The paper-plate contest was won by the Sophomores and the others were won by individuals throughout the school. Erica and Liz look as if they're having a great time!

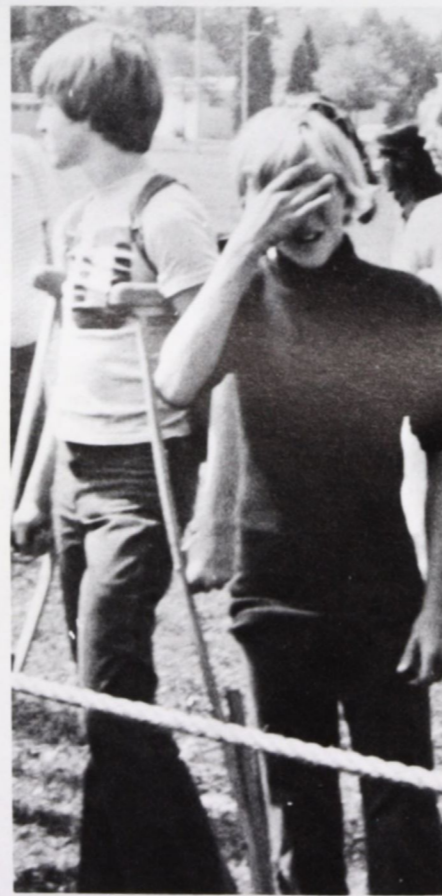

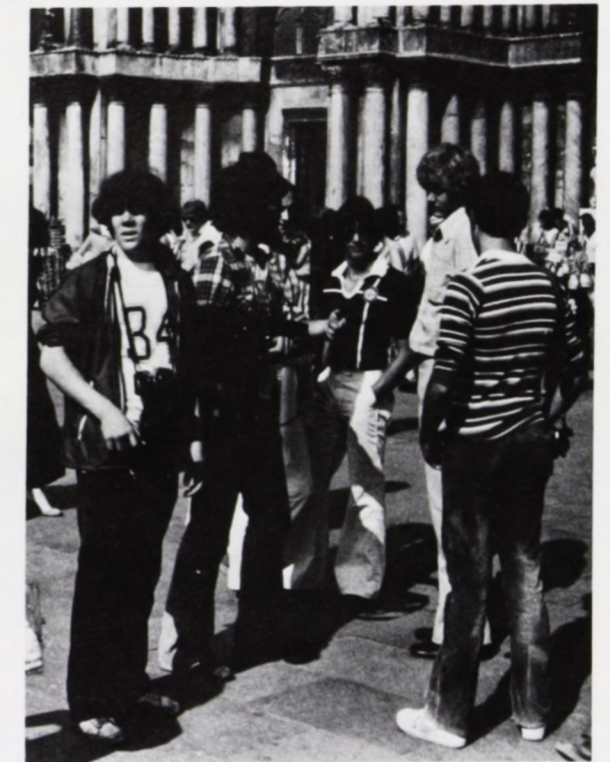
HOMECOMING 1979

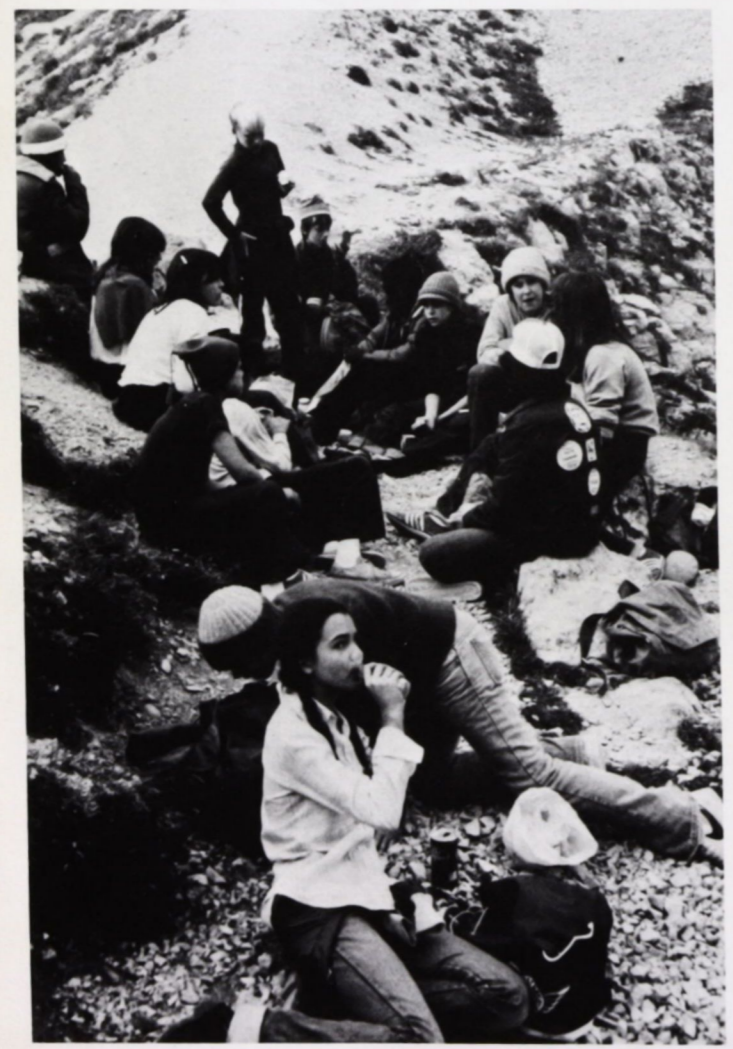

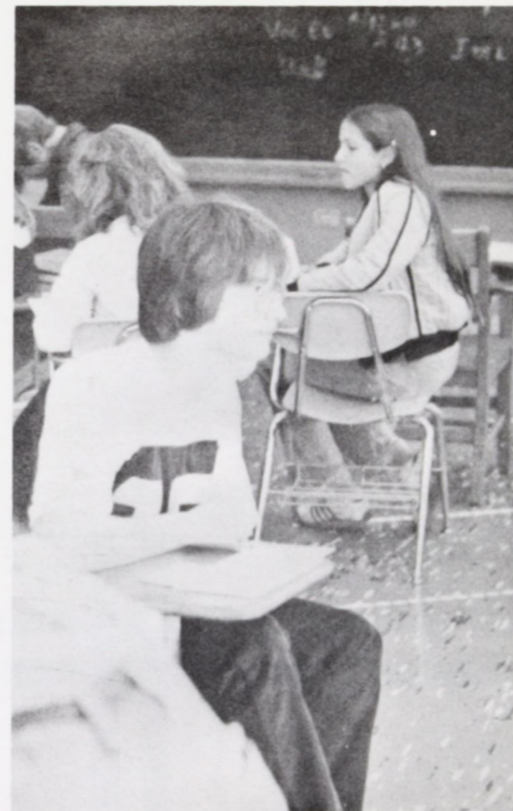

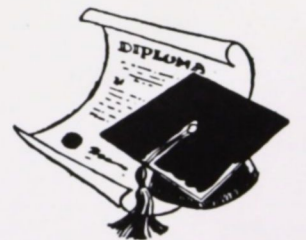
