- Applicants' chances of admission are enhanced by taking MATH 1151-2 or 1161-2 (rather than 1131) and ECON 2001H and 2002H. Some students will be asked to do a short interview with the program director. Note only MATH 1131 or 1151 are required for Business majors.
- Students are encouraged to take additional Economics or Mathematics (especially MATH 2568) and to pursue minors or second majors in Economics or Statistics.
- The following honors accounting courses are required to graduate with honors in accounting: 2200H, 2300H, 3100H, 3200H, 3201H, and 3300H. For additional requirements to graduate with honors accounting, visit <u>"Honors in Accounting"</u>. Also required is an A or A- in a non-accounting honors course.
- 3100H is required for <u>all</u> accounting honors program students and ideally is to be taken during Spring of sophomore year.
- Bus MHR 2292 is waived for students who <u>complete</u> the Accounting Honors program.
- Students who take STAT 4201 and 4202 for the Statistics Minor may substitute those classes for STAT 1430 and BUSMGT 2320.
- The Accounting Honors program structure does not allow for winter internships, but the majority of Accounting Honors students complete summer internships in accounting, business, or government. Some students do an internship as early as summer of the sophomore year (25%); the majority of Accounting Honors students do internships in summer of the junior year (90%). The Director welcomes questions about internships and full-time employment. - Accounting Honors Program students who enter the Combined BSBA/Master of Accounting Program may substitute: (1) ACCTMIS 7230 and 7250 for ACCTMIS 5200H, and (2) ACCTMIS 7500 and 7510 for ACCTMIS 5500H. Each option substitutes two 7-week graduate courses for one semester undergraduate honors course. Also, Combined BSBA/MAcc students will gain credit for BUSMHR 4490 by taking MAcc core classes ACCTMIS 6000 and 6201. Please consult with Rob Chabot or Professor Tzachi Zach as early as possible if you are interested in this program.
