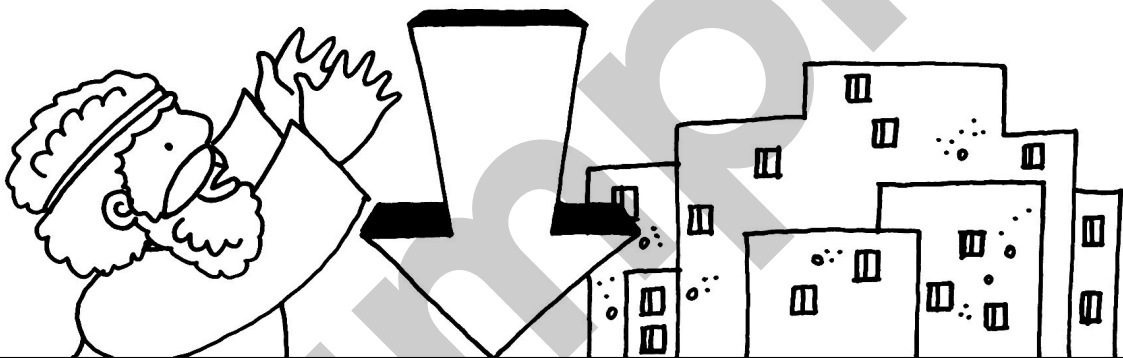




July 24, 2022 Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

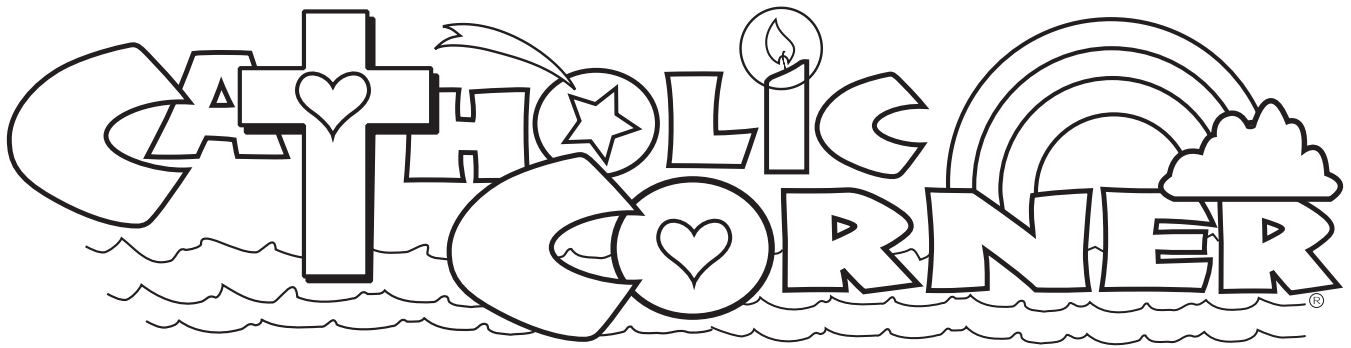

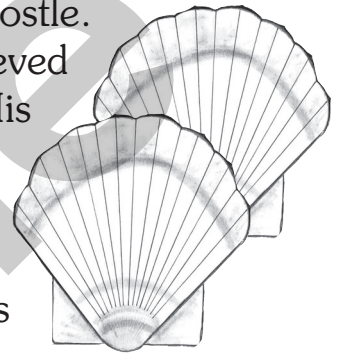

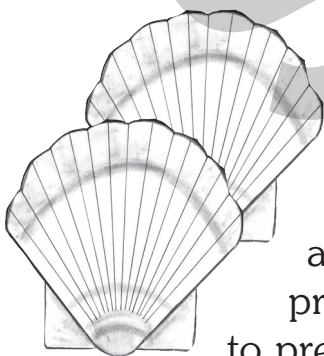
SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA

Tomorrow, July 25, is the feast of St. James the Apostle. James was killed by Herod Agrippa in 44 A.D. It is believed that he was the first of Jesus' apostles to be martyred. His death is recorded in Acts 12:2 in the Bible.

St. James is the patron saint of Spain, where he is known as Santiago. (*Santo* is the Spanish word for "saint" and *Iago* is the old Spanish name for "James.") Centuries ago, the people of Spain erected a shrine to this apostle.



You can search the internet for images of the beautiful cathedral of Santiago de Compostela. Since the ninth century, thousands of people have made a pilgrimage to this site. (A pilgrimage is a journey to a special place, often for religious reasons.) There are many different routes to Compostela in Europe, some of them more than five hundred miles long. They are called the *Camino de Santiago* (a *camino* is a path). You can identify the pilgrims on these routes by the symbol of the shell they wear on their clothing. The shell is a reminder that James was a fisherman. Also, James baptized people with water and perhaps used a large shell.



You probably cannot walk the *Camino* tomorrow, but you can set out a route in your neighborhood that ends up at your parish church or a neighboring one. With an adult in your family, decide on the length of your "pilgrimage." Try to walk in silence and notice all the beauty of nature along the way. When you arrive at your destination, say a prayer thanking God for all the people who give their lives to preaching about Jesus and for all those who journey on long and difficult paths.



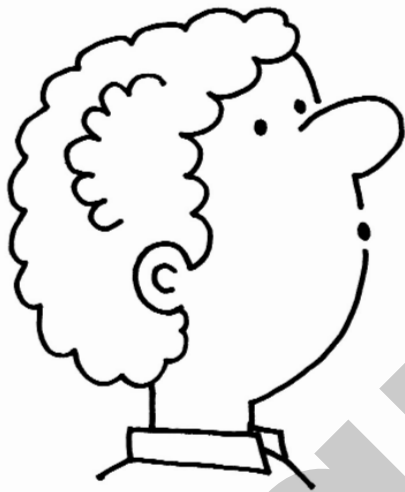
Jesus reminded us that earthly fathers
