## ROME

The Colosseum (TOP LEFT) is the most famous and well known monument of ancient Rome. It was started in 72 A.D., and was used for gladiator competitions and wild beast hunts. Its circumference is about 1669 ft. and its height measures 180.5 ft . It was able to hold as many as 50,000 people. The Trevi Fountains (CENTER LEFT)

were commissioned by Pope Clement XII. The fountains were finished in 1762 and called Trevi from the place which was formed on a crossroads, namely the running together of 3 roads. Italians and foreigners throw money into the pool which has the virtue of ensuring their return to Rome. The Roman Forums (BOTTOM LEFT) was devastated by earthquakes and fires from the beginning of the Republic, throughout the Middle Ages, to the present. The monument of King Vittorio Emanuele II (ABOVE) and the tomb of the unknown soldier, stands on the slope of the Capotoline Hill, and celebrates the Italian independence.

Vicenza is the city of Palladio. A great architect, Andrea Palladio designed the Villa Capra (TOP LEFT) called "La Rotonda", in 1550; the world's oldest indoor theater, in 1585 (CENTER LEFT); and inspired the Loggia del Capitanio (BOTTOM RIGHT) in 1571, and the Basilica Palladiana in 1600. Palladio was also responsible for the construction of the Loggia Valmarana, the Palazzo Chiericati, the Villa Barbaro in Maser, and many more. A statue of Andrea Palladio stands just off the Piazza dei Signori in Vicenza (TOP RIGHT).
