















With 80% of the students participating, it was a big success! Not only did students get to walk, run, or crawl to the finish line, they also had a chance to admire three Palladian villas.


The march began on the North-Forty with the kindergarten classes cheering the students on, and finished in the Trissino Villa, near the Bassano Circle.














This year our events included the spaghetti-eating contest, the balloon toss, the bat race, and the traditional tug-of-war between all the classes.

ANDREA PALLADIO

When recognizing Vicenza, Italy as a place of "importance", one cannot help but associate it with Andrea Palladio and the 16th century.


Palladio, though born in Padova, was originally a stone-cutter from Vicenza. He went to Rome to study ancient and modern art. His architecture was founded upon the secular buildings of the Romans.

Returning to his native city, he designed many palaces and country houses of great beauty and dignity. His designs were later copied in England, other parts of Europe, and the United States.

Palladio belongs to the masters who, in the 16th century, by the study of the works of Roman builders, created a new era in architecture. One of his great works is the beautiful "Teatro Olympico", here in Vicenza and where our seniors graduate each year. Venice also owes to him many of her finest buildings.

Vicenza's Championship season opened at home with a hard-fought 26-6 win over a strong Aviano squad. The game was scoreless until Steve Bullard hit end Mark Herrling with two T.D. passes in the second quarter. Vicenza controlled the ball in the second half with the running of HB's Freddie Waldrond and Ralph Griffen. Griffen's aggressive defensive play held the Saints offense in check most of the afternoon.

The Vicenza team split into two squads to play two 8-man games at Brindisi. In the morning game, the White team, trailing at half-time, outscored the Jaguars 36 to 0 in the second half to secure the 50-24 victory. The afternoon game proved to be somewhat easier as the Gold team rolled passed the Brindisi squad 48-8.

The Cougars confidently moved on to meet the Naples Wildcats in what proved to be a disappointing confrontation. Although only giving up one first down in the first half the Cougars found themselves behind 19-0 at half-time. The Cougars could never recover and the Naples home crowd enjoyed a 26-13 victory.


The second half of the season opened with Vicenza,

Aviano and Naples tied with 1 win and 1 loss each.

At Aviano a 50-yard T.D. run by Freddie Waldrond early in the game gave the Cougars a back they never gave up. A strong defense led by Jim Cavoli and Steve Gregan kept the Saints in check until a Bullard to Herrling T.D. pass put the game on ice and gave the Cougars a 20-0 victory.

The White team hosted the Brindisi group on a rain soaked Vicenza field, and led to a 30-0 victory.

The stage was set for the big showdown and the Italy Championship's. The "Main Event" arrived and the Cougars were ready. The Cougar defense forced several Naples mistakes and prevented the Wildcats from mounting any kind of offensive threat. The Cougar offensive line lead by Tackles Jarvis Kimble, Kip Knight and Troy Miller, guards Joe Annette and Steve Gregan, ends Mark Herrling and Carlos Garcia and center Ken Ogden opened big holes for the Cougar backs. Bullard directed a backfield through an awesome running attack as Cavoli, Griffin, and Waldrond picked up big yards against the big Wildcat defense.






















The Italian Club and the Italo-Britannica Club this year combined themselves and elected the same officers and executive council while still being separate clubs.



Lab technician, radio announcer, nurse's aide, child care attendant, electronics technician, secretary, sales clerk, food service attendant, baker, stock clerk. These are just a few of the jobs that are available through enrollment in the VAHS COOPERATIVE WORK EXPERIENCE PROGRAM (CO-WEX).

The CO-WEX Program is part of the Career Education Department and has been in the VAHS curriculum since 1968. This course offers students a chance to experience different kinds of work while earning school credit in a job site away from school. CO-WEX students are also required to complete weekly assignments which teach employment skills such as how to complete job applications, use the want ads, conduct a job interview, and researching various occupational fields. The CO-WEX Coordinator also offers individual vocational counseling and testing, in addition to monitoring the work done at each job site. Many students who have been enrolled in CO-WEX have left VAHS to find jobs in the USA, based on skills they have learned while working at their job site.




