Russel Monteith was the only teacher who had been around since the birth of VHS in 1958.

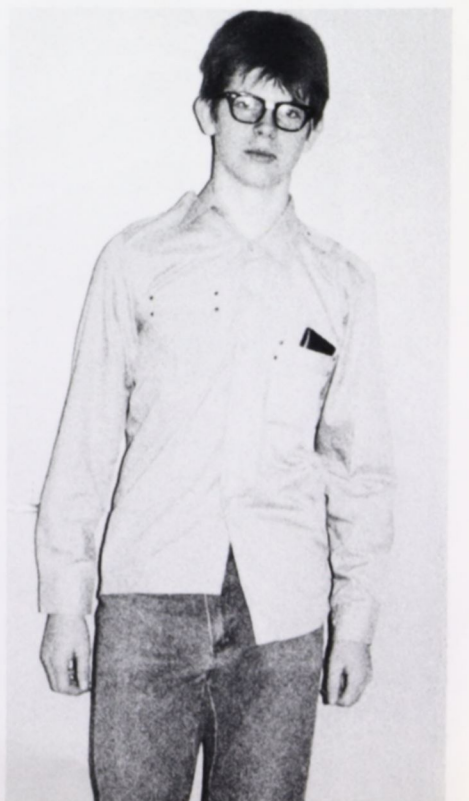
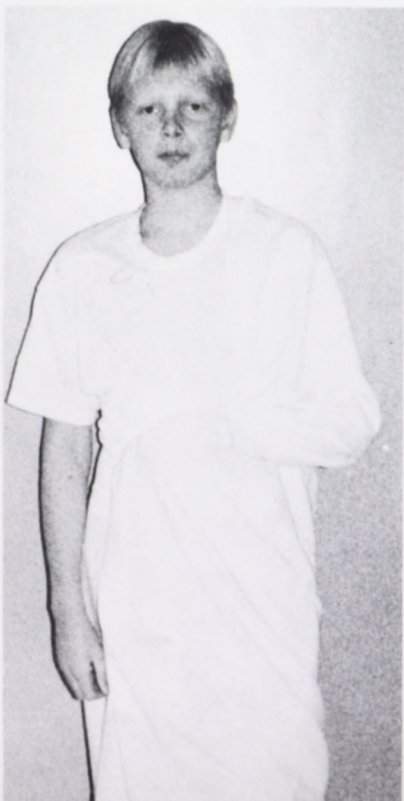

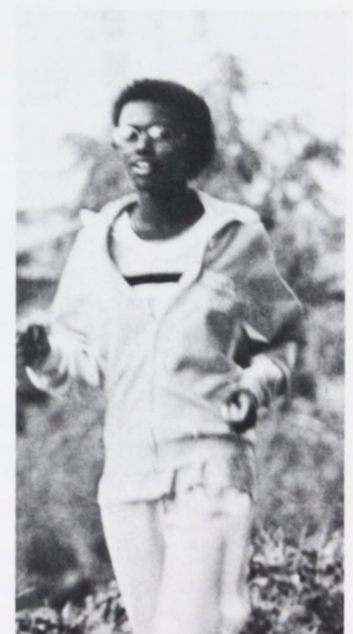

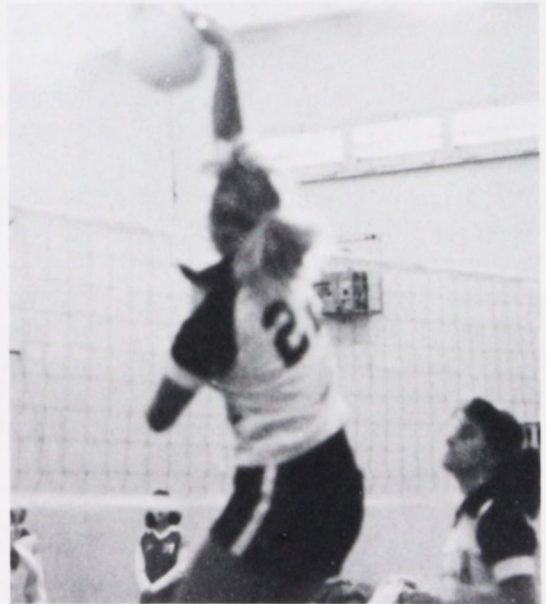
GO COUGARS!!

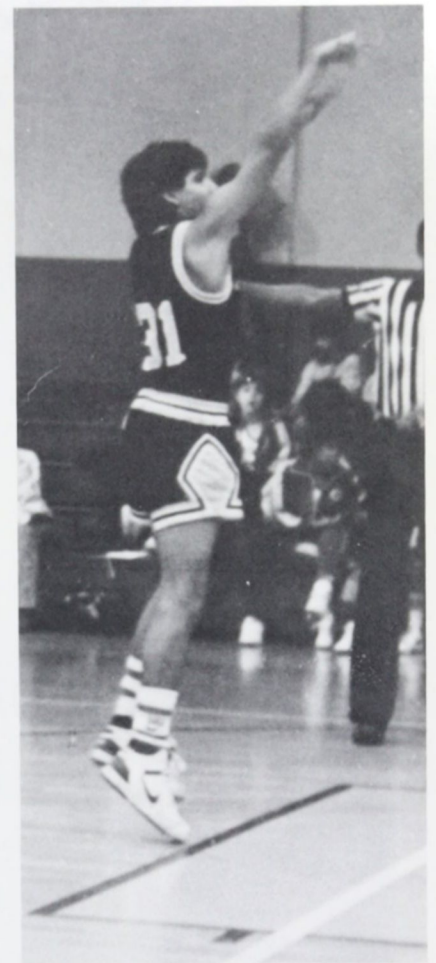

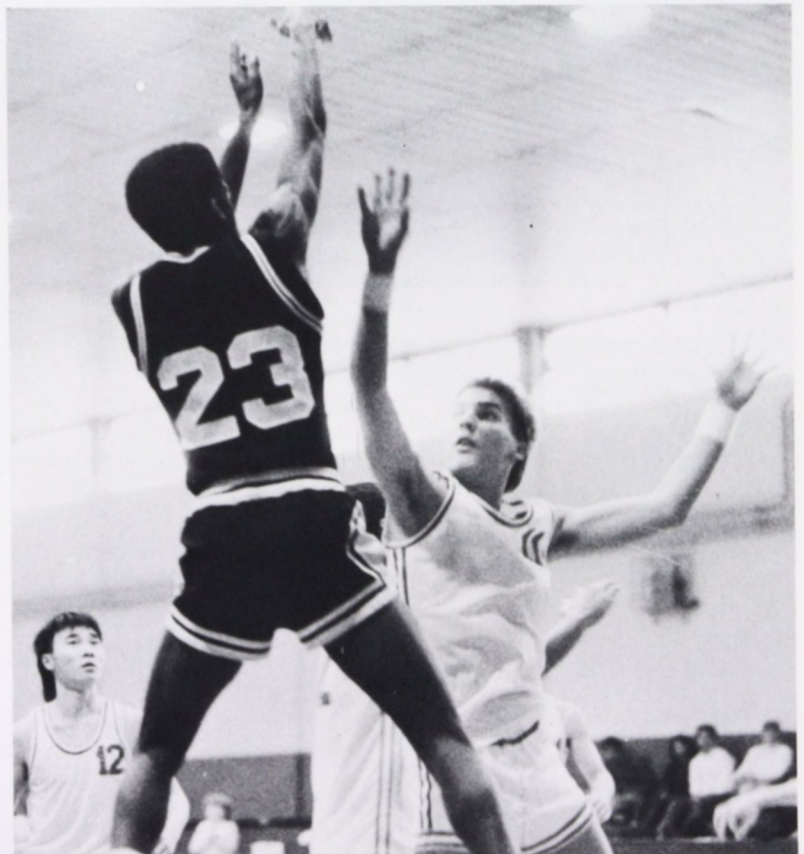
