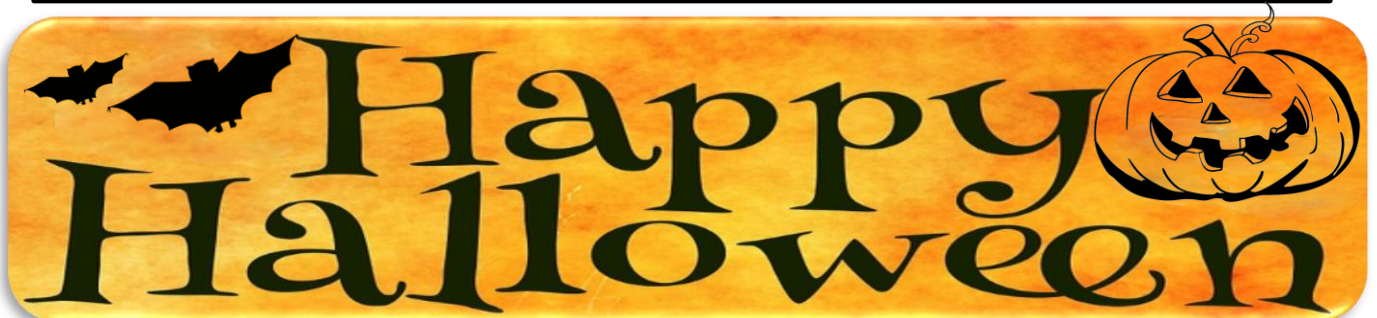

FIRE DEPARTMENT MESSAGE

Many have called about the open burn and it will be going through 30 October 2021. Burn permits can be obtained online. As everyone is aware we have had an extreme amount of smoke from out of state fires making our air quality very bad. Although open burn permits will be allowed, there are projected to be an extraordinary number of days that burning will not be allowed due to our state air quality. It is advised if you have the ability to take your green waste to the Payson dump. Yard debris is free if you have it covered. Everyone is encouraged do to not contribute to the already bad air. Air quality can be checked by calling the Utah County Burn line. Air quality can also be checked at www.air.Utah.gov with a search for open burn permits. This site gives a three day estimate and can be used for weekend planning. Note that this is not where burn permits are given but the county closely monitors air quality here. Please make sure that there is an adult attending any fires you may have and keep a hose ready and charged while you are burning. We have had some fires spread from wind that were not being watched closely.

The fire department, along with our EMS section is opening up opportunities for our citizens and families to have us come to your home and do emergency medical and fire training with your family. This can be a great pre-emergency planning event and will help work issues out of an emergency plan you may have already put in place. Contact the Fire Chief to set up your event at Firechief@elkridgecity.org. We typically will do these on our training night of Wednesday and will incorporate our training into your situation.

Here are a couple of reminders. Please slow down and watch for our kids waiting at bus stops and walking to and from those from home. They may not always be watching the traffic. Now is a great time to check smoke alarms. We've had several calls lately where batteries just need to be changed. Your alarms may be next to go off and it's always in the middle of the night. Now that hunting season here, be safe out on the ATV or UTV. Know your equipment and wear safety gear. Be safe also with loaded weapons and be aware of the hunting restrictions and safety measures.

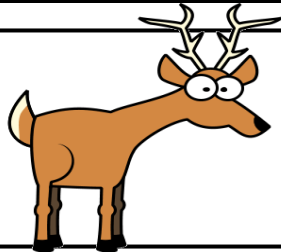

DO NOT PARK ON THE ROAD

The city code regarding snow removal is as follows
Parking Prohibited For Snow Removal: In order to facilitate efficient and safe removal of snow from city streets, it is unlawful for the owner or driver of any motorized or non-motorized vehicle, trailer, boat, or other transportation device, to be parked during snow removal activities between November 1 and March 1. Any vehicle that is parked in violation of this section may, without prior notice, be removed immediately at the owner's expense. (Ord. 17-1, 1-10-2017)
