The Overseas Schools














USDESEA

1971 marks the 25th anniversary of our dependent school system. The United States Dependents Schools, European Area (USDESEA) came into existence on 14 October, 1946, twenty-five years ago, when devastated German cities still reeled in the wake of Allied bombing missions and smoldered in ruins.

In the summer of 1945, plans were made for the provision of the first dependent schools to be used by those military dependents who would be brought to Germany to assist in the maintenance of morale and to provide models of democratic family life for a defeated Germany.


On 14 October, 1946, thirty-eight elementary and five high schools opened in Germany, enrolling 1297 students and making use of 116 classroom teachers. Today those dependents schools are USDESEA, with an enrollment now of more than 116,000 students in fourteen different nations in 217 schools covering more than 9,000,000 square miles an area two-and-a-half times the size of the Continental United States. More than a million American students have attended dependents schools since they opened in 1946, and, today. USDESEA is America's 19th largest school system.

We've come a long way since those early days of scrounging students and teachers who attended the first schools in tents, converted barracks, sub-standard make-shifts, and prefabs; who huddled around pot-bellied stoves and went without heat and hot water; who rode to school in jeeps or converted prisoner busses with bars on the windows; and made do with liquor crates for desks and managed without books and supplies.

A PROFILE OF THE TYPICAL WJHS 8TH GRADER







According to USDESEA information, typical overseas dependents schools students come from every state in the union; have been in at least one foreign country before they finish the 4th grade; will have attended at least three different schools in two different countries before they finish high school; speak one or more languages in addition to English (25% of dependent school students learn English as a second language); perform slightly above the national norms in intelligence and achievement; seldom are school dropouts; half enter universities after high school.

The survey conducted by the Wildcat year-book staff yielded the following information about the typical WJHS 8th grader:

The typical Wiesbaden Junior High 8th grader is 13 1/2 years old, 65 inches tall, and slightly overweight, the boys tipping the scales at 107 and the girls at 105. 79% of the 8th grade class attended 7th grade at WJHS and 50% attended at least part of their elementary schooling in Wiesbaden. The typical 8th grader has been in Wiesbaden for nearly 3 years, lived in the Continental U.S. for 7 years and has made an average of 5 PCS moves in his thirteen years. 54% have been to at least one other overseas dependent school. 64% like living and being in Germany; 75% live in government quarters and 76% prefer government housing to economy living. The typical 8th grader has made friends with a German individual or family and has traveled extensively throughout Western Europe.

12% profess to speak German very well; 34% only fairly well; 44% very little, and 10% not at all.

8th graders show comparable preference for physical education, math, English, and social studies, but indicate science is their favorite among their basics and typing among their electives. Anything but fashion plates the typical 8th graders come to school clad in blue jeans, flares, bell bottoms, and cords; pull-overs or sweatshirts, and have obvious psychological needs to wear their coats in class. Only 25% of the girls admit to wearing a skirt or dress more frequently than slacks or pants. Both boys and girls prefer Adidas, German sport shoes; and desert boots to clomp around in.













If 8th graders could determine the manner in which their classes would be conducted, 12% would choose the traditional-teacher-structured approach; 31% the "open" or student-structured approach; and 57% a combination of both.

The typical 8th grader spends 3.8 hours a week outside school on school work; and considers the ability to get along with people and to assume responsibility as the most valuable things he's learned in school.

He admires and values most a teacher's understanding qualities and sense of fairness and considers a teacher's subject-matter competency secondary to being "fun" in class and having a good sense of humor.

Overwhelmingly, 8th graders prefer long hair on girls and 70% prefer long hair on boys. 18% of the 8th graders profess not to eat any lunch. When he does eat, the typical 8th grader prefers hamburgers, French fries and pizza, followed closely by steak, chicken, roast beef, and spaghetti. Eccentric choices range from spinach and artichokes to Metracal and blood pudding. He prefers the music of Grand Funk or Black Sabbath; values truthfulness, honesty, and loyalty in his friendships.

40% wear glasses; 84% chew gum in class; 28% smoke, 72% do not; 12% say they have tried marijuana, 88% say they have not; 17% say they have tried some kinds of drugs, 83% say they have not; 91% still read comics, prefering Archie, Richie Rich, Spiderman, Superman and Batman. 40% read up to ten books a year; 21% read more than fifty. 45% read a newspaper every day.

40% spend their free time relaxing, doing nothing, "goofing off" and socializing. 29% read in their free time; 17% listen to music, go to movies or watch t.v.; 5% fill their free time with hobbies; 9% in sports.

Slightly more than half of the 8th graders could not think of a person whom they admire sufficiently to emulate. Erratically mentioned people ranged from Martin Luther King, Jr. and John F. Kennedy to Howard Hughes and Hugh Hefner.









A PROFILE OF THE TYPICAL **WJHS 7TH GRADER**






The typical WJHS 7th grader is 12 years 3 1/2 months old, is 58 inches tall, and, like the 8th grader, tends to be overweight, tipping the scales at 99 1/2 lbs.

The typical 7th grader has lived in Wiesbaden for two and two-thirds years; has attended at least one other overseas dependent school, most frequently Spain, England, France, or Turkey; he comes from every state in the union; has lived in the Continental United States for 7 1/2 years, and has made an average of 6 PCS moves.

75% of the 7th graders live in government quarters and 75% prefer government housing to economy living. The typical 7th grader likes living in Germany and has made friends with a German individual or family. He has traveled extensively in Western Europe, and many have been to the Far East. 7% profess to speak German very well; 40% only fairly well; 41% very little; and 12% not at all.



The typical 7th grader, like his 8th grade counterpart, dresses casually in cords, bells, or jeans. Only 20% of the girls wear a skirt or dress more frequently than slacks or pants. Both boys and girls prefer Adidas, German sport shoes; boots; loafers; and tennis shoes.

66% of the 7th graders would prefer a combination of student and teacher directed teaching methods. The typical 7th grader spends only 4 hours outside of school on school work but considers learning how to work on his own the most valuable thing he has learned in school. He values a teachers sense of humor above all other quali-



















10% of the 7th grade class regularly do not eat lunch, but like their 8th grade counterparts, prefer hamburgers, French fries, and pizza. Running a close second are steak, shrimp, tacos, and beef stroganoff.

The typical 7th grader overwhelmingly prefers long hair on girls, but is undecided about whether he prefers long or short hair on boys. He prefers the music of the Jackson Five, the Osmunds, Black Sabbath, and Three Dog Night. 92% of the 7th graders still read comic books regularly, preferring ARCHIE, RICHIE RICH, DENNIS THE MENACE, and SUPERMAN. 37% read a book a month for leisure time reading. 80% profess to reading a newspaper almost every day, but the comics and sports pages first.

35% of the 7th grade wear prescription glasses. 70% chew gum daily in their classes. 44% play and "goof around" in their spare time; 36% read.

85% of the 7th grade class do not smoke, but 15% profess to be regular smokers. 5% of the 7th grade class admit to trying marijuana as well as other drugs; 95% have tried neither.

The typical 7th grader values honesty, loyalty, and truthfulness above all else in his friendships.

The typical 7th grader, unlike his 8th grade counterpart, was, for the most part, able to think of some person whom he admired enough to want to emulate. Heroes ranged from JFK, George Washington, Abe Lincoln, William F. Buckley, and Martin Luther King, Jr. to Einstein, Neil Armstrong, John Wayne, Herb Alpert, Flip Wilson, Howard Hughes, and Michael Jackson.











A PROFILE OF THE TYPICAL WJHS TEACHER

Wiesbaden Junior High School consists of forty-five classroom teachers and thirteen support personnel (a principal, a vice-principal, an assistant-principal, two counselors, a librarian, an assistant librarian, a secretary, three clerks, a nurse, and a supply man.) The following is a profile of the typical WJHS workhorse, the typical classroom teacher:



The typical WJHS teacher is slightly over thirty-three years old; of the forty-five, 23 are females and 22 are males.

Fifteen of the men and twelve of the women are married; seven of the men and eleven of the women are unencumbered.

While their students come from every state in the union, WJHS teachers hail from only twenty-three of the fifty states and primarily from the East Coast and the Midwest.

The typical WJHS teacher has three and two-thirds years of stateside teaching experience; has been overseas with the dependents school system for five and one-half years; and with Wiesbaden Junior High for slightly more than three years. Over half of the forty-five teachers have advanced degrees beyond their bachelor's with an average of twenty hours in addition to their degrees, eleven of which have been earned overseas.












The typical WJHS teacher spends more than twelve hours a week outside of school on school work; thirteen are involved in extracurricular activities; many are involved in base or community activities, ranging from Afro-American study groups, chapel and choir to hunting, fishing, sports, and Girl Scouts.







The typical WJHS teacher has worked either full or part time in an occupation other than teaching ranging from waiting tables, selling and clerking to tending bar and driving trucks and taxis; from shoe salesman, rancher, farmer, and choreographer to bacteriologist, piano tuner, tour guide, Pinkerton agent and parking lot attendant.












The typical WJHS teacher has traveled to virtually every corner of the world: He has ridden camels and elephants, land-rovers, and Jeepneys; walked in the footsteps of kaisers, kings, Caesars, and Pharaohs; seen the red star over the Kremlin and the rising moon over the Taj Mahal; marveled at the Acropolis, Angkor Wat, and the Alps; stood on the brink of the Iron Curtain, the Bamboo Curtain, and the Berlin Wall; strolled the Ginza and sailed fjords. From kangaroos to habus, he has adapted to the various cultural patterns in the world and adjusted to a variety of living and working conditions. For the most part, he applied originally to the dependents schools program because he wanted to live and work abroad, to try something different and adventurous, and he has stayed in the program because he finds overseas teaching appealing: its mobility avoids stagnation; its freedom allows for experimentation and Innovation; its location affords the opportunity for travel and exposure to new customs and cultures; and his students are varied, versatile, and vibrant. And he will stay with the program so long as living on the edge of history remains exciting.
