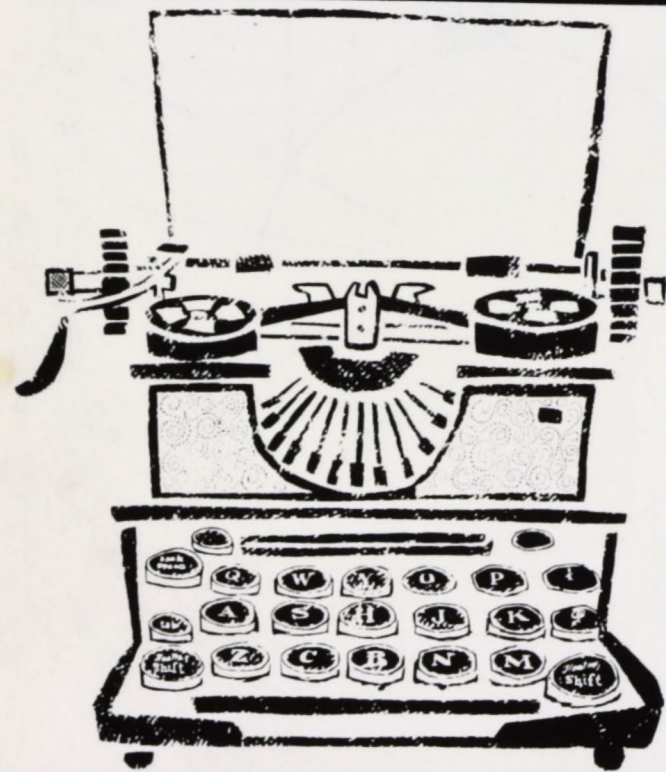

more about our friends, than just the activities they were in, and what they looked like!

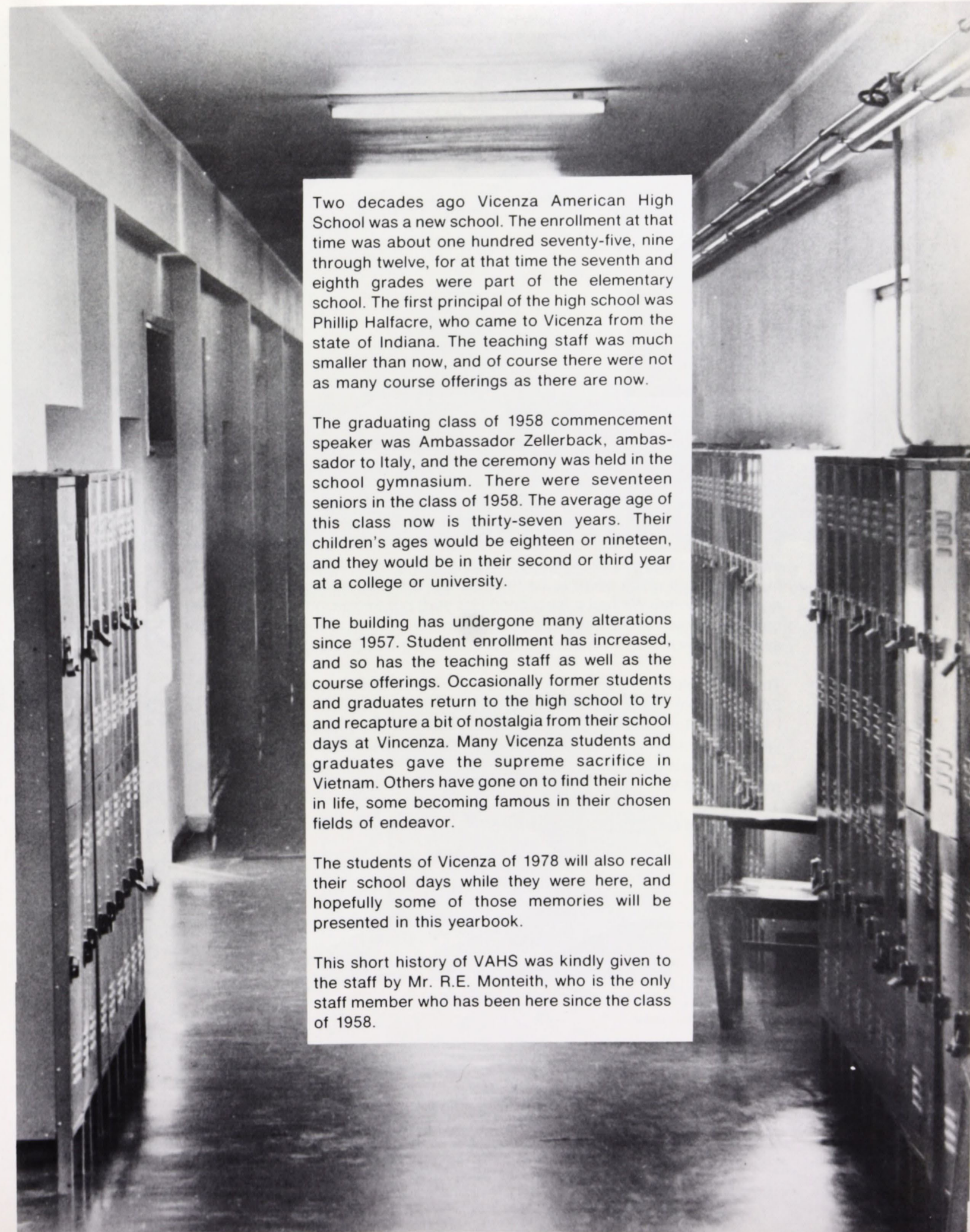

Two decades ago Vicenza American High School was a new school. The enrollment at that time was about one hundred seventy-five, nine through twelve, for at that time the seventh and eighth grades were part of the elementary school. The first principal of the high school was Phillip Halfacre, who came to Vicenza from the state of Indiana. The teaching staff was much smaller than now, and of course there were not as many course offerings as there are now.

The graduating class of 1958 commencement speaker was Ambassador Zellerback, ambassador to Italy, and the ceremony was held in the school gymnasium. There were seventeen seniors in the class of 1958. The average age of this class now is thirty-seven years. Their children's ages would be eighteen or nineteen, and they would be in their second or third year at a college or university.

The building has undergone many alterations since 1957. Student enrollment has increased, and so has the teaching staff as well as the course offerings. Occasionally former students and graduates return to the high school to try and recapture a bit of nostalgia from their school days at Vicenza. Many Vicenza students and graduates gave the supreme sacrifice in Vietnam. Others have gone on to find their niche in life, some becoming famous in their chosen fields of endeavor.

The students of Vicenza of 1978 will also recall their school days while they were here, and hopefully some of those memories will be presented in this yearbook.

This short history of VAHS was kindly given to the staff by Mr. R.E. Monteith, who is the only staff member who has been here since the class of 1958.

anyone. The only team our wrestlers had trouble with were the Naples Wildcats.

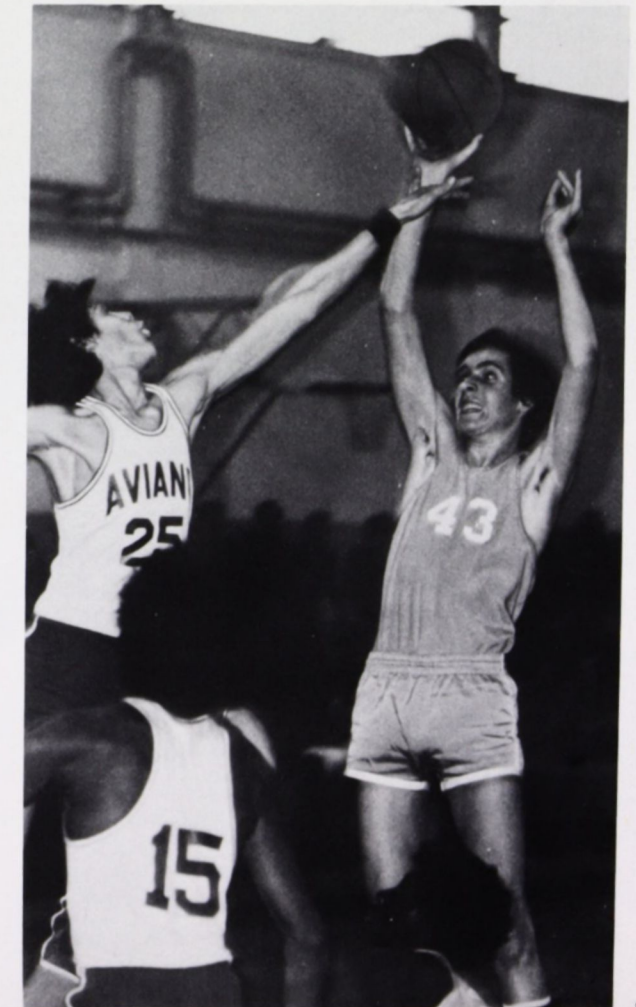
