PUBLIC HEARING-SMART PROPERTY ANNEXATION

Mayor Ellis opened the public hearing

Annette Brigham- stated she lives just below Elk Ridge, across from the Smart Property. She has always lived rural and she is not happy with the annexation. She is concerned about the increase in traffic and whether the county has been contacted about the protected agriculture area.

George Woodruff- stated that he is also a neighbor of Elk Ridge across from the Smart property. He is concerned about his property value with commercial property across from him.

<u>Terry Martins</u>- stated that he is concerned with low income-moderate income housing going in to this area and what it will do to property value. Also he is concerned about the commercial code being updated before commercial is brought in. Concerned with dark skies and annexing in property without knowing exactly the zoning and what it will bring in to the area.

Leslie King- stated that he is in agreement with all that was said so far and concerned with lighting and property values, particularly if low income is brought in. What if commercial comes in and ends up as empty buildings; that is the first thing that you see when coming into Elk Ridge. Also concerned about the traffic flow especially problems at the corner of Sky Hawk and Elk Ridge Dr., and does not want a road that brings the traffic from the annexation area up to Sky Hawk.

<u>Barbara Kennedy</u> would like a stop sign put up at Sky Hawk and Elk Ridge Dr. going down the hill and the city needs a stop sign at the bottom of Elk Ridge Dr.

CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION AGENDA ITEMS:

1. SMART ANNEXATION ZONING DISCUSSION

Royce Swensen stated that Planning Commission discussed the annexation zoning and they would prefer to stick with the general plan but they do not have a problem with the 12,000 sq. ft. lots. Jim Chase asked if the city does 12.000 sq. ft. lots would that actually meet the requirements for moderate income housing or is it still going to be out of reach of mod income. Mayor Ellis stated that he didn't think it would but perhaps changing the minimum sq. ft. of homes might help. Nelson Abbott stated that it didn't make any sense to make a change to the zoning if it didn't qualify for moderate income housing. The commercial code needs to be updated before the

 city brings in any property. Cory Thompson agrees with Nelson that the council should stop right now and get the commercial code in place first. Jason Rickards of Smart Annexation stated that he saw the draft of the commercial code and there isn't anything in it that he doesn't agree with, also the lots have a better lay out as 12,000 instead of 15,000. Royce Swensen stated that the Planning Commission held the public hearing on the commercial code last week, the ordinance is close to being finished. The lots next to the annexation are 10,000 sq. ft. Jared Peterson stated that Elk Ridge also has an agreement with Payson for up to a certain amount of sewer connections. Discussion ensued on the commercial code and the residential lot size. Mayor Ellis stated that it is very important to understand what moderate income housing is and what the city actually needs to do in order to meet the requirements and what the ramifications are if the city can't meet the requirements.

2. PROPOSED RESOLUTION, 2ND AMENDMENT SANCTUARY CITY

Nelson Abbott drafted the ordinance into a resolution as requested the last council meeting. He stated that there is great interest at the county level in support of the ordinance. There are many counties that are in the process of doing something in support of this ordinance. Cory Thompson stated the resolution was much better and did not open the city to litigation as the original ordinance might have. Mayor Ellis stated that Uintah County passed an ordinance that looked very good and is hopeful that the county will step up and lead in this matter.

3. CAPITAL PROJECTS: SEWER AND BUDGET AMENDMENT

David Jean Public Works Director - stated that this is for the sewer from Ocampo to Bridger and Ocampo to Park. 100% of this will be paid for by impact fees. The cost is approx. \$130,000. This is the last project that is in the Capital Improvements Plan. The Capital Improvements plan has a sewer replacement from Hudson to Ama Fille which doesn't make sense due to the tie in on Ama Fille being higher. The city would have to pump the sewer uphill. So they are going a different route with the sewer to get to the same place. In addition the Rapid Assessment Tool (RAT) is a system that is accepted by the state to test all the sewer lines by sound. It would take approximately 2 months to test the whole city. The city is supposed to inspect the sewers every 5 years but the state will accept this test if it's done every year. The cost is \$15,000 for a 3 months lease. The company originally wanted \$21,000 for 6 months but the city doesn't need it for this amount of time so they did work with us in getting the cost at \$15,000 for 3 months and another city will use the other 3 months. The RAT system is pricey but the cost return is great. This has to be done by June 1.

4. FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION ORDINANCE

Mayor Ellis stated that this needs to be moved to public hearing. Royce Swensen stated that FEMA is changing the mapping and wants the city to renew or increase the ordinance. If the city is part of the new mapping then there is a more restrictive ordinance. If nothing has changed for the city then the current ordinance that is in place will suffice. Nelson Abbott stated that he did not see any changes for Elk Ridge and that he is very concerned in enacting the more restrictive ordinance because once it is zoned differently, then that greatly impacts the landowners.

3. PARKSIDE COVE LOTS 9 AND 10 EXCEPTION

Mayor Ellis stated that it was discovered that on Phase 2 there is a water line which goes up the hill (which was put in years ago) on the edge of the easement which is just a 2 ½ feet away from the foundation of the home. One of the exceptions is the setback between the homes in order to move one home away from the water line. David Jean stated the only other issue would be a fire issue, from radiant heat. He spoke with the fire chief and they agreed the water undermining a home —a collapsed home would not be able to be saved whereas fire is more likely to be mitigated. The development can legally build up to the easement, the city is asking them to consider moving the home, but the Developer doesn't have to.

4. FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION ORDINANCE

<u>Mayor Ellis</u> stated that this is the same ordinance the city approved after the fire. The ordinance currently in place expires in June. The mapping was just completed and there were no changes to Elk Ridge City so there is no need to implement a stricter ordinance. Discussion ensued on when this ordinance would expire- there is no date on the ordinance.

5. FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TORTE CLAIM

Mayor Ellis stated that he and Royce met with some gentlemen who presented how the city could bring a torte claim against the USDA which is the parent organization over the Department of Natural Resources. You file a claim and typically the fed government will chose to settle, if there is a case. Their fee would be \$5000 upfront to initiate the claim along with a \$2000 fee to do the GIS surveys they would need for all the mapping they would need for the area and upon settlement they would receive 3%. Cory Thompson stated that the city needs to see if they would take it on a contingent basis where

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they only receive monies if the city prevails. Discussion ensued on whether the city should sue to offset mitigation costs.

URBAN WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT STUDY

Jared Peterson spoke with the deer management folk. This group is the only group authorized in the state to do deer control in a city. They submit a plan to the state which has to be approved. To help formulate the plan there has to be a count of the deer. They set up 20-30 cameras and drones and plat deer paths over a month in order not double triple count the deer. The cost for them to count the deer would be \$2,000 to \$3000 cost. There are public hearings etc. so in order to start in the fall the budget would have to be approved in this years' budget. The deer in city is 1200% higher than pre Elk Ridge development and they are not healthy. There would have to be an actual count to see how high the figure really is. It is done with bows and the community isn't even aware it is happening. Discussion ensued on whether the residents want this. There needs to be a count before the city even considers doing this.

7. AWARD OAK LANE BOOSTER STATION BID

Mayor Ellis stated that there were 8 bids received. RB has the low bid by quite a bit which was about \$200,000. David Jean stated that he has talked with RB and RB stands behind their bid. RB has done good work in the past and does not have any concerns with them. David has gone through the bid and is ok with the items on their estimate that they are low. Cory Thompson stated that he is concerned that the lowest bid is too low. Mayor Ellis stated that the bid does not include SESD of \$116,000 for installation and impact fees, is not included, \$80,500 of that is impact fees. Nelson Abbott will talk to SESD about the impact fees. Royce Swensen stated the contract with Aqua to engineer the booster station is \$62,500. The bid on the SCADA is approximately \$34,000, which is in addition to the booster. The cost of the Booster is approximately \$740,000 before any discounts that the city may get. David Jean stated that this is a brand new booster station which serves 2 purposes: In the event something would ever happen to the Loafer Canyon well this will move water from the Hillside tank to the top tank and pressurize the zones that the top tank services in the event something happens to the top tank. This will also take care of fire flow even if the city cannot get water from the top tank. Mayor Ellis stated that this resolves any single point of failure for a pump. Electricity outages would require the city to purchase a generator. Jared Peterson asked if this can be done over 2 years, will it go into next year's budget, where are we on the funds for this? Royce Swensen stated that the bids came in higher than was estimated by Aqua, which had been had budgeted for \$580,000. Mayor Ellis stated that this will carry over to next year. Jared also asked David of the submitted bids what would his selection be

and what was the bid. David stated that RB Construction and he is happy to work with them. The next choice for him would have been probably the next bid which was Nelson.

8. NONCONFORMING LOTS

Royce Swensen there are 2 lots up on Canyon View as well as some other lots in and around the city that do not meet the requirements to be a buildable lot. This issue has been discussed several times. The lots on Canyon View do not have the 120 feet of frontage required for that zone. Mayor Ellis asked if the council is willing to rezone some of these lots in order for the landowners to build. Nelson Abbott stated that the code stated that within 80 % of the frontage requirements and they can fit a house on a lot, with all the required setbacks etc. then they could build on the lots. The lots on Canyon View are within 500 feet of half dozen lots that are narrow or as narrow as the 2 lots in question. Those lots were allowed to be built. Discussion ensued and it was determined that was for setbacks only. Cory Thompson is concerned that the lots are too narrow and will not fit a home. Royce Swensen stated that these lots have 105 frontage, which do not meet the frontage code. Nelson Abbott stated that according to the county these lots were illegally split in 1982. Discussion ensued on the split, the size and zoning and they are the same size as the lots around them. Nelson Abbott and Jared Peterson stated that the 2 lots are actually bigger than the lots around them. Jared Peterson did calculations on the properties and stated that they are indeed bigger than even the lots right next to the lots. Mayor Ellis stated that this needs to be sent to planning commission for their recommendation. The landowners have to go through the subdivision process in order to be able to grant an exception. The council is sending this matter to Planning Commission.

9. GOLF COURSE ORDINANCE 20-06

Jim Chase stated that the governor has signed the law so that the city can now approve it as an ordinance if they wish. The one section that needs discussion is if there are any roads that the city wants to exclude residents from driving golf carts. Discussion ensued on the speed limit and the speed of a golf cart and safety issues such as Elk Ridge Drive north to 11200 has higher speed limit and alternative routes.

10. CITY FEE SCHEDULE RESOLUTION 20-04-14-3R

Mayor Ellis stated the city spends roughly \$7,000 a year to mail out approximately 500 billing statements and the newsletter. Woodland Hills, for example, charges a \$2.00 fee for mailing statements. There is a merchant charge to the city to use Xpress Bill Pay so even if everyone would switch to Xpress bill pay there would still be about the same amount of cost to the city. The city could stop sending out the newsletter which would save about \$2000 a year. The newsletter would be

available on the city website. The city could charge \$.75 if a resident really wanted to have a paper copy. Does the council want to charge for sending out statements, the Mayor's recommendation is \$1.00. Royce stated that there is a merchant fee for debit cards but it is not as high as a credit card. Xpress Bill Pay costs the city \$9,000 a year. Nelson Abbott stated that there may be a time when the city needs to go paperless but there are residents that need to have a paper copy and recommends not sending the newsletter and noting the newsletter can be found on the city website on the statement. It was decided to stop mailing the newsletter and not to add a fee at this time.

Royce Swensen stated that Parkside Cove has an HOA common area and the residents are very concerned about how much it costs to water it. If each home paid an individual rate they would be paying less. They go through the tiers quickly because it is one bill for the whole area. Mayor Ellis proposed to divide it as though they are an individual unit. Mayor Ellis presented his calculations showing the difference between billing methods which included what the inside water use would be. Mayor Ellis feels that this is a fair way to treat these residents. Council was in agreement.

Mayor Ellis presented the calculated monthly the cost for Payson City for the Gladstan Golf Course and the homes around the golf course that will receive water from Elk Ridge. Nelson Abbott stated that this is fair and would like to be able to adjust this if needed. The council members agreed is the average per month with the cost being spread out so it is lower in the winter and higher in the summer

Mayor Ellis stated that there is a line on the fee schedule stating that fees for non-residents will be doubled. Nelson Abbott stated that this was added to the fee schedule for 1 household that is not an in the city boundary that has a connection. Royce Swensen stated the utilities has never been applied even before he started working for Elk Ridge. Mayor Ellis recommends removing it from the fee schedule.

3. PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENT 10-12-26 STORAGE OF COMMERCIAL VEHICLES IN RESIDENTIAL ZONES PROHIBITED: EXCEPTION 20-7

Jared Peterson stated that he has gotten a lot of calls about this code. There seems to be confusion on the current code with tonnage. According to the code and the tonnage that can be held in some of the larger pickup trucks, it would make these pickups not be allowed to be parked in the city. He presented an amended ordinance to allow commercial trucks to park in the city. Tricia Thomas wanted to know if that meant that you can park all your commercial vehicles in the street. Cory Thompson asked for clarification about size restrictions, could someone park a whole fleet of tractor trailers in the city? There is someone who has a couple of large dump trucks that are parked in the gravel in front of their house. He has personally been listened to complains about these trucks by residents. Jared Peterson stated that it also goes back to property rights and being able to park your vehicles on your own property. Mayor Ellis asked when do you change the residential zone, which consist of rvs, to big dump trucks parked all over someones property; where is the line. Tricia Thomas is concerned about what kind of wear and tear this would put on the city streets. Cory Thompson feels that the ordinance is written too broad. Nelson Abbott stated that maybe the line is drawn on the kind of license it takes to drive a vehicle. Discussion ensued on what kind of commercial vehicles would be restricted and what affect would it have on a residential neighborhood. Are residential neighborhoods the appropriate place to park commercial trucks? Jared Peterson will rework the amendment for further discussion next meeting

4. WATER CONNECTION AGREEMENT WITH SALEM/ARIVE HOMES

<u>David Jean</u> stated that Dean Ingram is doing a subdivision in Salem next to Elk Ridge on the north end of the city. Dean needs a 2nd water source. Dean proposed to hook into Elk Ridge City on Dear Creek Trail that would provide that second connection. This would only be a temporary emergency connection incase the Salem primary water source failed. David Jean stated that his concerns are 1) the agreement,

drafted by Salem City, states in Section 5 Elk Ridge will be allowed access to the water connection for inspection purposes with 24 hours notification to Salem City. David does not want someone else having control over the city water system. If David needs to look at it then he needs to be able to do it whenever he needs...not in 24 hours with their permission. 2) Salem will read and provide all reads to Elk Ridge. Elk Ridge should be the one reading any water usage. There is no mention of a back flow protection. It only mentions 1 meter not a dual meter. Mayor Ellis stated that each party should have to turn their own water on in order for it to be transferred. Nelson Abbott stated that Salem is now dark sky compliant and feels they need to put the baffles in the street lights. This benefits really only Salem, Elk Ridge would have to lose 3 water sources in order for it to benefit Elk Ridge and Salem would only be able to pump water to just below Goosenest. Tricia Thomas asked to confirm if this is for Salem or the developer. David stated that Salem has asked about doing this before but was wanting to have it done through development, which it would be now. Mayor Ellis stated that he wants to do the right think with our Elk Ridge neighbor but the city cannot give up control of the water system at this connection. It would be billed at the wholesale water rate fee. Royce will talk to Salem about the changes needing to be made to the agreement.

5. GARBAGE AGREEMENT WITH REPUBLIC SERVICES

<u>Mayor Ellis</u> stated the city has been subsidizing recycling due to the drop in participation and does not want to continue doing this. <u>Royce Swensen</u> stated that recycling has dropped a lot. The city has to sign an agreement which would go into effect July 1. <u>Nelson Abbott</u> stated if Payson raises the sewer rate then he would like to do the increases to garbage and sewer at the same time. Discussion ensued on the cost of the city doing garbage, which the cost of buying a truck makes it prohibitive. <u>Mayor Ellis</u> stated his recommendation is to do a 3 year contract which is the better deal and there is stability with that as well.

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Mayor Ellis stated that this is to replace the sewer line which traverses Ocampo onto and down Canyon View and examine the water line in the area. There are 3 parts schedule A is the water line that runs down Ocampo and on Canyon View from Park to Ocampo, schedule B sewer- runs all the way down Ocampo onto Canyon View and Park to Bridger. Schedule C is an additional water line that was not included on the original figures estimated at \$50,000. Jared Peterson stated vehicles over 26,000 lb require a CDL and suggested setting the commercial vehicles weight limit starting there and set a limit of how many commercial vehicles could be parked at a residence. And there should be something added to the nuisance code. Discussion ensued on size and weights of vehicles and the effect commercial vehicles and equipment parking in the city would have on residents and define what continuous parking. She recommends to the council they take a walk/drive up there and see what is happening. There are people dumping garbage, making fires not even in pits. Watch the traffic on Hillside, people are bringing bikes on trailers, they aren't even from Elk Ridge. There is no speed control, no helmets, no licenses. She would like the city council to look into seeing what the city can do to fix the problem. Cory Thompson asked Deputy Doyl to look into shots being fired by a very large rifle firing above his home as well. Deputy Doyl stated that the Department of Wildlife is actually firing rounds into the air trying to drive the deer back up onto the mountain. They are notified through central dispatch. Contact dispatch so they can document the time and be able to tell if it is the Department of Wildlife or someone else. Mayor Ellis stated that the city needs to be notified and Deputy Doyl will contact the Department of Wildlife to notify the city administration when they will be put. 4. NRCS LOAFER CANYON PROJECT

Mayor Ellis stated that there are 2 agreements for the easements, one agreement keeps the easements in perpetuity and the other keeps the easements for 5 years only. It is unlikely the residents will sign the in perpetuity agreement. The city needs to approve both of the agreements so the residents can make the choice. Initially a 15 year agreement was proposed which was not agreeable to the residents. The NRCS presented the 5 year plan to the canyon residents and was more agreeable. The unused funds will be used for stimulus opportunities for county residents. Nelson Abbott stated the fire Department has had expenses for PPE and testing. Mayor Ellis stated that the funds can be used for all of those expenses. There will be some items done in the office, such as Plexiglas divider on the counter to help mitigate any exposure.

<u>Thompson</u> wants to do what would do the most good for the city, and Jim Chase would also like to see the numbers on development. <u>Royce Swensen</u> stated that the amount the city will make for raw land is a fraction of what an improved lot would make. <u>Jared Peterson</u> agreed in the amount you lose on an unimproved lot; an improved lot would make \$40,000 to \$50,000 profit. <u>Mayor Ellis</u> stated that he will send this out for bid in order to see what the costs will be.

6. OFFROAD VEHICLES AMENDMENT

Mayor Ellis stated that there is a lot of confusion on this. Mayor Ellis received a letter from Melanie Hoover in which she is concerned about resolving the issue of speeding. There is an issue with out of control individuals riding ATVs full throttle down city streets late at night. This not a speeding issue; the Deputy is already taking care of that matter. The Deputy is stopping everyone and talking to them about helmet laws, speed etc. This has made somewhat of a difference. The other part of this is that if you read state code the OHV ordinance the city has in place does not pertain to street legal OHV. Any properly licensed OHV is permitted on any street that any legal vehicle is permitted. This amendment is not a finished draft, it needs to say it does not apply to street legal OHV. This only effects unlicensed OHV after 10 pm. These bikes can be very loud and having them go past a home at 2 am is not appreciated. Mayor Ellis invited Cory Thompson to make a motion to allow public comment. Cory Thompson does echo the Mayor's words and hopes that everyone will give helpful and constructive feedback.

Melanie Hoover stated that there are thousands of residents in our community and there are only a handful of residents complaining. She understands that this small percentage is very loud. She does not think that one more code change will stop people from driving by homes at night. A hole in a muffler is loud and it is street legal. People move here for the freedom to ride and it will be a sad day to take that right away from us.

Stan Nelson stated that a lot of the issues are being conflated. The concern is there are already codes and ordinances in place to address this. If it's noise-there is a noise ordinance, trespassing-there is a trespassing ordinance. There is no requirement to add additional legislation to solve what is already solved. The only thing that is being done is legislating to address concerns from people instead of looking objectively at the law and saying do we have a law to protect this and enforcing what is already there. He understands it is hard to enforce the law but it is meant to be that way in order not to charge or imprison without proving the burden of the state. He sympathizes with those that have property damaged, those who have been woken by rude and inconsiderate drivers. He is advocating for small and limited government and in his opinion this is government over reach.

Jenny Elder stated her concern is that she does not see that the new law is going to help anything. The city does have laws on the books to stop this. She thinks they need to be more specific. The noise level does not have a decibel level and it is hard to see who has spark arresters, who is over 16 and who has an OHV license. The laws already on the books needs to just be more specific, but that they need to go after the real problem. Is it possible to put a gate at the end of Hillside Dr? Loafer Canyon has a gate and they are in city limits.

Shaun Black stated that the city is targeting a youth group not an adult group. Adults tend to be more respectful. He moved to this area to be able to do what they are trying to take away; not at those hours, but sometimes they would leave early in the morning. You are targeting those who cannot afford to license their vehicles. This is amendment is just for a handful of people who are complaining. If youth are out at 2 am there are laws that cover curfew. This is micromanagement. The laws are already in place.

<u>David Jean</u> stated that he personally does not like having unlicensed ATVS on the road. Anything on the road should be insured.

Michelle Matys stated that she lived in a place where they went from targeting ATVs to trucks to diesels. The over regulation ruined the atmosphere if the city.

Mayor Ellis stated it is extraordinarily difficult to enforce a noise ordinance. The city has tried for years. With decibel levels for instance; there are many variables - how far is it from the noise, is it a certified meter, etc. The city has worked extensively with the sheriff's department and it's very difficult. Is there another mechanism to put in place to help the sheriff's department? There is a segment of the population that is abusing the privilege that has been part of Elk Ridge since 2000. Prior to that 2000 OHVs were not allowed on the city streets. Payson and Salem do not allow them still by code. Mayor Ellis stated that he likes OHVs, he owns them and enjoys them. He is concerned in helping those few that it is effecting. There are those who moved here to be able to ride ATVs, there are some that moved here for the quiet and like to sleep with their window open. As more people move in the abuse becomes more prevalent. What can help the sheriff's department, in a limited restricted fashion, to help stop some of this from infringing on things that others enjoy, like peace and quiet. Cory Thompson stated that there was a very lengthy discussion on a Facebook page. He read all the entries and wanted to echo the Mayor's sentiments. It is exceptionally hard. He knows people move here for the privilege to ride. It is also exceptionally important to respect those that are troubled by and have their rights infringed on by those who are disrespectful and ride late at night and violate the laws. If anyone has any great ideas without having to write code please let the council know. The tool box is limited and the sheriff is one of those tools. If the only thing the city has to stop people is to have them stopped and ticket then that is what the city has. Mayor Ellis stated that there is nothing better than popping on the ATV and buzz the city but there is nothing good going on in the hills above Elk Ridge after 10 at night, he sees it. There are parties, bonfires, fireworks, trash, sex, everything you can imagine happens between 10 pm and 4 am is happening above their city. It's not about trying to take away a privilege, he even uses and enjoys that privilege. Mayor Ellis narrowed down the amendment as far as he could in order to impact the fewest number of people. The sheriff is rotating the times he is at the off road trails and it is making a difference. There is no rush into passing this amendment until the city has something that is worth passing. Thank you all for your comments. Tricia Thomas wanted clarification on to reaching public property do you have to cross private property? People like to go to Four Bay and ride but Payson has now banned all off road riding in Four Bay so riding there is illegal. Mayor Ellis stated that is correct but there isn't much public property. Mayor Ellis stated that even if it is private property, if the property owner doesn't care and will not put up any trespassing signs or restrictions then there will be access through that property. The city does not have the right nor does it want to put up no trespassing signs on someone's private property. Payson is closing Four Bay to all motorized vehicle access. Tricia Thomas stated that the city would like to put a parking lot up there in order to have access to Four Bay. Tricia Thomas and Jared Peterson both attended a meeting on Four Bay and there wasn't anyone at the meetings that wanted motorized vehicles in Four Bay.

7. LEASH LAW CODE

Jim Chase stated that he was approached by someone who was playing with their dog at the park. There are dogs on and off leashes at the park and suggested making a portion of Shuler Park a dog park. Discussion ensued on waste, fencing and possible locations. Tricia Thomas stated that it was recommended to her that the city put in directional arrows on the track due to Covid 19 so people can better avoid close contact in passing. The council will go on a field trip to look at a possible dog park and for directional arrows on the track next council meeting.

8. FINANCIAL REVIEW

Jim Chase stated that the \$75,000 for elections was still on the financials. <u>Royce Swensen</u> stated that in order to change that number they would have to have a public hearing but there isn't any need. This is the last review from last years budget and can't be changed and can't be spent. It's a scrivener error.

1. SMART PROPERTY CONCEPT DISCUSSION

Cody Doan, Integrel Reality, Mark Greenwood with ALM and Associates came in a few weeks ago and met with Royce regarding the Smart property. Mark Greenwood stated he has owned ALM for 27 years and has done 7000 different projects, about 30% of them has been commercial. They would like to do12,000 sq. ft residential lots. The commercial property is the challenging piece. Trying to get tenants with the city roof count is going to be a challenge, especially with other services close by. Discussion ensued on what size business and type of business would realistically work in Elk Ridge. Their concept is to not do a strip mall but parcel out the lots in 1 -1 ½ acres. They would sell individual lots dependent upon the buyer needs or do long-term land leases. The residential side will fill up quickly the commercial will be slower. They will prepare something more detailed to bring in to discuss with the council.

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2. KNOTT'S SUBDIVISION PRELIMINARY AND FINAL PLAT

Mayor Ellis stated the Knotts bought a small triangle piece next to their property long ago that was not on a plat map. The Knotts needed to do a one lot subdivision in order to add that triangle to their parcel and move the utility easement in order to build an addition to their home.

3. COMMERCIAL VEHICLE CODE AMENDMENT DISCUSSION ONLY

Mayor Ellis stated the Planning Commission discussed the proposed code amendment and they had a lot of questions as to the intent of the amendment. The intent was to make it clearer, but some commission members thought it was less clear. The amendment also tries to clarify what it means to be a residential neighborhood in a bedroom community. When you move to a neighborhood and residential zone you give up some property rights to live there; you can't just build whatever you want or do whatever you want just because you own the land. There are certain zone restrictions in any zone. <u>Jared Peterson</u> stated he had spoken with a couple members of the Planning Commission to understand their concerns. <u>Tricia Thomas</u> stated that as property owners there is also the side of not wanting to deal with commercial vehicles next door. <u>Mayor Ellis</u> stated that this will go to public hearing next meeting and asked that all council members study the proposal and make sure they are in agreement with the language of the amendment.

4. WATER LINE REPLACEMENT, AUTUMN CIRCLE

<u>David Jean</u> stated that on Autumn Circle there is a 2-inch galvanized pipe that comes off the main line which service 2 homes on Autumn Circle. There is a leak on the 2-inch line that public works was not able to fix because the line is too deteriorated. They were only able to slow the leak. The 2-inch line needed to be replaced and a fire hydrant needed placed in the Circle. It was just under \$8000 to purchase the materials. The city is doing all the work. Autumn Circle is also a good candidate for the city's road project to get an overlay. The sewer line is good on Autumn Circle. <u>Mayor Ellis</u> stated that the council needs to move this to public hearing to amend the budget. <u>David Jean</u> suggested that \$20,000 would most likely cover the materials to fix the pipe and overlay the road.

Jared Peterson stated that the city has an issue in the R&L zone. A resident has 7 acres and has an existing corral and dedicated animal management area and would like to put in a hay barn or horse shelter. They have an acre of landscaped yard between the dedicated animal management area and the home. In order to follow code they would have to put the barn on the landscaped area. The code states that a structure has to be closer to the homeowners home then a neighboring home and be located no closer than seventy-five feet (75') from an adjacent lot residential building. This is zoned for livestock - Discussion ensued on whether a resident should be able to put a barn right across a fence from a neighboring home, should the city go by the setbacks already established in the R&L Zone. Discussion ensued on whether one should expect to deal with livestock noise and smell because they built or bought a home in that zone. It was suggested that the following lines be eliminated and modify the setbacks: Eliminate - "Barns, sheds, coops, corrals, feeding areas, water troughs, stables, hutches, and other animal related needs shall be located no closer than seventy five feet (75') from an adjacent lot residential building. The structures must be closer to the owner's residential building than neighboring residential buildings" Jared Peterson will draft the amendment with 25 feet setback from residential for livestock structures bordering non-livestock zone.
