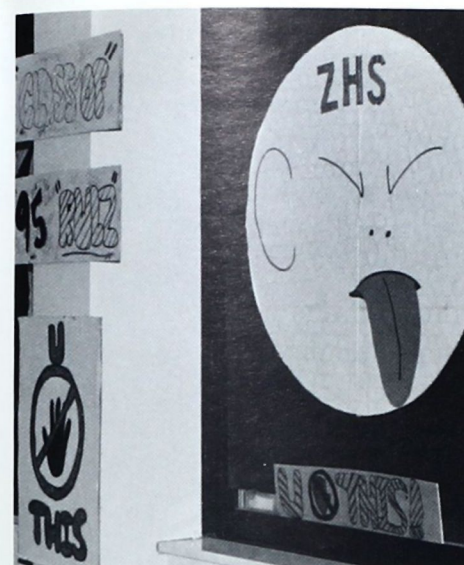
ACTIVITIES

Both sponsors, Ms. Pfister and Ms. Owen are proud of the students included in the organization.

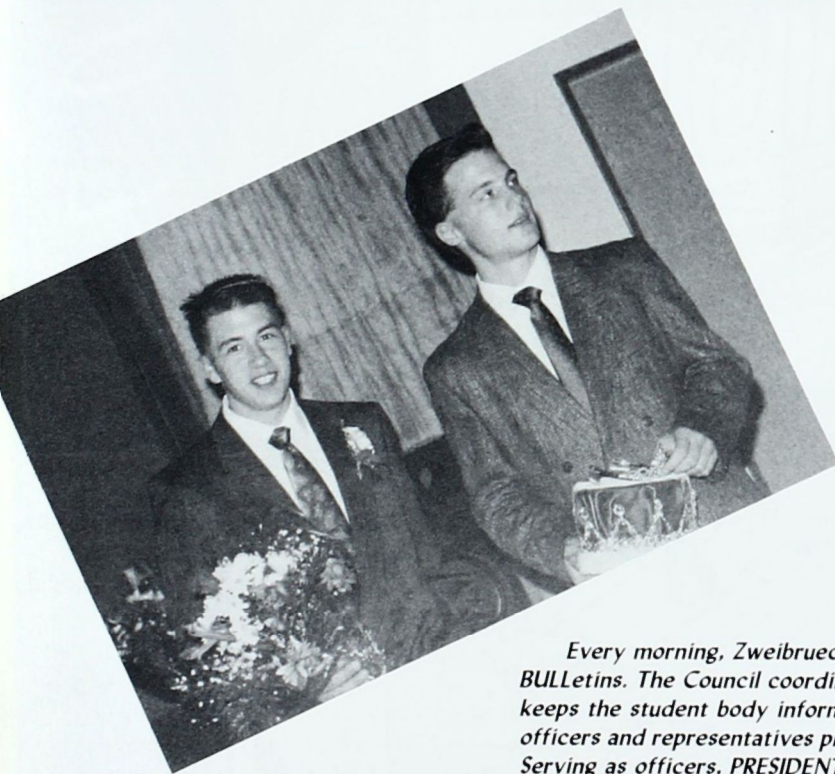

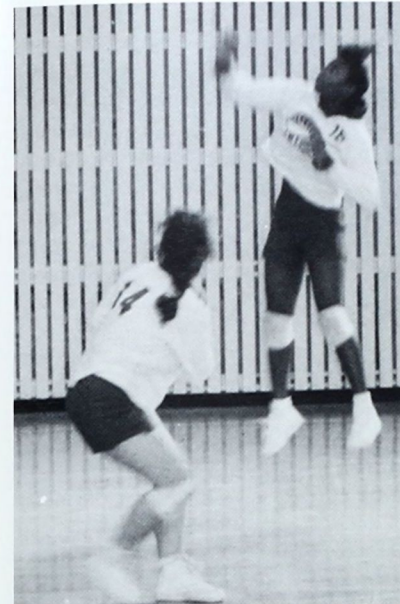

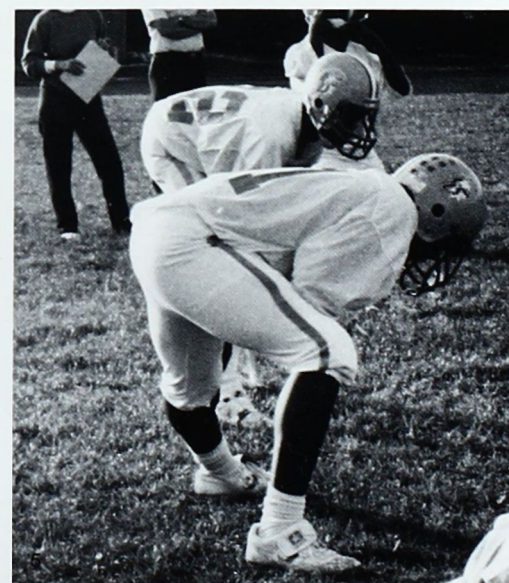

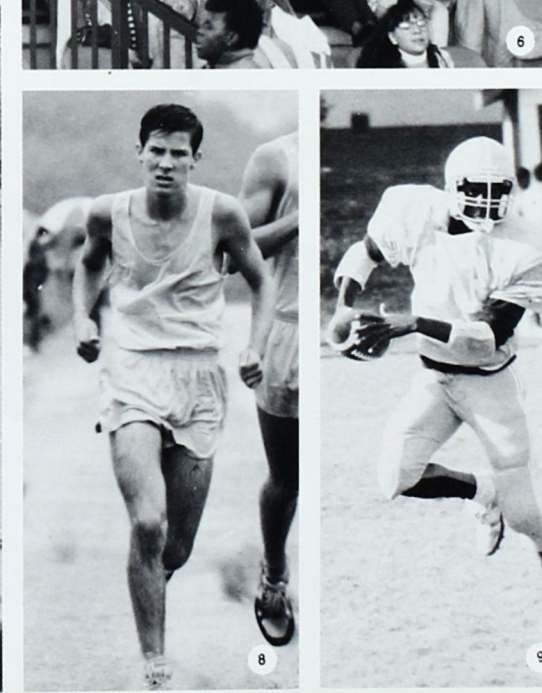
