1.0 Title VI Policy Statement¹

The Fort Wayne-Allen County Airport Authority (FWACAA) owns and operates Fort Wayne International (FWA) and Smith Field Airports. Both airports are in Allen County and serve the Northeast Indiana region including Fort Wayne, the second largest city in the state. The two airports encompass more than 3,500 acres of land.

FWACAA assures that no person shall on the grounds of race, color, national origin (including limited English proficiency (LEP)), sex (including sexual orientation and gender identity), creed, or age, as provided by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 (PL 100.259), Section 520 of the Airport and Airway Improvement Act of 1982, and related authorities (hereafter, "Title VI and related requirements"), be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity that receives U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) funding. Title VI also prohibits retaliation for asserting or otherwise participating in claims of discrimination.

FWACAA further assures every effort will be made to ensure nondiscrimination in all of its programs and activities, whether those programs are federally funded. The Airport Sponsor agrees, among other things, to understand the communities surrounding or in the flight path, as well as customers that use the airport.

FWACAA requires nondiscrimination assurances, as prescribed by FAA, from each tenant, contractor, and concessionaire providing an activity, service, or facility at the airport.

Assurances must be included in any related lease, contract, or franchise agreement between FWACAA and each tenant, contractor, and concessionaire, as well as in any similar agreements with their own sub-tenants and sub-contractors.

The Operations Manager, available at 260-446-3434 and <u>operationsspecialists@fwairport.com</u>, is responsible for overseeing the Airport Sponsor's compliance with Title VI and the point of contact for all airport Title VI matters and related responsibilities, including those required by 49 CFR Part 21.

3.0 Grant and Procurement Assurances

FWACAA will complete standard grant assurances for Title VI and related requirements, in the form prescribed by the FAA https://www.faa.gov/airports/aip/grant_assurances/#current-assurances.. FWACAA requires Civil Rights clauses to be included in solicitations and contracts for all subcontractors and subleases.

Clauses/Covenants

- a. All contracts, leases, deeds, licenses, permits, and other similar instruments, must contain the contractual requirements and clauses, in the form prescribed by FAA https://www.faa.gov/airports/aip/procurement/federal_contract_provisions/.
- b. FWACAA requires, Civil Rights clauses to be included in solicitations and contracts for all subcontractors, subleases, and any other agreements. The FAA Civil Rights provision template must be used in all subcontracts relating to the airport program. These subcontracts will be audited for not less than 10 percent of contractors each year.

Description of Oversight Methods for Subcontracts

Subcontract template must be used in all subcontracts related to the airport program. Subcontracts are audited by the Purchasing Manager to verify they include the template language, for not less than 10 percent of contractors each year.

4.0 Title VI Delegation of Authority and Responsibility

The Operations Manager serves as the FWACAA Title VI Coordinator. With the assistance of the Operations Department and Purchasing Manager, the Operations Manager is responsible for

all aspects of the Title VI Program and has been delegated sufficient authority and responsibility to effectively carry out the duties assigned to the position.

Staff Responsibilities

The FWACAA's Title VI Program falls within the scope of responsibilities of the Title VI Coordinator.

Title VI Coordinator

The Title VI Coordinator (Coordinator) works to ensure there is demonstrated commitment on the part of the Airport Authority to enforce Title VI and is responsible for the overall Title VI program implementation. Specifically, the Coordinator has the authority and responsibility to implement the civil rights program by:

- Ensuring the Title VI requirements are included in policy directives
- Assisting Airport Authority personnel to correct Title VI problems or discriminatory practices or policies found through self-monitoring and review activities.
- Being the point of contact for Title VI implementation and monitoring of programs and activities receiving federal financial assistance
- Reviewing documents as needed for compliance with Title VI to ensure that procedures used have safeguards to prevent discrimination.
- Conducting Title VI compliance reviews.
- Developing Title VI training material and conducting training sessions and workshops.
- Developing Title VI information for dissemination to the public and, where appropriate, in languages other than English.
- Coordinating the investigation of Title VI complaints of discrimination in accordance with the Airport Authority's External Compliant Processing Procedures.

The Coordinator has access to the Title VI portion of the FAA Civil Rights Connect System.

Title VI Liaisons

The Title VI Liaison (Liaison) is crucial in carrying out the activities of the Title VI program. The Purchasing Manager, Operations Supervisor, Customer Experience Supervisor, and Operations Specialists all serve as liaisons. The Coordinator along with the Liaisons are the ones who make up the Title VI team. FWACAA does not have any airport program sub-recipients.

5.0 Notice

FWACAA will conspicuously display the FAA-provided Unlawful Discrimination Poster in all public areas on airport property, including those with pedestrian activity. The Coordinator ensures that these posters are visible, accessible and maintained.

FWA has distributed this Title VI Plan among its employees and airport contractors, concessionaires, lessees, and tenants.

Low Income Communities

A low-income area is an identifiable group of persons living in geographic proximity, whose median household income is at or below the Department of Health and Human Services poverty guidelines. Pursuant to Executive Order 12898, "Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations," FWACAA is collecting information about affected and potentially affected low-income communities. According to *U.S. Census Report* <u>S1701: Poverty Status in the Past 12 Months</u>, the overall poverty level for the Fort Wayne-Allen County area is approximately 11.1%. Description of Interpretation Assistance Processes

• The Airport Operations Department maintains a list of multilingual employees, the languages they speak, and their associated office telephone numbers. The list indicates whether each employee is proficient to provide interpretation and/or translation services. The list is updated annually and provided to all tenant managers. Generally, these employee volunteers are available to assist members of the public with verbal real-time interpretation, during normal business hours.

9.0 Public Transportation

Staff from the Fort Wayne-Allen County Airport Authority contacted the General Manager of Citilink to discuss the viability of public transit routes to the Fort Wayne International Airport. Citilink advised that research has shown that current demand does not warrant extension of routes to our location from their current closest access point near Highway 1 and Airport Expressway. Additionally, routes do not operate to serve all available times that FWA would be open for operations.

The Authority and Citilink will monitor and review changing needs and/or demand for public transportation annually. Cab services and ride shares are available to the Fort Wayne International Airport throughout our hours of operation. The Airport Authority also has agreements for service with hotel shuttles.

10.0 Minority Businesses

Public notices for public hearings, the passage of ordinances, and the posting of bid/RFP documents are published in the legal notice section of the local papers, *The Journal Gazette* and *The Northwest News* in accordance with Indiana statutes. These publications are widely distributed throughout the city and county and available to all segments of the population.

Information relating to Board meetings and agenda items are posted on our website. Public notification of all bid and RFP solicitations are also posted on this site. Access to the site is available for free to anybody that has to the internet. Local libraries also provide free internet access to the public.

Specific efforts are made to target disadvantaged firms for larger construction projects and concession opportunities by notifying firms certified by INDOT as DBE/ACDBE's. Selections

are in compliance with Title VI, Part 21, and related requirements. Information on award process and documentation for specific bid decisions are kept with the Purchasing Manager.

11.0 Training

New employee orientation incorporates Title VI training. Topics include:

- Title VI and related laws prohibit discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin (including LEP), sex (including sexual orientation and gender identity), creed, or age
- Title VI complaints must be forwarded to the Coordinator
- Protections against retaliation for filing civil rights complaints or related actions
- Title VI notices must be displayed throughout the airport public facilities
- All contracts must include Title VI clauses
- Language interpretation and translation services
- Cultural and community relations sensitivity training
- Anti-harassment training

FWACAA trains Airport Authority employees and has a train the trainer program with tenants. Recurrent training is done every two years.

12.0 Compliance Reviews, Audits, Complaints, Lawsuits & Other Investigations

<u>FAA Notification</u>. The Coordinator will notify FAA of any pending investigations and reviews, including:

- Compliance reviews or audits concerning civil rights requirements
- Complaints, lawsuits, or other investigations alleging noncompliance with civil rights requirements

As discussed in the Title VI Complaints Section, Title VI complaints must be forwarded to FAA contacts within 15 days of receipt. For all other civil rights investigations, FWACAA must notify FAA contacts of any new investigations prior to grant execution.

At regular intervals, the Coordinator will provide FAA contacts with status updates for the investigations and reviews, until completed. For each existing investigation or review completed within 5 years of this plan, the Coordinator will also provide a statement about the outcome, unless previously provided.

13.0 Title VI Complaints

<u>Scope</u>. These procedures are for complaints of discrimination under Title VI and related laws (hereafter "Title VI Complaints." In order to be a Title VI Complaint, the complaint must:

- 1. Allege discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin (including LEP), sex (including sexual orientation and gender identity), creed, or age or violations administrative requirements under Title VI or related laws.
- 2. Not only be for employment matters
- **3.** Allege misconduct by the FWACAA, including airport employees, contractors, concessionaires, lessees, or tenants.
- **4.** Concern an airport facility or actions by the FWACAA including airport employees, contractors, concessionaires, lessees, or tenants.

<u>Rights</u>. Any person who believes that he or she has been subjected to discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin (including LEP), sex (including sexual orientation and gender identity), creed, or age has the right to file a complaint with the FWACAA. Alternatively, they can file a formal complaint with an outside agency, such as the U.S. Departments of Justice or Transportation, or the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), or seek other legal remedies.

<u>Receipt of Complaint</u>. The Coordinator will log in the complaint and promptly send copies of the complaint to the Executive Director, Director of Operations & Facilities and the Director of Administration & Finance.

Complaints must be filed within 180 days of the discriminatory event, must be in writing, and must be delivered to:

If a complaint is initially made by phone, it must be supplemented with a written complaint before 180 days after the discriminatory event has passed. If a verbal complaint is received, the complainant should be given a copy of the Airport Discrimination Complaint Procedures and instructed to submit a written complaint. Accommodation will be provided upon request to individuals unable to file a written complaint due to a disability.

<u>Initial Procedure.</u> The Coordinator may meet with the complainant to clarify the issues, obtain additional information, and determine if informal resolution might be possible in lieu of an investigation. If successfully resolved, the Coordinator will issue a closure letter to the complainant, record the disposition in the complaints log, and report the resolution to FAA.

Discrimination Complaint Referral Procedure

<u>Internal Complaint Referral</u>. All Title VI complaints must be promptly forwarded to the Coordinator within 3 days.

<u>Initial FAA Notification</u>. A copy of each Title VI complaint will be forwarded to the FAA within 15 days of initial receipt. The Coordinator will forward a copy of the complaint and a statement describing all actions taken to resolve the matter, and the results thereof. (Note: complaints based on disability do not have to be forwarded to FAA.) To transmit complaint information to the FAA, the Coordinator will upload the data to the FAA Civil Rights staff through the FAA Civil Rights Connect System. The Coordinator will also seek technical assistance from FAA, as needed, throughout complaint intake, investigation and resolution process.

Investigation Procedure

<u>Assignment of Investigator</u>. The Coordinator will immediately begin the investigation or designate an investigator.

<u>Cooperation with FAA</u>. The Coordinator will promptly investigate all Title VI complaints, including those referred by the FAA for investigation. If the FAA is investigating a complaint against FWACAA, the Coordinator will avoid interfering with the FAA investigation, cooperate with the FAA when needed, and share factual information with the FAA.

<u>Prompt Investigation</u>. The Coordinator will make every effort to complete discrimination

complaint investigations within 60 calendar days after the complaint is received. Some investigations may take longer with a justification for the delay and assurance that the investigation is being completed as quickly as possible.

<u>Contact with Complainant.</u> The Coordinator will meet with the complainant to clarify the issues and obtain additional information, and also speak with community members and potential witnesses, as appropriate.

<u>Investigation Report</u>. After completing the investigation, the Coordinator will prepare a written report.

<u>Consultation with Legal Counsel</u>. In each case, the Coordinator will consult with Legal Counsel regarding the investigation and the report. Airport Legal Counsel will ensure that the report is consistent with the DOT and FAA Title VI nondiscrimination requirements.

<u>Prompt Resolution of Disputes</u>. The Coordinator will emphasize voluntary compliance and quickly and fairly resolve disputes with complainants, or with contractors, tenants, or other persons, through alternative dispute resolution.

<u>Forwarding Report and Response to Complainant</u>. At the completion of the investigation, the complainant and respondent will receive a letter of findings and determination of the investigation and any applicable resolution. The letter transmitting the findings and any applicable resolution will state FWACAA's conclusion regarding whether unlawful discrimination occurred, and will describe the complainant's appeal rights. A summary of the investigation report, any appeal, or follow-up actions will be sent to the FAA via the FAA Civil Rights Connect System.

<u>Appeal Rights.</u> The complainant must be notified of their right to appeal the findings or determinations, and of the procedures and requirements for an appeal:

- The complainant may appeal in writing to the Executive Director of Airports.
- The written appeal must be received within 10 business days after receipt of the written decision.
- The written appeal must contain all arguments, evidence, and documents supporting the basis for the appeal.
- The Executive Director will issue a final written decision in response to the appeal.

<u>Avoiding Future Discrimination</u>. In addition to taking action with respect to any specific instances of discrimination, the FWACAA will identify and implement measures to reduce the chances of similar discrimination in the future.

<u>Intimidation and Retaliation Prohibited</u>. FWACAA employees, contractors, and tenants will not intimidate or retaliate against a person who has filed a complaint alleging discrimination.
