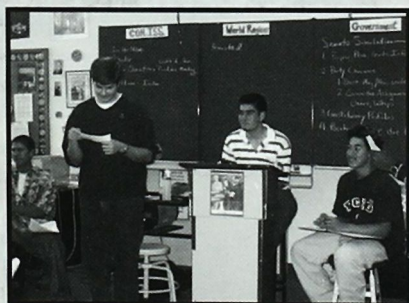
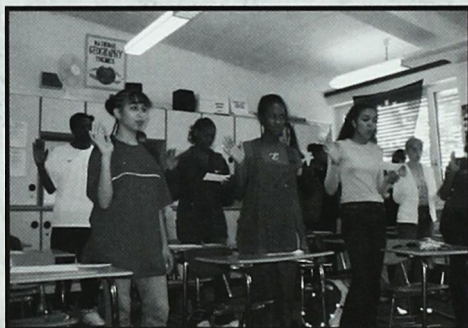
STUDENT COUNCIL

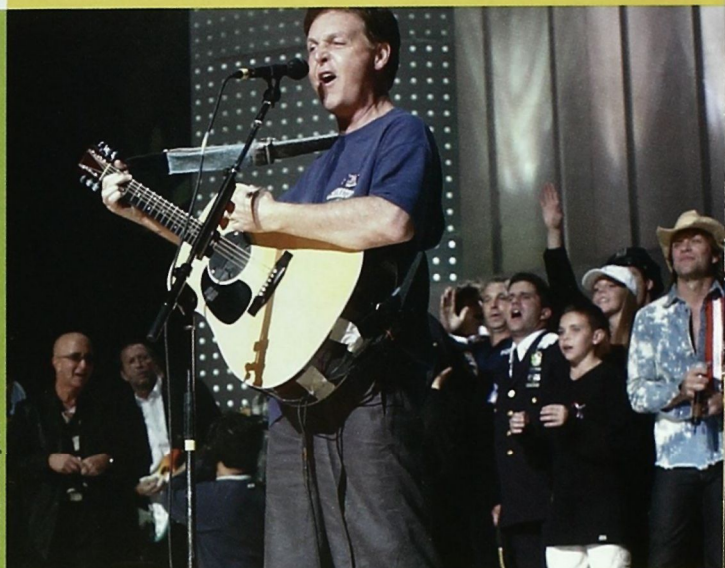

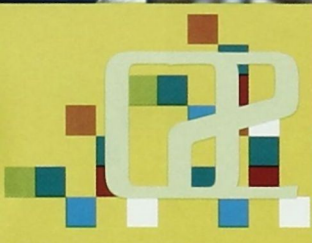

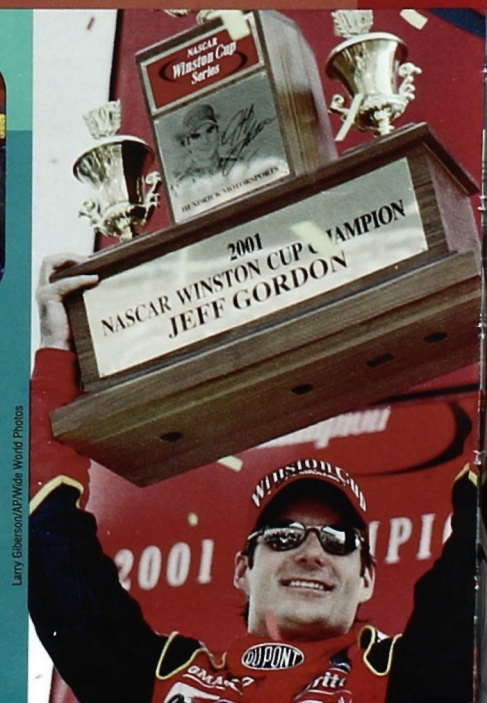
