The 1981 season will go down as a "building year" for the Cougars. The championship team from the year before was diminished by graduation and rotation so that only 2 year-long starters returned, Derrick Gould and Frank Rosario. Many players were inexperienced and coaches Don Drakulich and Doug Urner had their work cut out for them. The squad was eager to learn and they did. By their last 2 games they had progressed to a point where the highly experienced teams of Aviano and Naples had their hands full with the Cougars.

Opening against Aviano (the eventual ASIL Champs) was a baptism by fire for the Cougars as the Saints marched to a $41-2$ victory.

Vicenza split into 2 teams to play the small schools in 8 -man football. Against Livorno, Mike Cooper scored 3 t.d.'s as the Cougars got their first and only victory of the year 38-6.

Naples came into town and went home with a hard fought 86-6 victory. The Cougar defense led by Frank Rosario put up a good fight, but the offense could only score once on a Crenshaw to Gould pass.

A long trip to Brindisi to play an 8 -man game turned out to be longer coming back as our injury-riddled Vicenza team was beaten by a strong Brindisi squad, 44-14. Tom Keating's outstanding offensive and defensive performance was not enough to pull the Cougars through.

The Cougars were heavy underdogs going into their game against the already crowned ASIL Champs Aviano, but the Saints soon discovered they were in for quite a battle. As the 4th quarter started, the Saints were only up by 14-0 on the strength of two big plays early in the game. The Cougars stuffed the powerful Aviano offense the charge. But the overwhelming odds proved too much, as the game ended with a score of 26-6.

The year's finale was in Naples and again going into the 4th quarter the Cougars were down, 14-0 The Cougars ended up the statistical leaders in the game as Derrick Gould and Mike Crenshaw passed for over 200 yards, but they lost the war, 31-0.
The coaches feel the team showed signs of becoming very competitive. With experience gained and a year of hard work, the Cougars of 1982 could rise again to the top of the ASIL.
