advances and not losses. Roger was not down by one, he was surrounded by many.

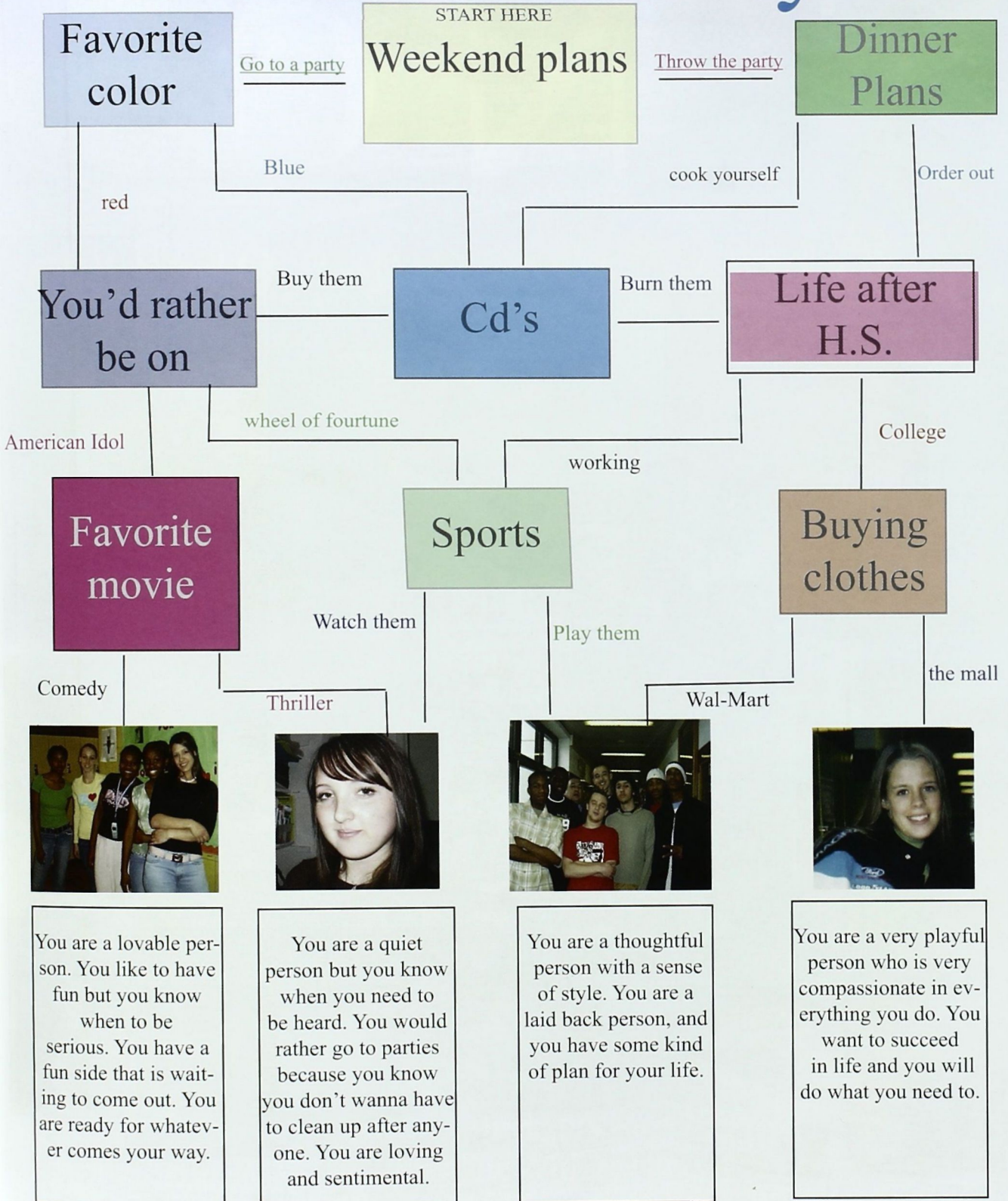

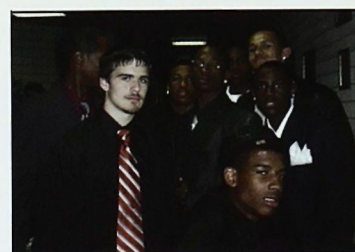
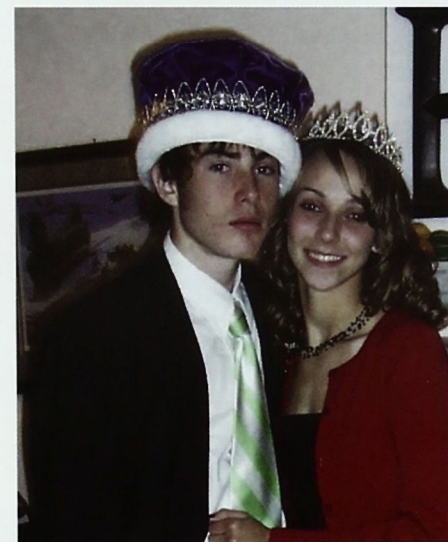
Homecoming is the annual event in which the entire school participates. Student Council organizes homecoming but most of the campus organizations take part.

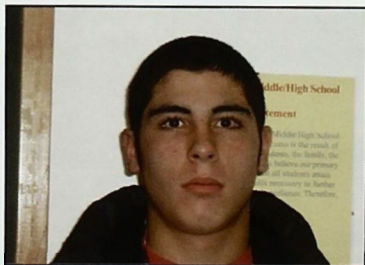

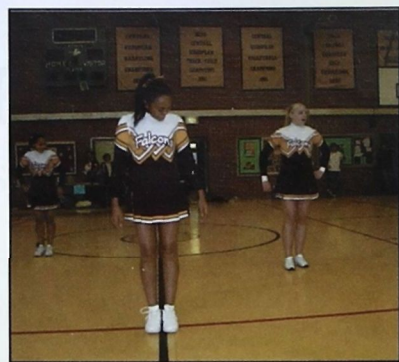

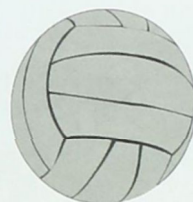
This year was the best pre-tournament season Vilseck's ever had. There were many returning varsity players and just as many new additions to the team, making the season really great.

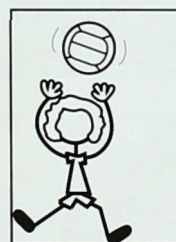

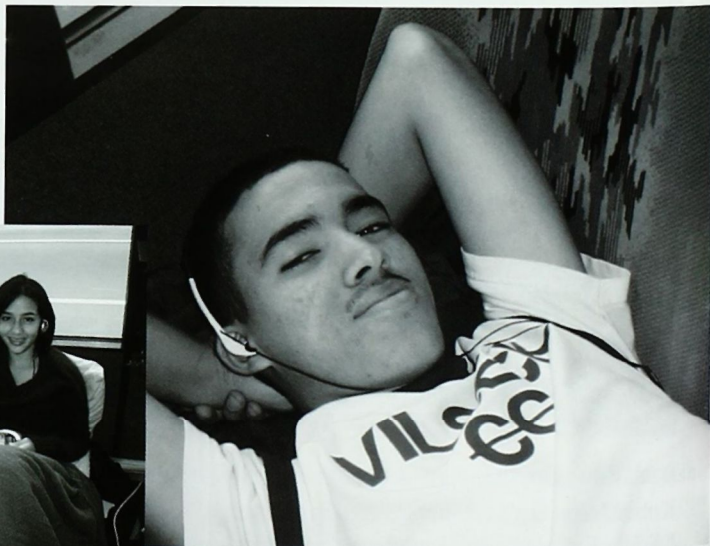

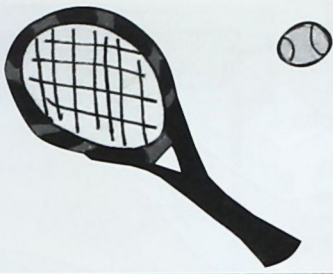

Golf - into the swing

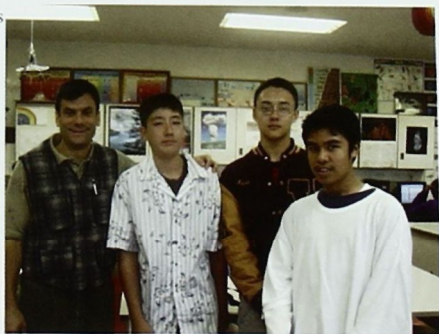

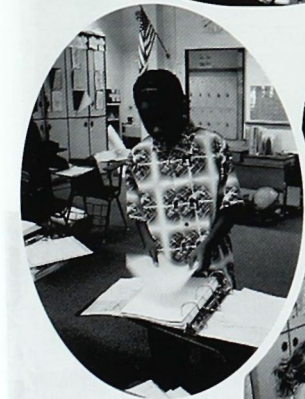
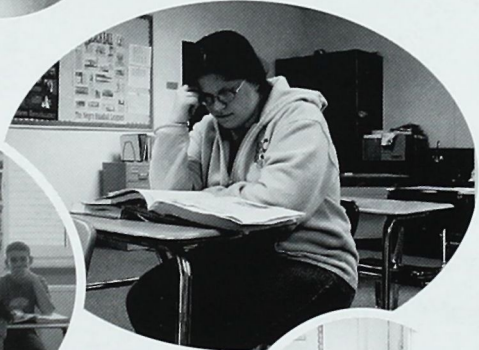
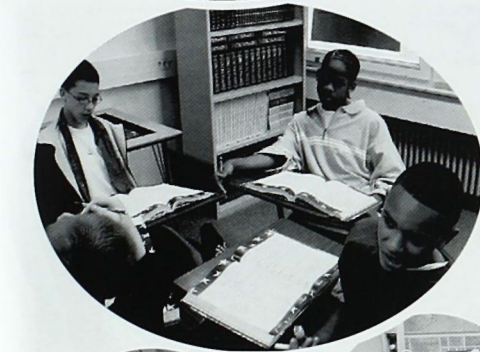
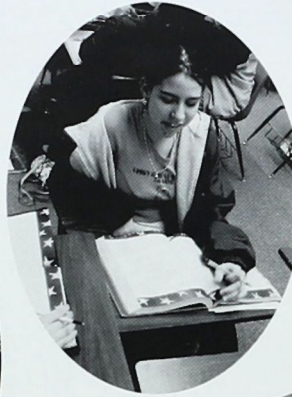
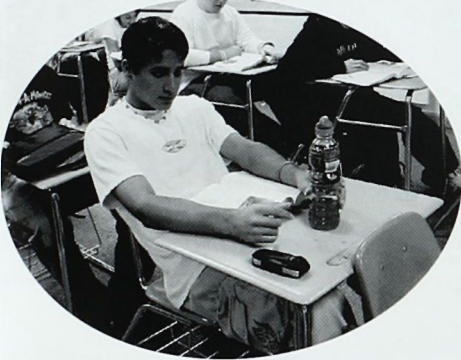
Elements of Life

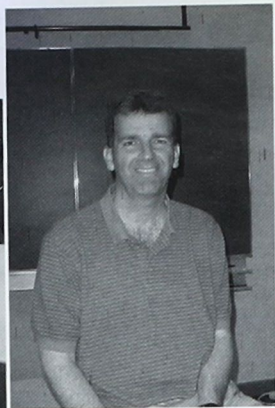
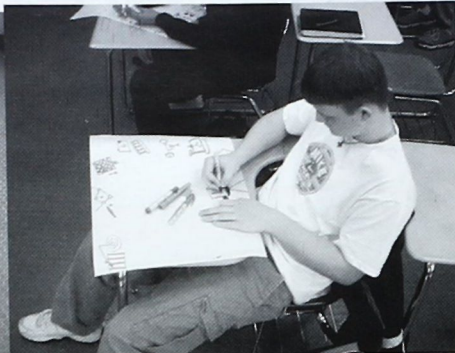
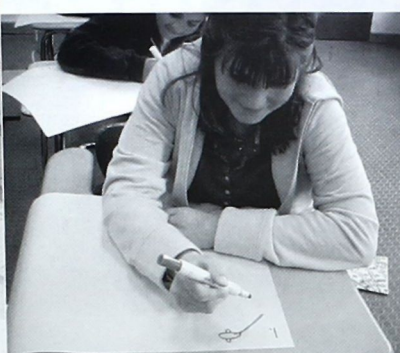
Computer Classes

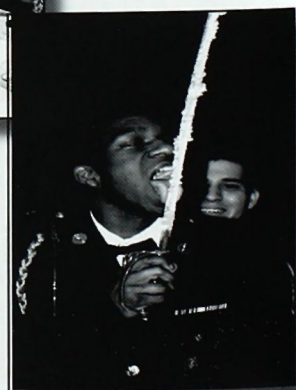

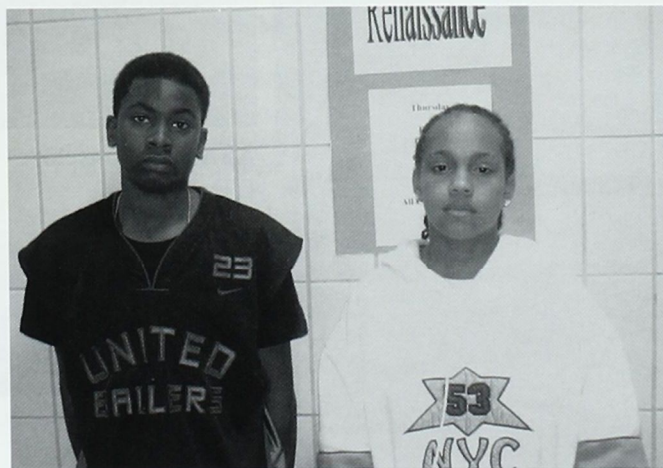
New Students Make the Jump
