

Home modification is defined as "alterations made to a consumer's residence that enhances functional independence and safety." These alterations can be as simple as removing throw rugs or rearranging furniture to make a clear path. They may also range from "low tech" modifications such as adding grab bars to "high tech" structural modifications such as building a ramp or possibly a roll-in shower. Grab bars as well as other adaptive equipment can make it safer for us to perform daily self-care activities. But, sometimes adaptive equipment alone will not meet the needs and it may be necessary to make structural adaptations to a home. A doorway may need to be widened in order to access a bathroom that could become accessible with adaptive equipment or it may require a totally redesigned area to allow enough space to be functional and safe. Any modifications that are done will also need to take into consideration future needs when the disease process is such that a progressive loss of function, independence or safety is expected.

The general public does not have the experience, knowledge or skills required to make these potentially expensive decisions. Turnstone therapists have worked with thousands of persons with disabilities and their families.
