

PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATIONS INTO THE TINGLEY FAMILY HISTORY  
APPEAR AS FOLLOWS:

TH TINGLEY

SAMUEL TINGLEY (SENIOR) PRESUMABLY BORN (1811) IN SOUTHWELL  
NOTTINGHAMSHIRE  
PARISH, LINCOLNSHIRE NEAR WESTHORPE ENGLAND, MARRIED SARAH HOB-  
BOUND AT SOUTHWELL IN 1832. HE HAD BEEN AN APPRENTICE AT  
NEWARK (NEWARK-ON-TRENT OR HOLME-BY-NEWARK) NOTTINGHAMSHIRE  
SINCE 1824. SAMUEL, HIS WIFE AND HIS BROTHER WILLIAM TINGLEY EMI-  
GRATED TO THE U.S. IN 1833. PRESUMABLY IT APPEARS, TO THE  
EVEN THEN HIGHLY INDUSTRIALIZED CITY OF CINCINNATI OHIO. THEIR  
ARRIVAL AT CINCINNATI APPEARS TO ANSWER AN UNKNOWN QUES-  
TION IN THE TINGLEY FAMILY HISTORY. THERE THEN EXISTED A STRAIN  
OF TINGLEY'S REACHING FROM CINCINNATI - COVINGTON KENTUCKY, DOWN  
THE OHIO RIVER, INCLUDING SOUTHERN INDIANA, UP THE WABASH  
RIVER IN SOUTHERN ILLINOIS (CLARK COUNTY) AND RELATED FAMILY  
IN (UNION CO. ILLINOIS) ON THE EAST BANK OF THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER  
1840's, 50's & 1860's. THESE THEN MAY BE THE DESCENDANTS OF ONE  
MAULEVERER TINGLEY, JOSEPH, BENJAMIN ETC. ALSO OF SOUTHWELL, ENG.

IN ANY EVENT SAMUEL TINGLEY WAS LOCATED IN CLARK COUNTY,  
ILLINOIS IN THE 1850 U.S. CENSUS IN THE VICINITY OF THE FAMILIES  
OF ISAAC, BENJAMIN AND JOHN TINGLEY. SAMUEL TINGLEY AT THIS TIME  
WAS SHOWN TO HAVE 4 SONS AND 4 DAUGHTERS. SHORTLY AFTER  
THE INITIAL CONSTRUCTION OF THE ROCK ISLAND RAILROAD RUN-  
NING SOUTH OUT OF CHICAGO, SAMUEL (SR.) AND FAMILY TURN  
UP IN NEW BREMEN (TINGLEY PARK) AS STATION MASTER. SAMUEL  
(JUNIOR) THEN BECAME ASST. AGENT AND EDWARD ALSO WAS  
INVOLVED IN SOME CAPACITY.

FOLLOWING WITH THE OBVIOUS MISTAKES DELETED. EDWARD  
TINLEY WAS A WELL-KNOWN BUSINESS MAN FOR NEARLY 50

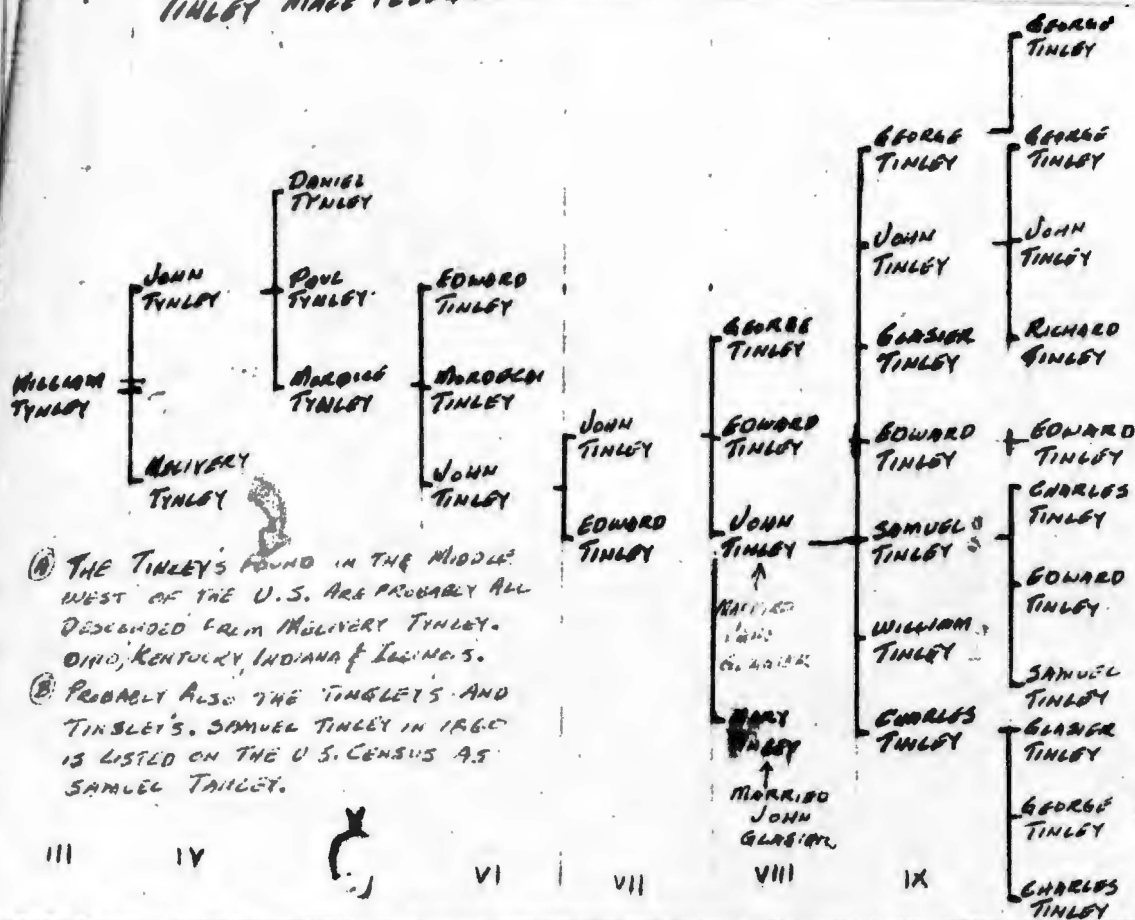
YEARS. "IN 1854, HE ENTERED THE EMPLOY OF THE RAILROAD  
(CHICAGO, ROCK ISLAND AND PACIFIC RAILROAD) AS ASSISTANT TO HIS  
FATHER (SAMUEL SR.) AT THE STATION (TINLEY PARK, THE NOW BROWN  
JUNCTION)." "IN 1856, HE CAME TO DEPU (BUREAU CO., ILL.) AS  
STATION AGENT. NOTE:- HE WAS KNOWN TO HAVE BEEN STATION  
AGENT AT MINOOKA, GRUNDY CO., ILLINOIS, BUT, PERHAPS UNDER HIS  
OLDER BROTHER SAMUEL (JUNIOR). HIS WIFE WAS DORCAS KITTEL OF  
MENDOTA (LA SALLE CO., ILLINOIS) THEY HAD NO CHILDREN, BUT, RAISED  
SEVERAL NIECES, AND NEPHEWS. HOWEVER IN THE FAMILY HISTORY  
TITLED "TWIXT TRENT AND WITHAM" PAGE 6, 1ST. PARAGRAPH EDWARD  
VISITED ENGLAND IN 1879 AND INDICATED HE HAD "TWO GRAND-DAU-  
GHTERS, BUT, NO GRANDSONS." HIS DUTIES AT THE RAILROAD DID  
NOT ENGAGE HIS ENTIRE TIME, AND HE BOUGHT AND SHIPPED  
GRAIN AND WAS IN PARTNERSHIP WITH JACOB BERNHARDT AND J. H.  
HASSLER. NOTE:- EDWARD HAD SEVERAL UNCLES IN SOUTHWELL  
ENGLAND IN A VERY SIMILAR BUSINESS. "DUE TO POOR HEALTH,  
HE SOLD HIS BUSINESS INTERESTS IN DEPU IN 1895." "MR. & MRS.  
TINLEY TRAVELED EXTENSIVELY IN EUROPE FROM 1876 ON. "HE  
RETURNED TO CHICAGO IN 1898, AFTER AN EXTENDED TRIP IN  
CANADA, AND LIVED AT THE PLAZA HOTEL IN CHICAGO WHERE HE  
PASSED AWAY IN 1903." NOTE:- THERE WERE TINLEY RELATIVES  
KNOWN TO BE LIVING IN EDMONTON CANADA AT SOME PERIOD.  
"HE WAS CREMATED ACCORDING TO HIS WISHES AND THE ASHES  
WERE CONVEYED TO PRINCETON (BUREAU CO., ILLINOIS) HE SERVED  
THE TOWN BOARD IN MANY CAPACITIES AND WAS ACTIVE IN THE  
CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH, BEING CHURCH DIRECTOR FOR MANY YEARS."

AN EXCERPT FROM A TINLEY PARK VILLAGE 125TH ANNIVERSARY BOOKLET, PAGE 20 READS IN PART. "THE TOWN DECIDED UPON THE NAME OF TINLEY PARK IN HONOR OF THREE BROTHERS NAMED TINLEY THAT HAD BEEN BUILDERS OF THE ROCK ISLAND FOR THIS AREA. AFTER THE COMPLETION OF THE RAILROAD THROUGH TINLEY PARK, THE THREE TINLEY BROTHERS NAMED SAM, CHARLES AND EDWARD ARRIVED. SAM WAS THE FIRST STATION AGENT IN NEW BREMEN (IT WAS HIS FATHER!); HIS BROTHER CHARLES WAS CONDUCTOR ON THE OLD PERU ACCOMMODATION (PERU & SAGLE CO.); THE THIRD BROTHER, EDWARD WAS STATION AGENT AT MINOOKA FOR MANY YEARS (TINLEY PARK, MINOOKA & DEPU)."

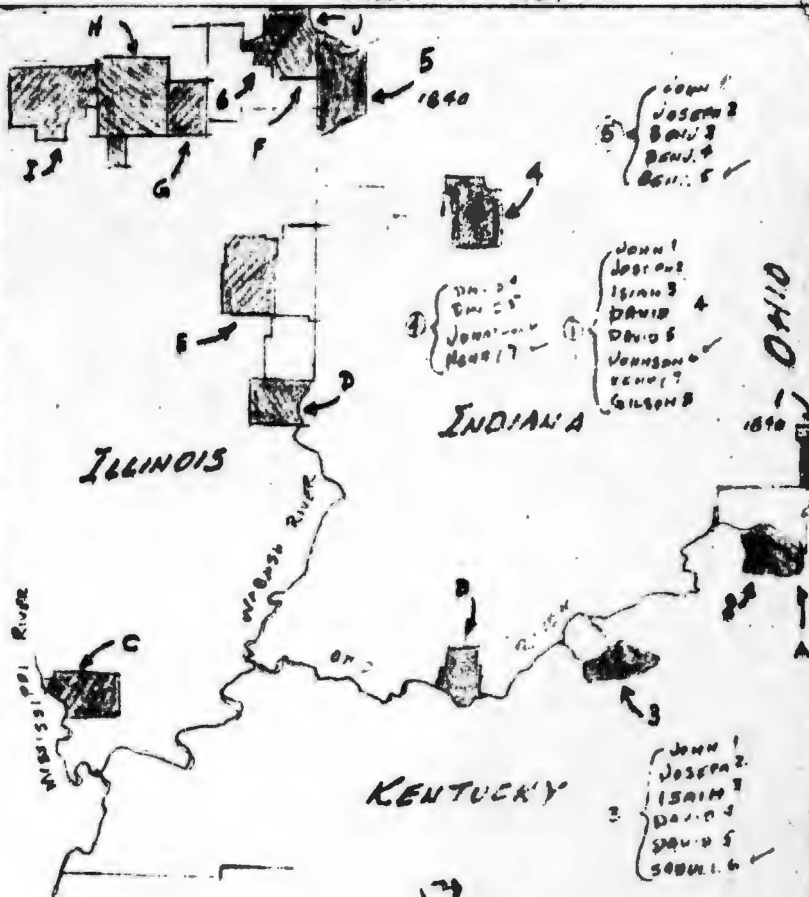
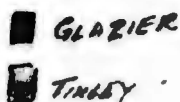
ALL OF THE TINLEYS PREVIOUSLY MENTIONED ARE SHOWN IN THE 1840 U.S. CENSUS. HOWEVER JACOB, JOHN AND ISAAC TINLEY OF CLARK COUNTY ILLINOIS SHOW UP AS TINGLEY IN 1850, WHILE THE SEVERAL GENERATIONS OF UNION COUNTY, ILLINOIS REMAINED TINLEY AS DID SAMUEL TINLEY SR. AND HIS SONS. NOTE:- SAMUEL TINLEY SR. OF NEW BREMEN, COOK CO., ILL. SHOWS UP IN THE 1860 U.S. CENSUS AS SAMUEL TANLEY.

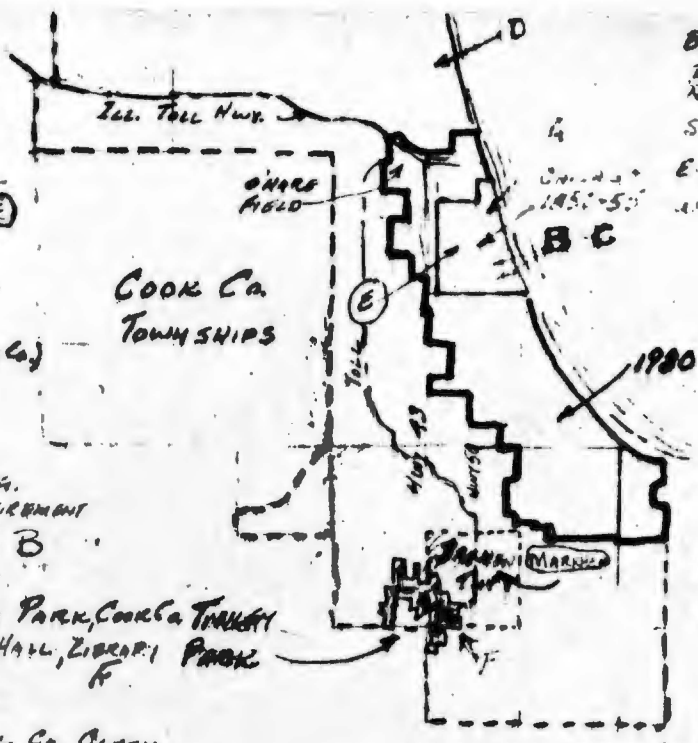

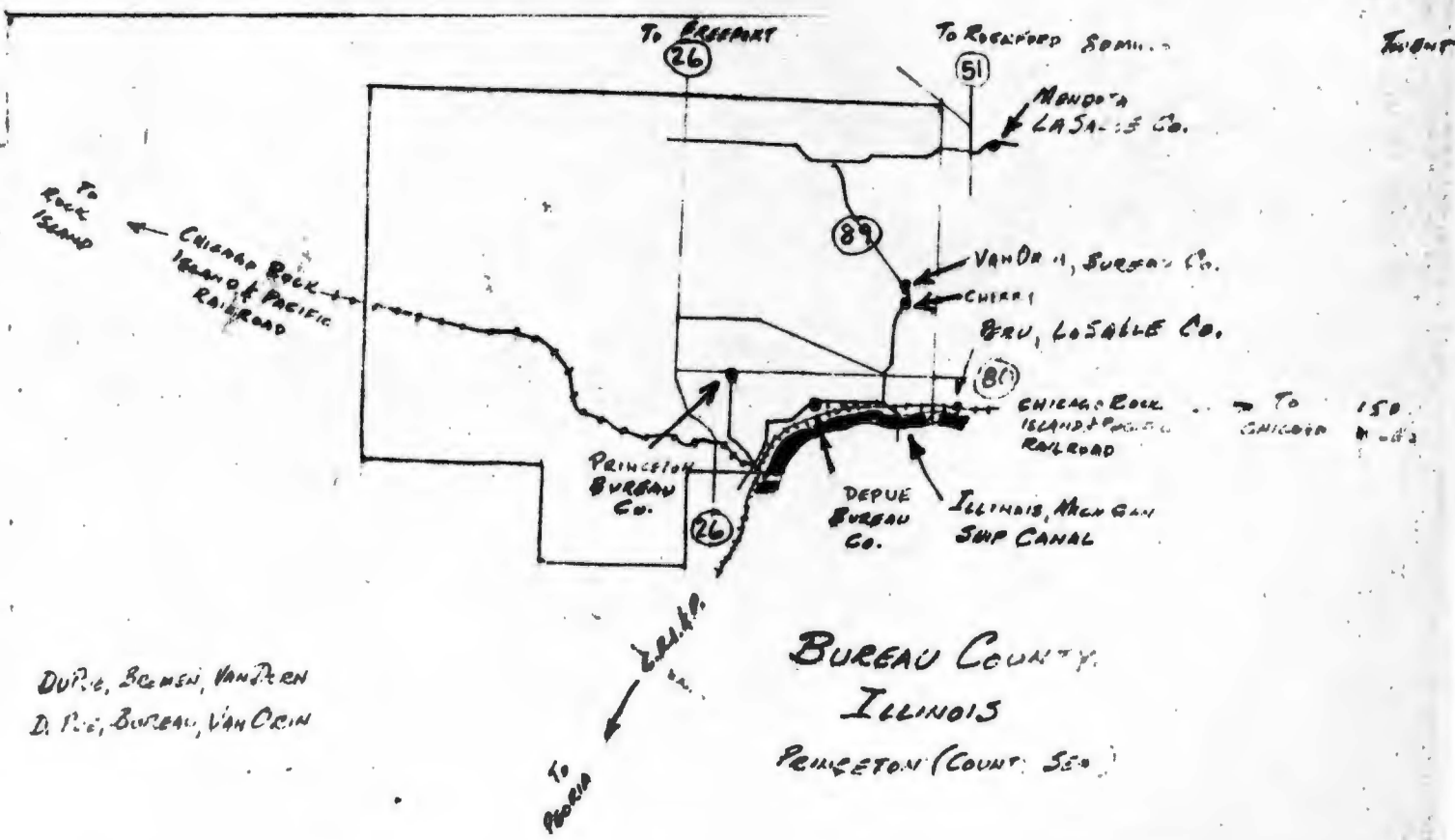

PICTURE # TWO GLASIER TINLEY WAS THE 5th CHILD OF JOHN AND JANE TINLEY, NEVER MARRIED AS WITH SISTER BETSY. ALSO BROTHER TO SAMUEL.

PICTURE # THREE CHARLES TINLEY (YOUNGEST SON) 12th CHILD OF JOHN AND JANE TINLEY HAD HIS ARM AMPUTATED BY DR. GEORGE GLASIER ONE TIME MAYOR OF LINCOLN. (I BELIEVE HIS FIRST COUSIN).

PICTURE # 4 THE JANE SMITH, I AM UNABLE TO IDENTIFY, BUT, THE LITTLE BOY SHOWN AS CHARLES IS THE FATHER OF RUTH TINLEY (TINLEY FAMILY HISTORIAN)

PICTURE # 5 JOHN TINLEY IV, (2ND SON) OR 3RD CHILD OF JOHN AND JANE TINLEY, LIVED AND WORKED IN LONDON 1823-33 BUT, RETURNED TO MOREY AT SOUTHWELL.
