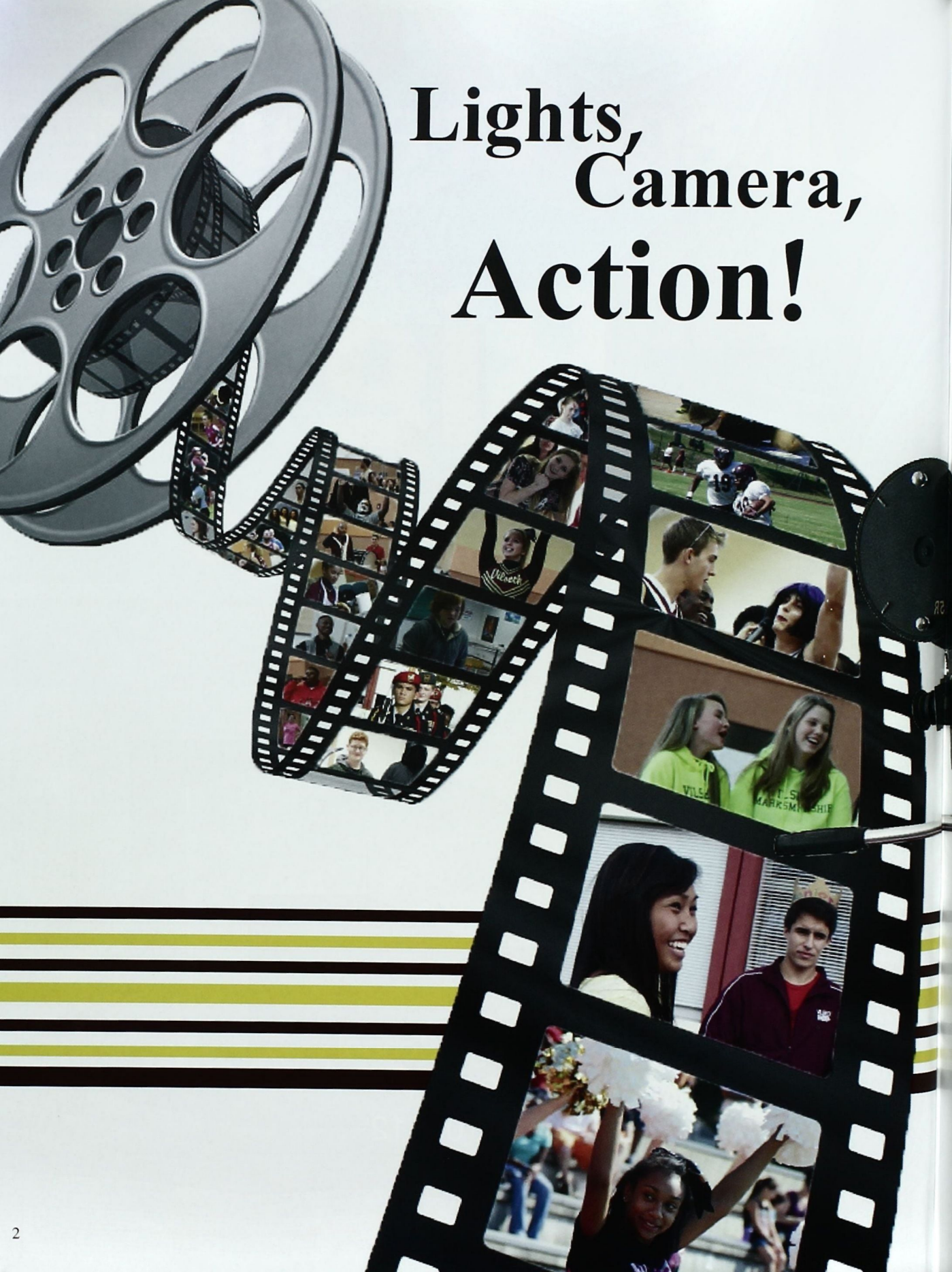

# Fast Times

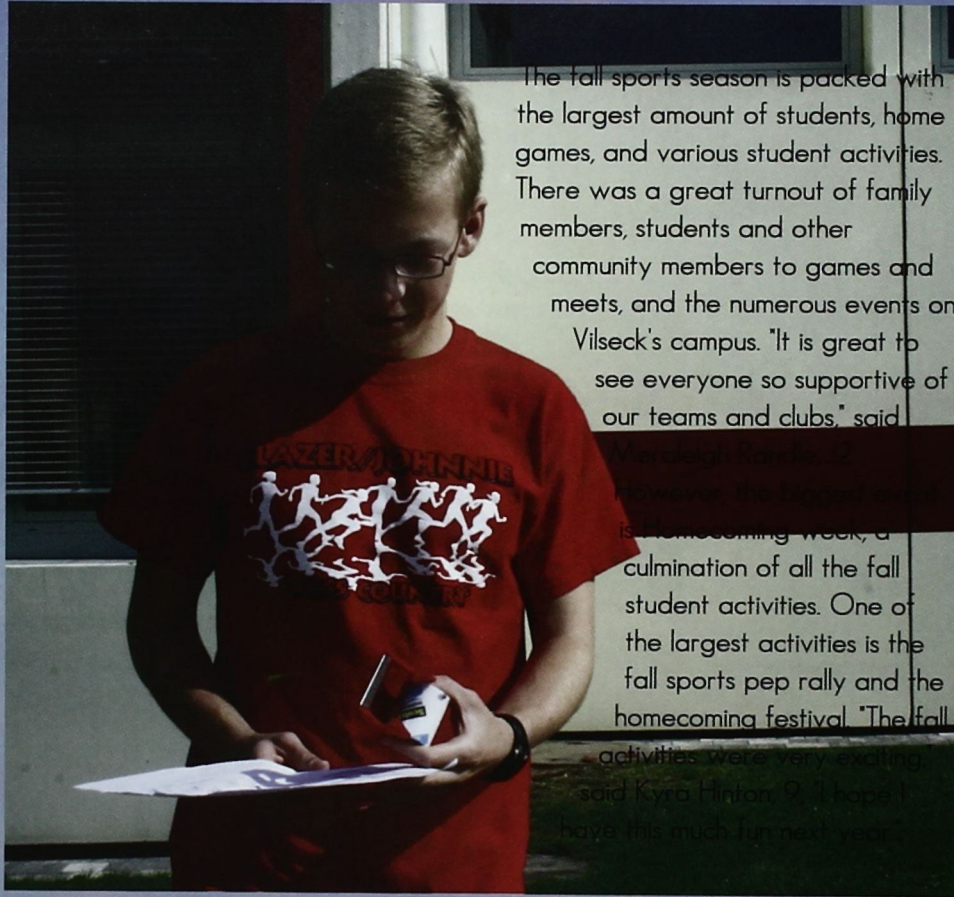

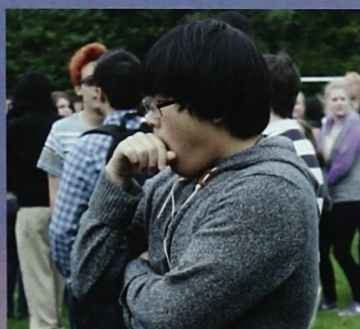

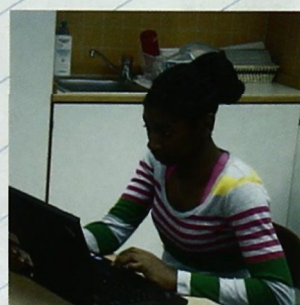

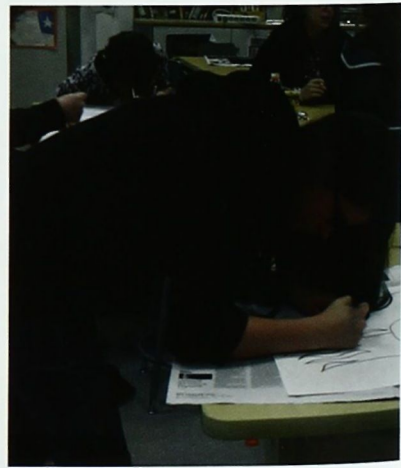
# Activities

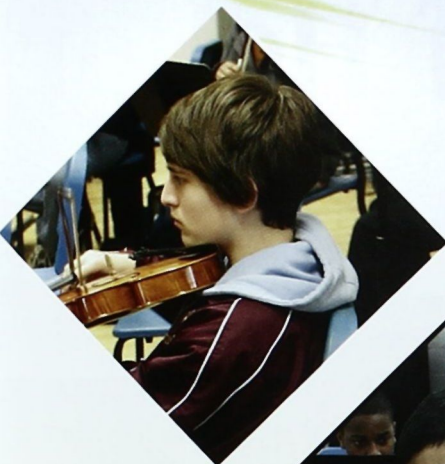

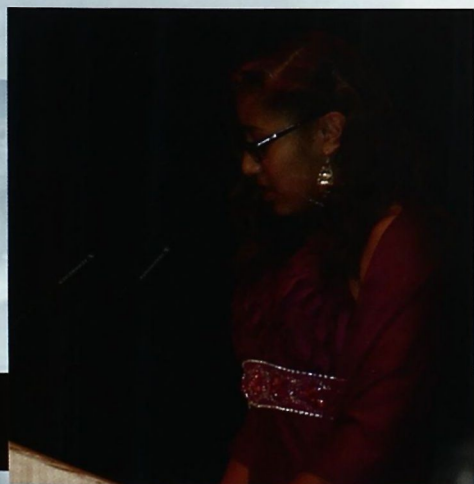

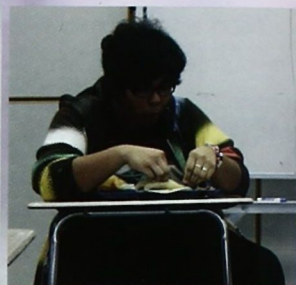

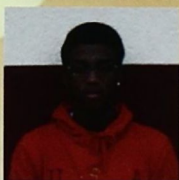

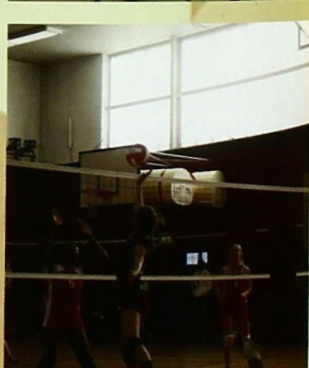


# Impact Point

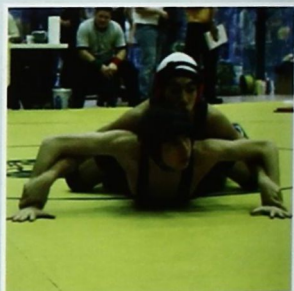

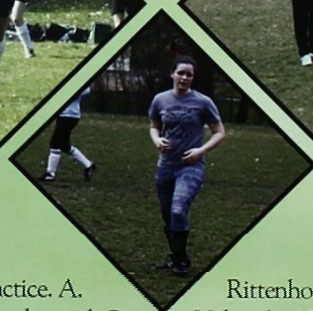
