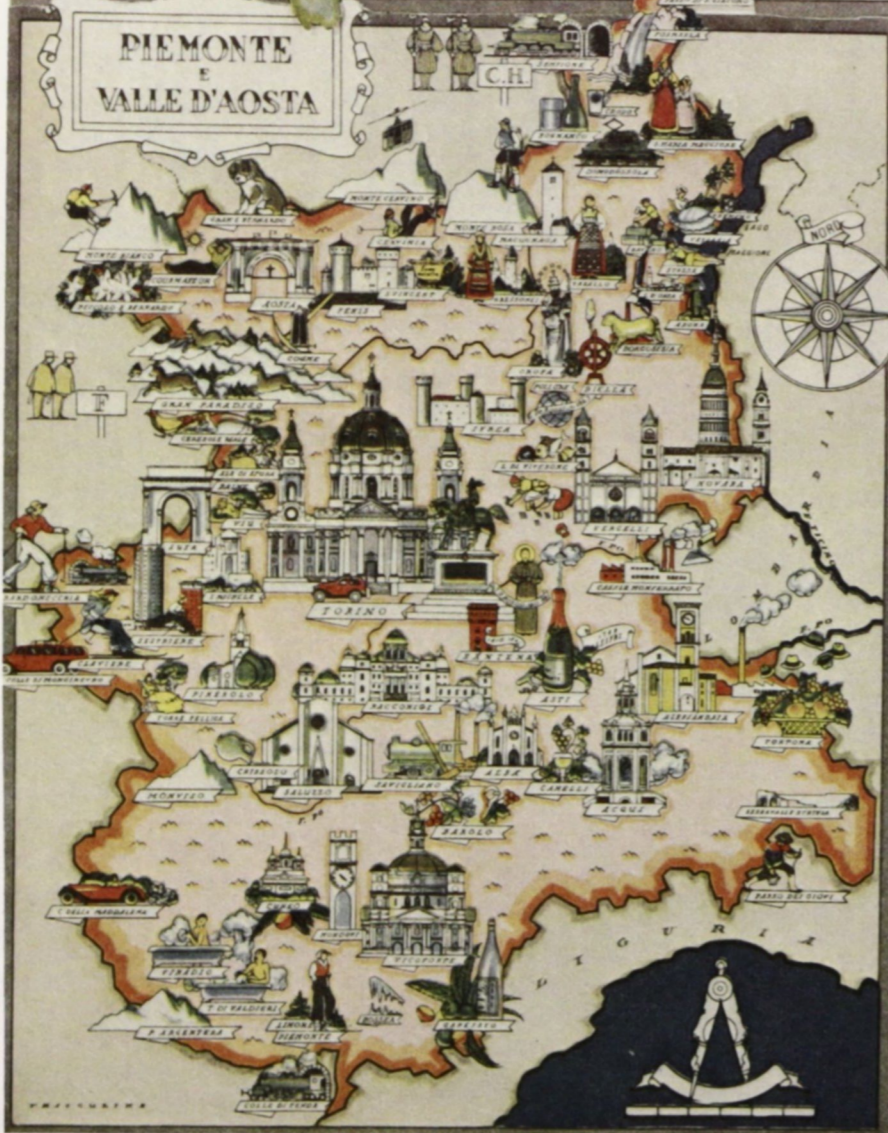

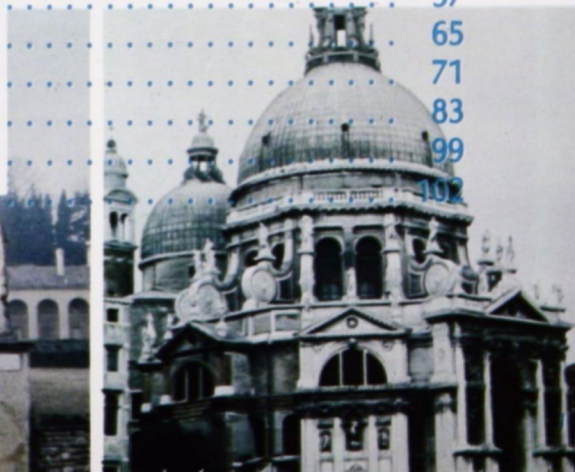
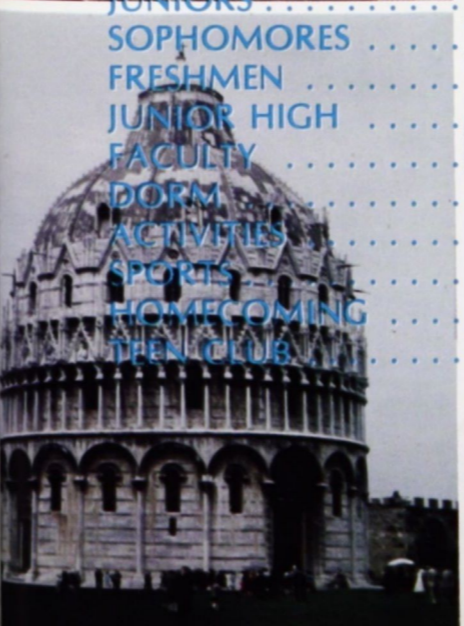

In Verona the famous Roman Theater looks out on a lovely view of the city.



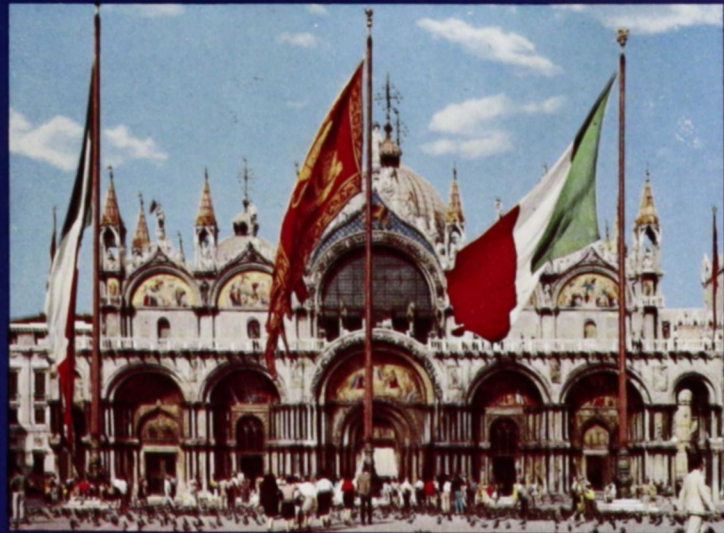

Bologna is close enough to Vicenza to spend a little weekend trip there.



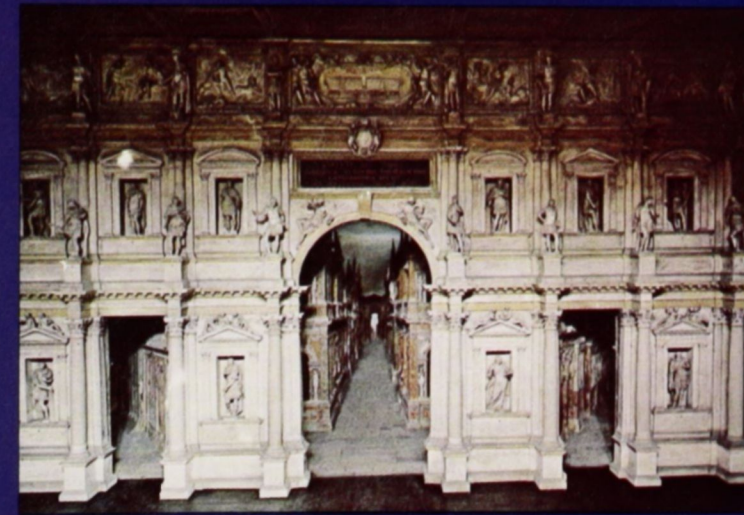

The Vatican in Rome is an independent state. Here, St. Peter's cathedral was designed by Michelangelo.



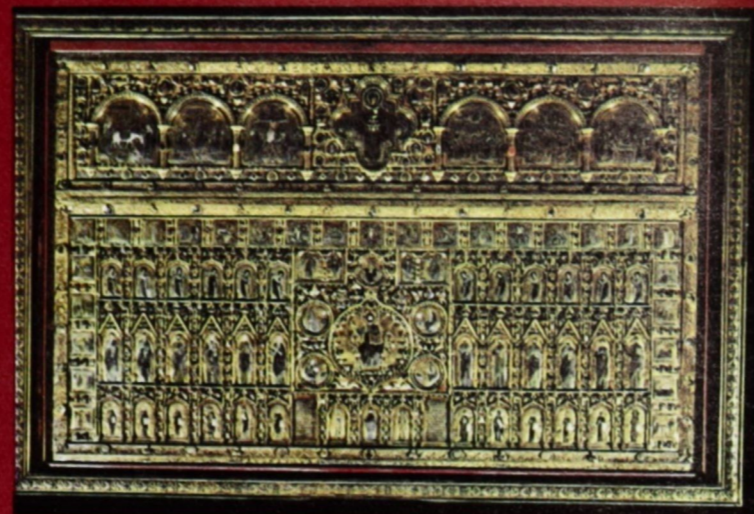
The Republic of San Marino is the second smallest State in the world; second only to Vatican City in Rome.



While you're in Italy you probably will want to see some live entertainment. If you enjoy opera and classical concerts we recommend you visit the Teatro della Scala in Milano (top left). Then, if you prefer plays you should see the Teatro Olimpico in Vicenza (top right). You can enjoy many classical concerts here too, in the spring.

When you visit Naples, you'll want to stop off in Pompeii. While you are there be sure to see the Temple of Apollo, and the Forum. (center left). If you are an artist you'll be sure to want to see the famous mosaics of Ravenna. This one, "The Empress Theodora" is located in the church of San Vitale. (bottom left) While in the Veneto region and the province of Vicenza, you must see the famous Human Chess Games at Marostica. (bottom right) These elaborate and festive games are held only once every two years.





The Loggia Valmarana in Vicenza (top left) and the Villa Barbaro in Maser (third from top, left) were both designed by Andrea Paladio.

The Pala d'Oro in Venice is a large solid gold altar piece in Saint Mark's Cathedral. (top right) It is decorated with precious and semi-precious stones, and depicts the life of Christ.

Udine, which was recently struck by a devastating earthquake, still has activities in Piazza Matteotti (bottom right). In Verona, the church of Sand Zeno is one of the city's oldest. (bottom left).

The island of Ischia near Naples has one of the oldest ports in Italy (second from top, left.)

The Bridge of Sighs is a suspended bridge that crosses the Rio di Palazzo, in baroque style, which unites the Ducal Palace with its prisons. # FLORENCE



Michelangelo's "David stands in the Accademia Gallery in the center of town (ABOVE LEFT). The Duomo of Santa Maria del Fiore (ABOVE RIGHT) was constructed from 1296 to 1434 by Arnolfo di Cambio, Filippo Brunelleschi and Giotto. The belltower is 81.75 meters high and is constructed from different types of marble from all over Italy, as is the rest of the church. The Ponte Vecchio dates back to the time of the Etruscans and has had shops along the sides since 1345. These shops now are very fine jewelry and leather stores.

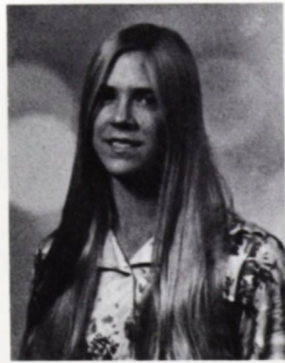
## PISA

The Cathedral of Pisa is the largest of 4 buildings in the Piazza dei Miracoli (square of miracles). The other 3 are the Baptistry, the leaning tower, and the monumental Campo Santo. (TOP LEFT.) The Baptistry was founded in 1152 by Diotisalvi. It was carved of white marble, with an interior of granite. It was completed in 1278. Sculptures were by Nicola and Giovanni Pisano. (TOP RIGHT) The Tower of Pisa (LEFT) sinks on an average of eight-tenths of a millimeter a year. It is the place where Galileo conducted experiments on the laws of gravity. It is approx. 175 ft. high, with an inclination of 13.5 ft. 193 steps lead to the top where one can see the bells, and a beautiful panorama (RIGHT).

## ROME

The Colosseum (TOP LEFT) is the most famous and well known monument of ancient Rome. It was started in 72 A.D., and was used for gladiator competitions and wild beast hunts. Its circumference is about 1669 ft. and its height measures 180.5 ft. It was able to hold as many as 50,000 people. The Trevi Fountains (CENTER LEFT)



were commissioned by Pope Clement XII. The fountains were finished in 1762 and called Trevi from the place which was formed on a crossroads, namely the running together of 3 roads. Italians and foreigners throw money into the pool which has the virtue of ensuring their return to Rome. The Roman Forums (BOTTOM LEFT) was devastated by earthquakes and fires from the beginning of the Republic, throughout the Middle Ages, to the present. The monument of King Vittorio Emanuele II (ABOVE) and the tomb of the unknown soldier, stands on the slope of the Capitoline Hill, and celebrates the Italian independence.

## VERONA

When the famous Arena of Verona was first built, in the 1st century A.D., it was used for gladiator contests, hunts, games, etc. Not until 1913 did the Arena discover its real vocation: becoming the largest lyric stage in the world, with the world's greatest sets, the largest orchestra, and some of the most famous names in operatic history.

The Arena holds 25,000 spectators and every summer people from all over the world fill it every night to see such famous operas as "Aida", "Carmen", "Turandot", "La Gioconda", and many, many more, with such famous personalities as Franco Corelli, Luciano Pavarotti, Placido Domingo, Carlo Bergonzi, Grace Bumbry, Fiorenza Cossotto, Renata Scotta, Cornell Mac Neil, and Richard Tucker, just to mention a few. 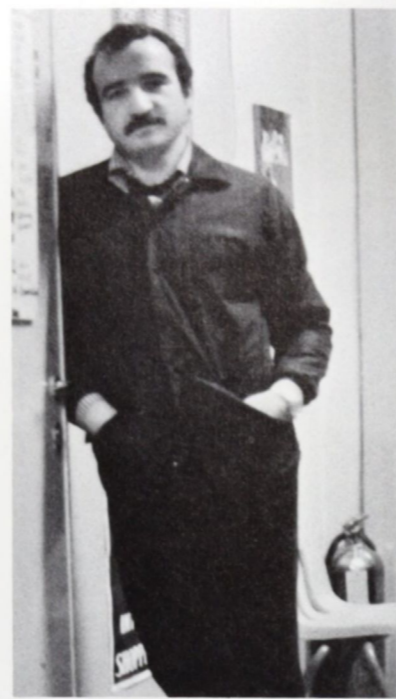


# NAPLES

# HOMECOMING 1976

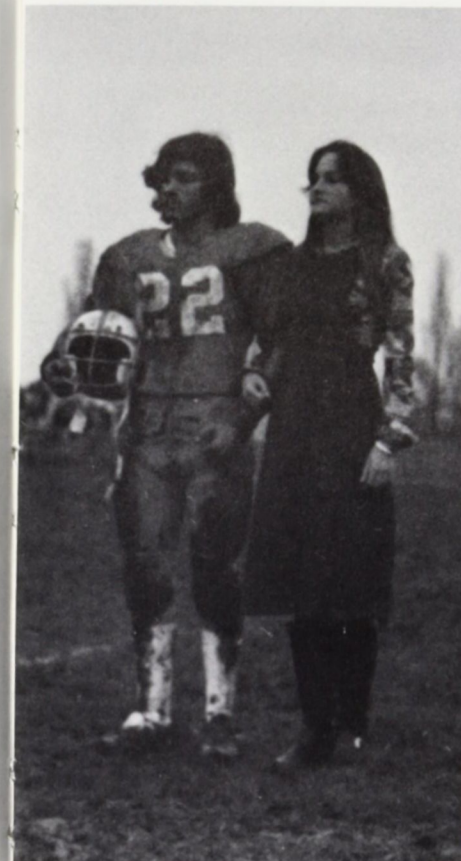

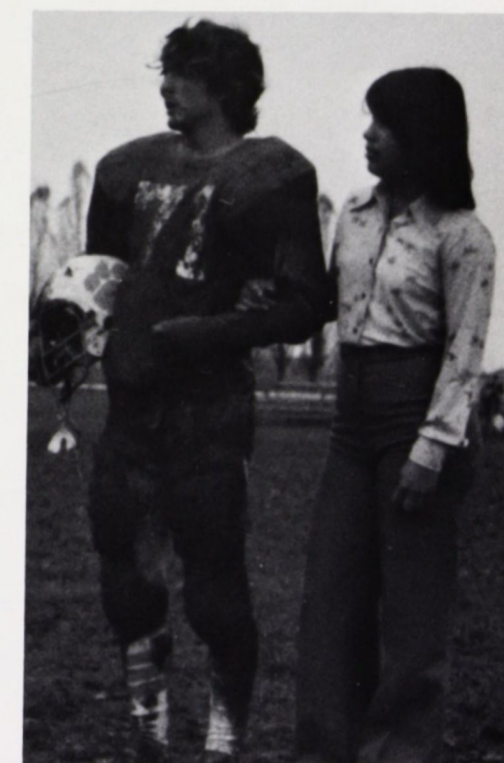

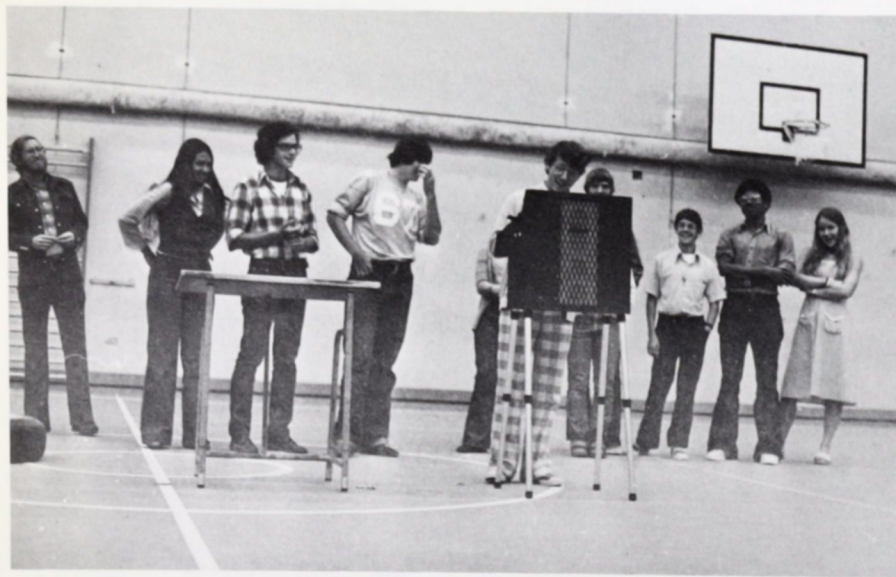
# TEEN CLUB ACTIVITIES
