Julianna makes giant leaps forward at Turnstone Turnstone

Achieving your potential starts with a belief in yourself. When others say you can't accomplish something, you can either agree—or strive to prove them wrong. Turnstone client Julianna Rangel-Escobedo has taken the latter approach, serving as a reminder that limitations are no match for conviction.

Several physicians had told her mother, Rosario Escobedo, that Julianna would never walk—and for a time, it seemed they were right. Born with multiple disabilities, Julianna used a wheelchair exclusively until she was three and a half years old.

During this same time, Julianna also struggled with therapy. Prior to finding Turnstone, her mom says Julianna was unhappy every time she attended a session.

"She seemed fearful," Rosario says. "She couldn't talk at the time, but she would hug me hard because she didn't want me to drop her off for therapy. I knew I had to look for something different."

Things changed for Julianna, however, when she began attending special education Pre-K at Holland Elementary. That's where the Escobedos met therapist Roxy Rockwell, who also worked at Turnstone. Julianna and Roxy hit it off immediately. For the first time, Julianna stopped crying when her mother brought her to therapy. After Roxy gained their trust, the Escobedos asked her for advice and Turnstone was recommended to supplement Julianna's school-based care.

When they visited Turnstone, the Escobedos were introduced to Angela Williams, a pediatric social worker. Julianna receives physical, occupational, and speech therapies. The results, Rosario says, were almost immediate.





"I noticed a radical change in Julianna," she says. "It was different. She started talking."

That was just the beginning, however. Working with Williams and Turnstone therapists Casey Harper, Megan Russ, and Nancy Shepler, Julianna improved significantly in other areas as well—including something once not thought possible.

"My biggest satisfaction was to see her walk," Rosario says. "At Turnstone, she started using a walker. Later they encouraged her to go without it. I was there and recorded the first time she walked without any help."

Emboldened, Julianna kept progressing. Approximately a year ago, she stopped using her wheelchair altogether. And soon, she plans to start swimming. It's been a long journey for the Escobedo family, but Julianna—now five and a half years old—has led them to places they never thought they'd go. Along the way, Turnstone has been at Julianna's side, encouraging her to take steps she—literally—was told she might never take.

"I noticed a radical change in Julianna. It was different. She started talking."

"What I appreciate the most is the kindness, professionalism, and competence of the therapists," Rosario says. "Turnstone is very special for us."

TURNSTONE SPEECH CAMP

AAC COMMUNICATION CAMP
