From Clark Kent, to Superman! School spirit and class participation were generated in the annual





The Teen Club hopes that the following years will be as enjoyable as the past year.






The Cougars placed three girls on the All-Conference Team. They are Laurie Adams, Sue Cuddy, and Daniela DiCiccio, the three captains.


Yearbook Staff





