Then came the drum roll and the announcement . . .





Higher scores on tests of scholastic aptitude that's the goal of the students who work in the Excelsior Club. "Excelsior" is a Latin word; it means "higher." The students practice taking parts of Scholastic Aptitude Tests (SAT). Vocabulary is one of the major items studied by the group. The vocabulary is then tested in questions of analogy, multiple choice, and sentence completion. Students are also given direction on how to work on their own to prepare for the big tests. Some commentators maintain that fifty hours of practice on these tests enable students to raise their scores by 100 points. Part of the benefit undoubtedly comes from the fact that the students gradually lose their fear of testing and begin to be more active when faced with these tests. Some students become so active that they even begin to enjoy trying to beat their old scores. The sessions are of short duration, but are brisk and engage the whole concentration of the participants. The Excelsior Club is an inition into higher levels of testing, participants have fun discovering new meanings. They feel more secure when they take important tests, and scores on their tests usually become somewhat "excelsior."
