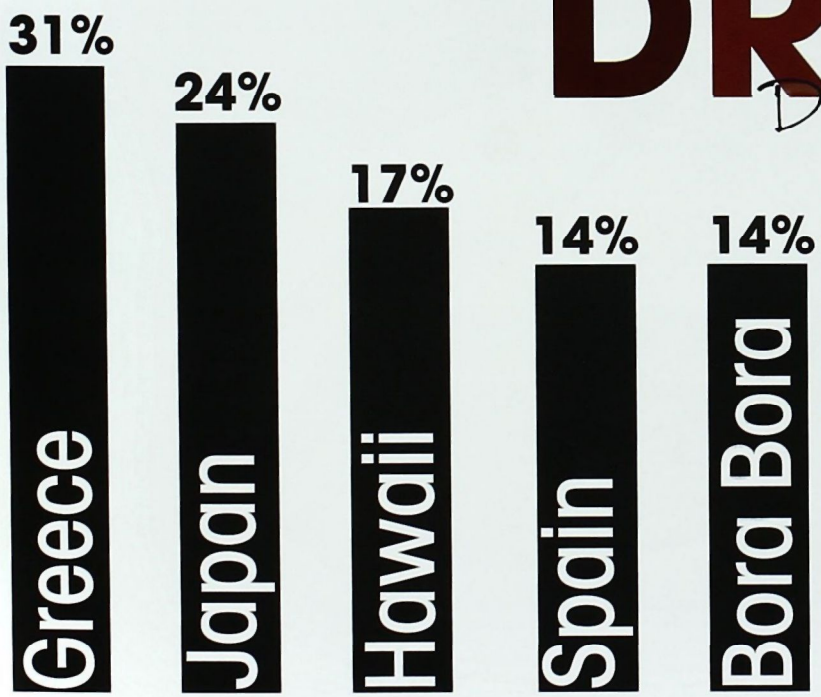

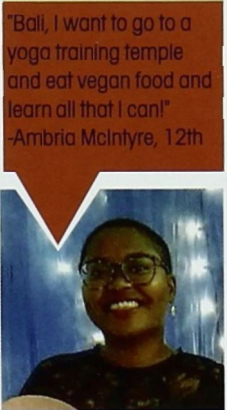

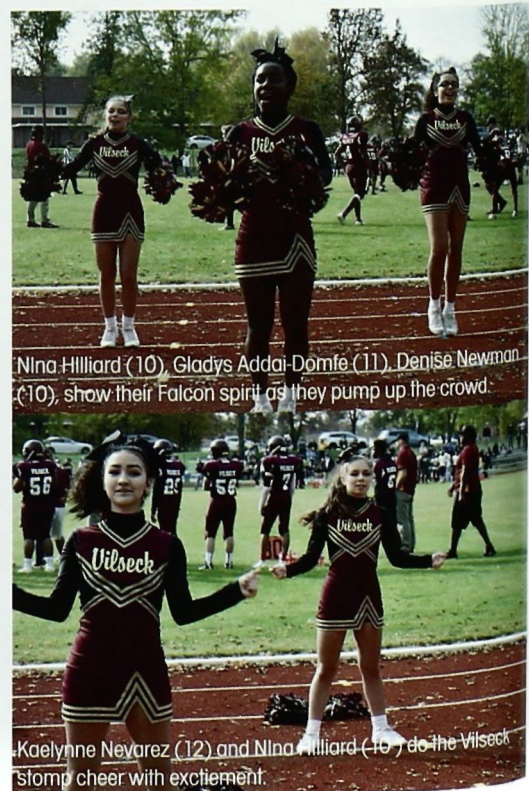
Angela Suarez's (11) Golden Moment was "seeing everybody improve at practice every single day and to see them do that skill they've been learning on game days."

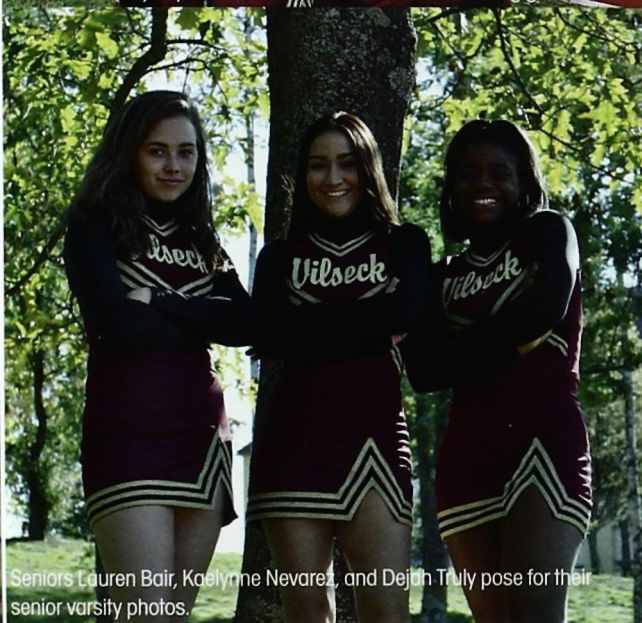

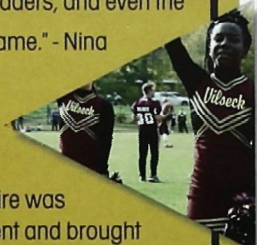

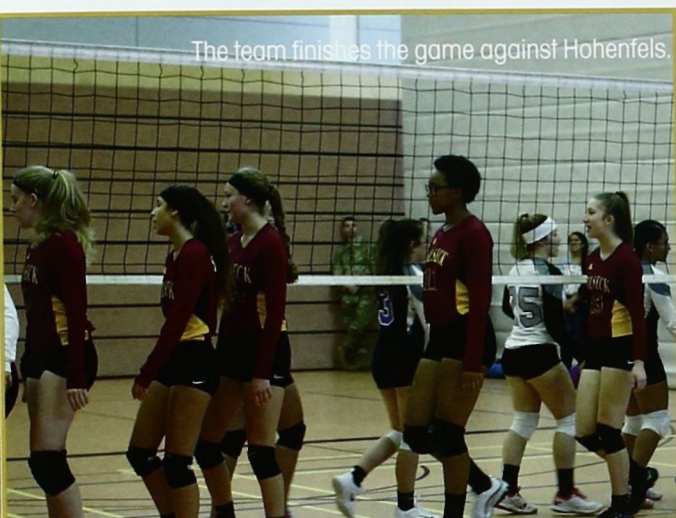

Behind the Bows

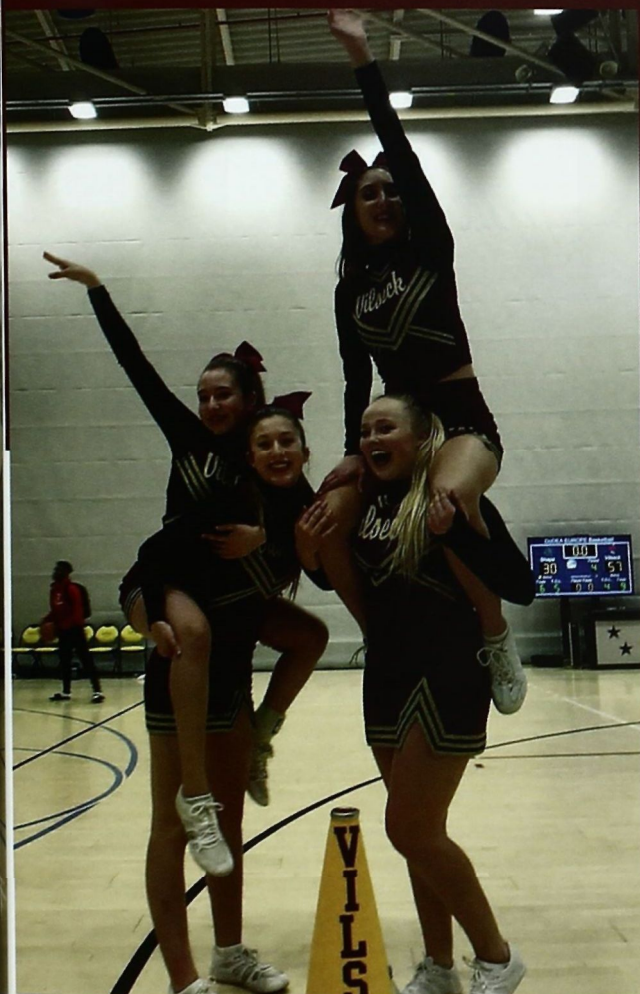

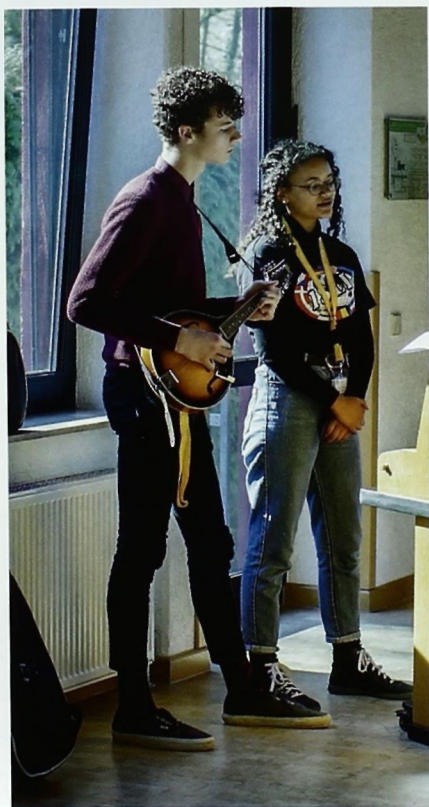

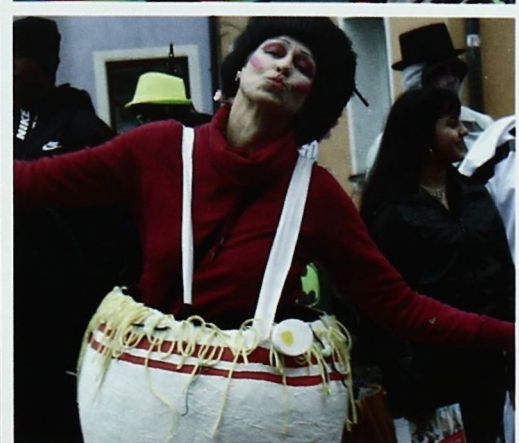
Fasching With The Falcons

Cierra Delagarza, a sophomore, says that she loves experiencing the German Culture. She loves dressing up, watching the parade, and partying with the locals.

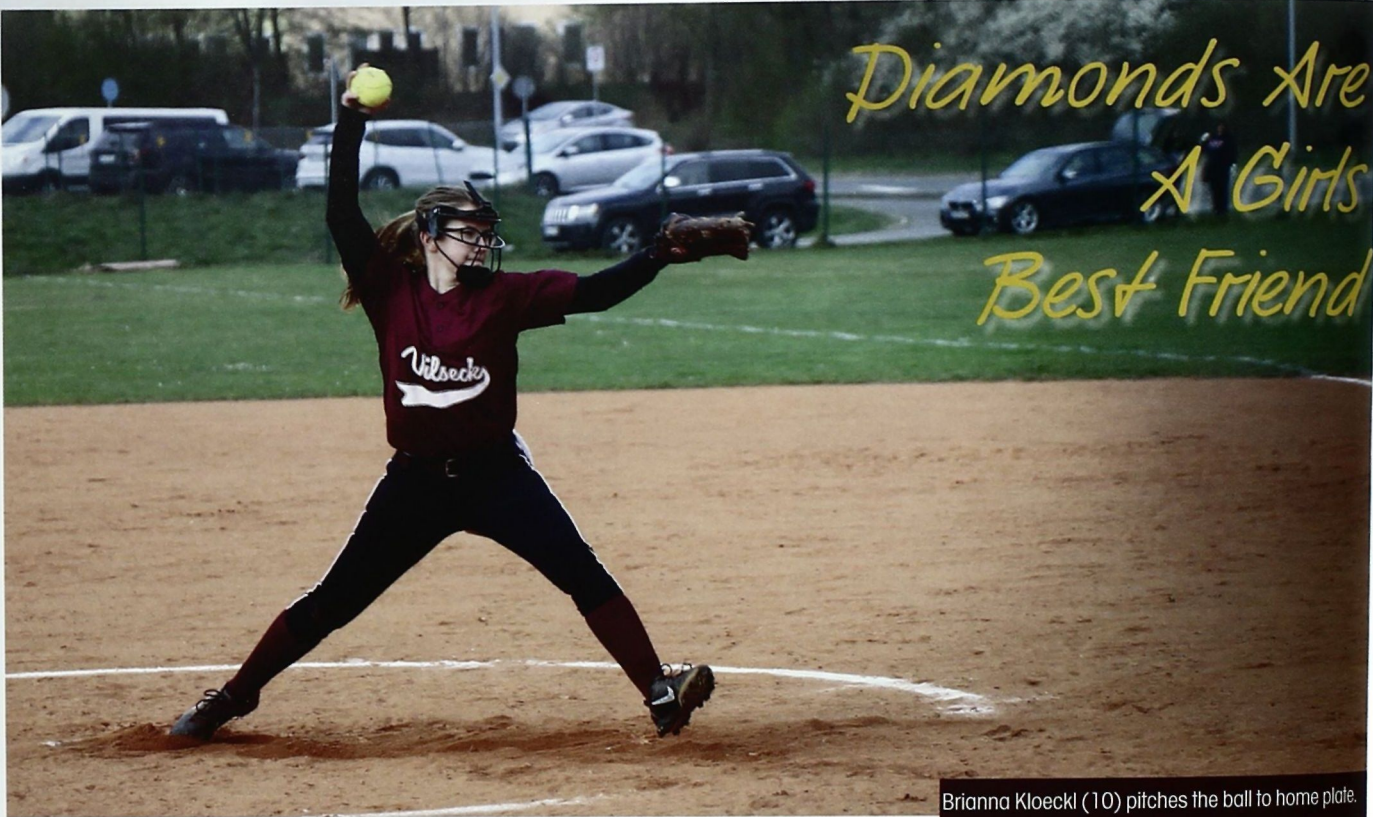

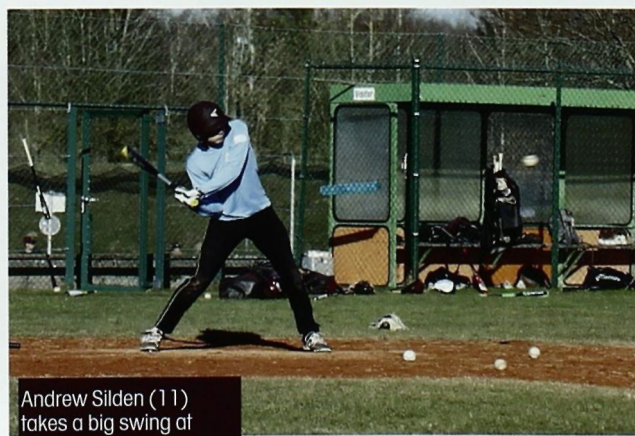

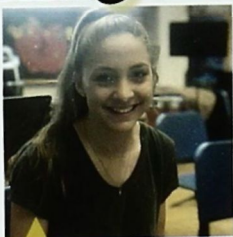
The music department split their concerts into two nights, the chorus performing on one night and band and orchestra performing the next night.

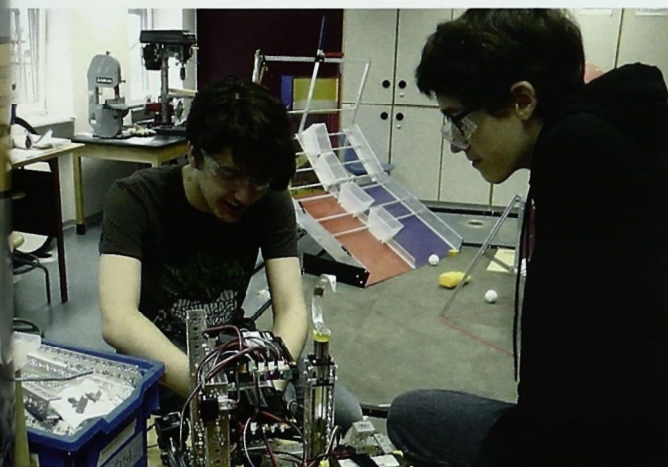

Vilseck High School is a place full of diversity because of the many places our students come from. From Seoul, S. Korea to Fort Drum, New York we are the new home to many bright individuals.

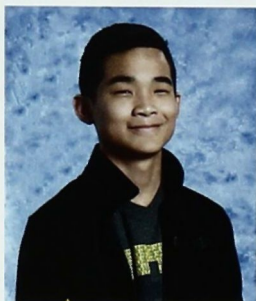
