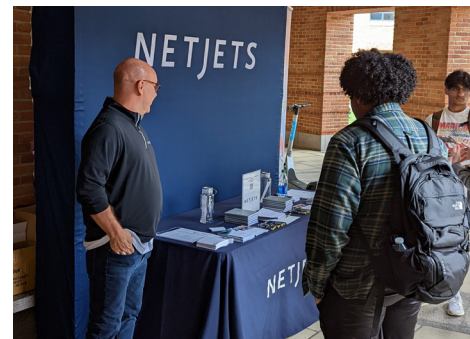

This annual report is truly a celebration of the 2023-2024 academic year showcasing the outstanding Office of Career Management at Fisher College of Business staff who greatly impact the outcomes on the following pages.

This past year our office re-structured and now serves students by discipline such as accounting, finance, etc. as opposed to degree. We've heard positive feedback from our employer partners in accounting and others including Pam Miller of Cardinal Health who said, "I'm so glad you're organized by discipline now. It makes it so much easier for me to go to the person I need to talk to about filling a position."

"At Fisher, each specialization offers a unique path to success," said Kunsh Puranik, an undergraduate student. "The dedicated career coach for my major has been instrumental in crafting a targeted internship and job strategy, understanding the recruiting cycle specific to my desired roles, and providing invaluable networking opportunities within my chosen industry."

The Office of Career Management at Fisher College of Business will continue to innovate and utilize best practices to help our students find the very best jobs with the very best companies. The following pages highlight the numerous events and visits staff had with employers, and the various excursions our students took. We truly want to be creating connections!

2023-2024 Highlights:

- Starting salaries for all Fisher undergraduate students increased slightly this past year to \$68,832 – another new record.
- The Masters in Human Resource Management program also saw an increase in salary of nearly 9% to \$77,585.
- Undergraduate student outcome success 3-months after graduation increased from 87% to 88%.
- The full-time MBA program is now ranked 30th and 11th among public universities by *U.S. News & World Report*.

With Ohio State and Fisher's record enrollments, it's wonderful to share such positive student outcomes. Fisher continues to be a sought-after destination for both students and employers. It is truly a privilege to do the work that we do bringing these two constituents together as our students become alumni and begin to pay it forward for future Buckeyes!

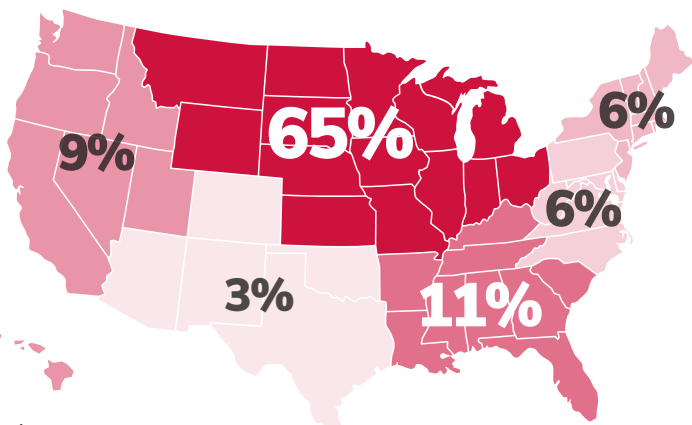

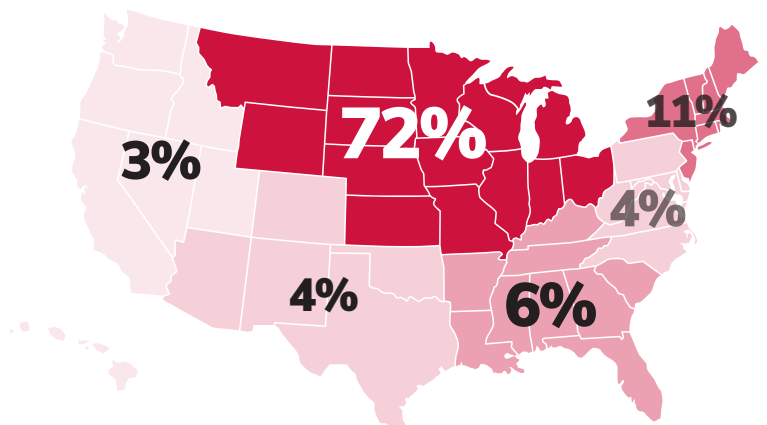

Employer Relations

The Office of Career Management at Fisher College of Business connects Fisher students with top companies, striving to be every employer's favorite place to recruit.

Employer of the Day

A premier event allowing employers to meet students in high-traffic areas like Alutto Quad and Mason Hall. The event is promoted via social media, email and posters. In 2023-24, 40 companies, including J.M. Smucker Co. and ABB, participated.

Employer Summer Visits

The Office of Career Management at Fisher College of Business staff visited companies in Cleveland, Cincinnati and Columbus to strengthen recruiting relationships. Ten employers, including Cardinal Health and Procter & Gamble, were visited.

Participating in Alumni Events

Fisher hosts alumni events to build connections. Young alumni working at top firms are often invited, expanding recruiting opportunities.

Career Fairs

Fisher hosts four career fairs annually, including the major Fisher Fall and Spring Career Fairs and the smaller, informal Not Another Career Fair and Just In Time Job Fair.

Summer Employer Check-ins

Virtual meetings with employers are held during the summer to help prepare for fall recruiting and facilitate connections with student organizations and faculty.

- **Networking and relationship building:** Strategies for building and maintaining professional networks.
- **Job search strategy and offer assessment:** Personalized job search strategies and guidance on evaluating offers.

Students also had the unique opportunity to engage with Jamie Mathews-Mead, senior director of the Office of Career Management at Fisher College of Business and MBA Career Coach. Jamie’s extensive experience as a certified career coach provided invaluable support, as she facilitated sessions, presented insights and met with each Full-Time MBA student individually.

Fisher Integrated Business and Engineering Program

The Integrated Business and Engineering (IBE) Honors Program is a challenging four-year program designed to help prepare the next generation of business and technology leaders to operate effectively across business and technical domains and to learn an interdisciplinary approach to problem solving.



The Need:

An increasingly interconnected global economy creates collaborative opportunities and competitive pressures for U.S. companies, generating the need for broadly educated engineers and business professionals. Ohio State's IBE program equips graduates to meet these challenges head on.

Our Approach:

The Ohio State University's College of Engineering and Fisher College of Business jointly offer the multidisciplinary undergraduate IBE honors program where engineering and business students take classes, attack real-world problems and network with industry leaders throughout their undergraduate experience. The program supplements the standard engineering or business curriculum with core courses of the opposite degree and includes a sequence of dedicated IBE courses and seminars focused on experiential, entrepreneurial and multidisciplinary learning. In class, IBE students work in teams to solve problems and create solutions while applying classroom theory and learning.

Employment Outcomes:

- Class of 2024 IBE students received an average salary of \$93,688.
- Our IBE students are recruited for internships and full-time positions from top employers.
- 92% of students accepted an employment offer within three months of graduation.
- IBE graduates have joined graduate programs at institutions such as the University of California-Berkeley, the University of Chicago, Harvard University, Stanford University and the Stockholm School of Economics.

Fisher Futures Investment Banking Program

Fisher Futures is a highly competitive, selective program that guides students through the internship search and interview process for investment banking. Through a career development course during their sophomore year and student mentorship, students are educated on topics such as financial modeling and business valuation, in addition to career development skills including behavioral and technical interviewing and professional networking.

Fisher Futures students had the opportunity to travel to New York and Chicago, visiting various investment banks and private equity firms, ultimately learning about different career paths and industries. Students had the opportunity to network with Fisher College of Business alumni at the bank visits and alumni receptions in each city. The experiential aspects of these trips are the highlight of the Fisher Futures program.

The Fisher Emerging Consultants (FEC) program offers the following learning objectives:

- Students will gain awareness of recruitment expectations and opportunities offered at a variety of consulting firms.
- Students will develop a customized job or internship search strategy plan by the end of the course.
- Students will be able to communicate qualifications, aligned with the expectations of consulting firms, for consulting opportunities through practice behavioral questions.
- Students will execute case interviewing skills, including summarizing, developing a framework, mental math and providing recommendations, through practice case opportunities.
- Students will apply networking skills by creating connections through LinkedIn with course speakers.
- Students will demonstrate professionalism through business communications, including thank you note writing.

Program Highlights:

- The 2024 FEC program was our largest class to date, with 30 second-year and third-year students completing the program.
- FEC hosted eight firms to share information on career pathways, projects and upcoming recruiting opportunities.
- New this year, each FEC student received a year-long subscription to *RocketBlocks*, an online interview preparation platform.

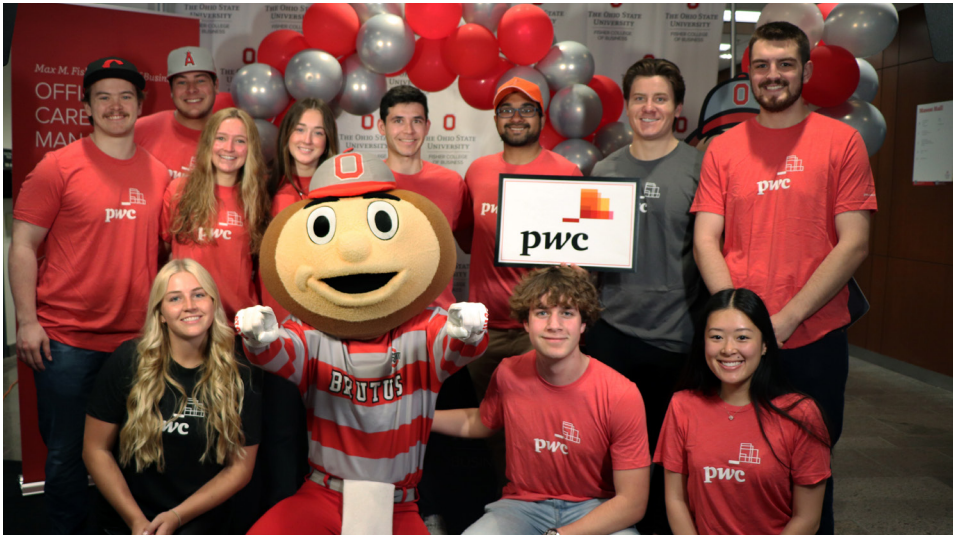

Student Organizations

This year, the Office of Career Management at Fisher College of Business increased our collaboration with all Fisher student professional organizations. Students get targeted career guidance, employers gain access to Fisher talent and our office fosters a supportive environment for career success!

Targeted Outreach:

Teaming up with Fisher student organizations allows our career coaches access to students with specific academic and professional interests. We can tailor workshops, mock interviews and industry talks to the needs of all Fisher majors, and the students learn job-seeking skills in a familiar setting.

Industry Insights:

The Office of Career Management connects our employer partners to student organizations. In turn, student organizations invite these employers to host chapter meetings, employer panels and company case competitions, giving students a direct line to potential employers.

Specialized Career Fair Collaboration:

Fisher's Office of Career Management teams up with several student organizations to plan specialized career fairs, including the Accounting Career Fair (Accounting Association), the Finance Career Fair (Undergraduate Finance Association) and the Logistics and Supply Chain Career Fair (The Logistics Association). With our employer connections and planning expertise, these specialized career fairs have connected thousands of Fisher students to their future employers.

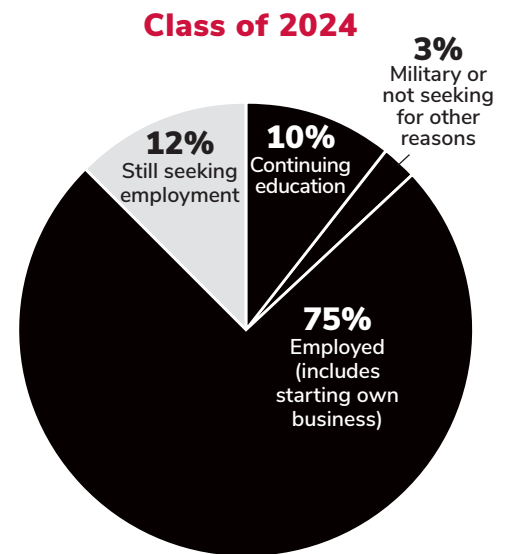

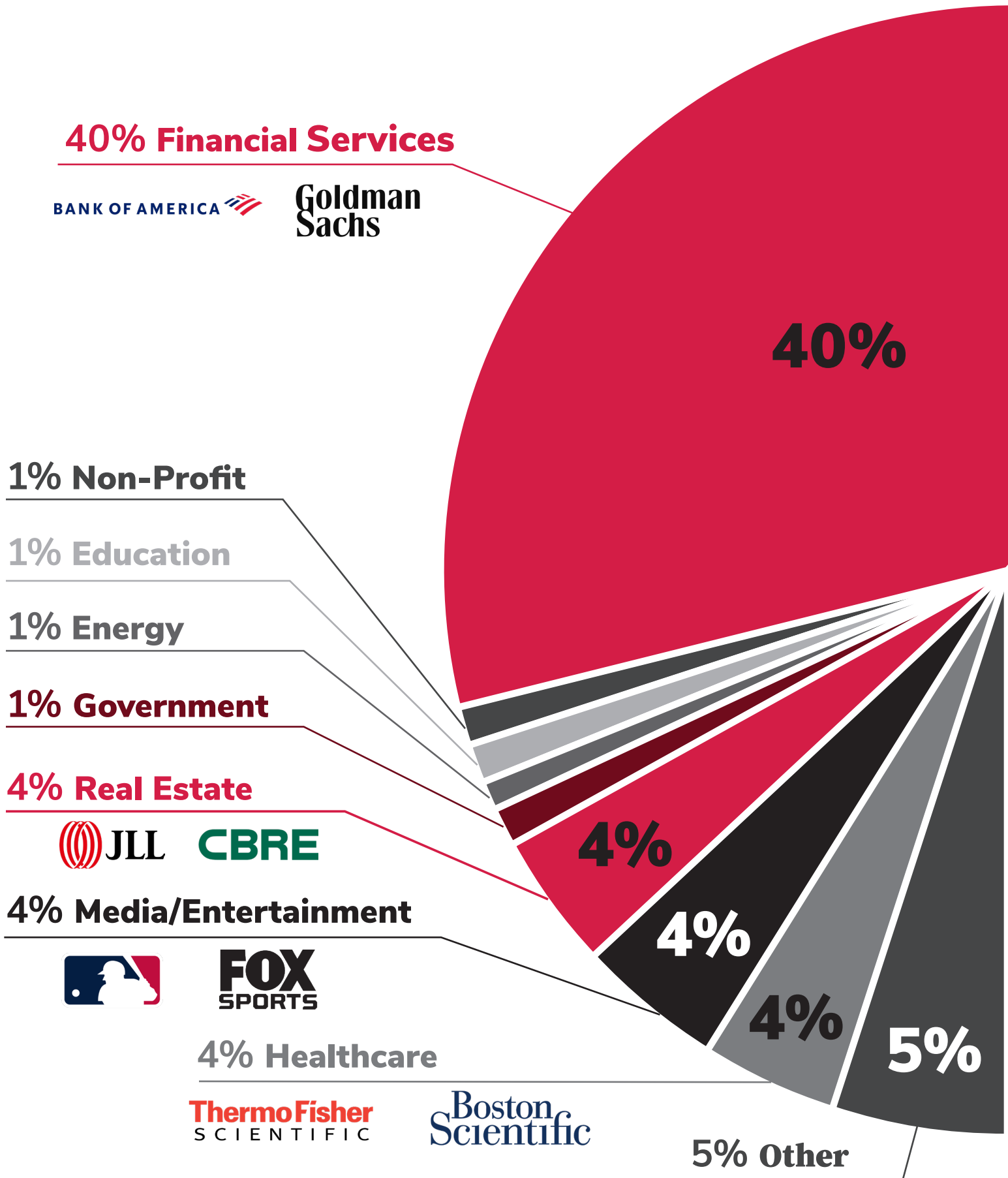

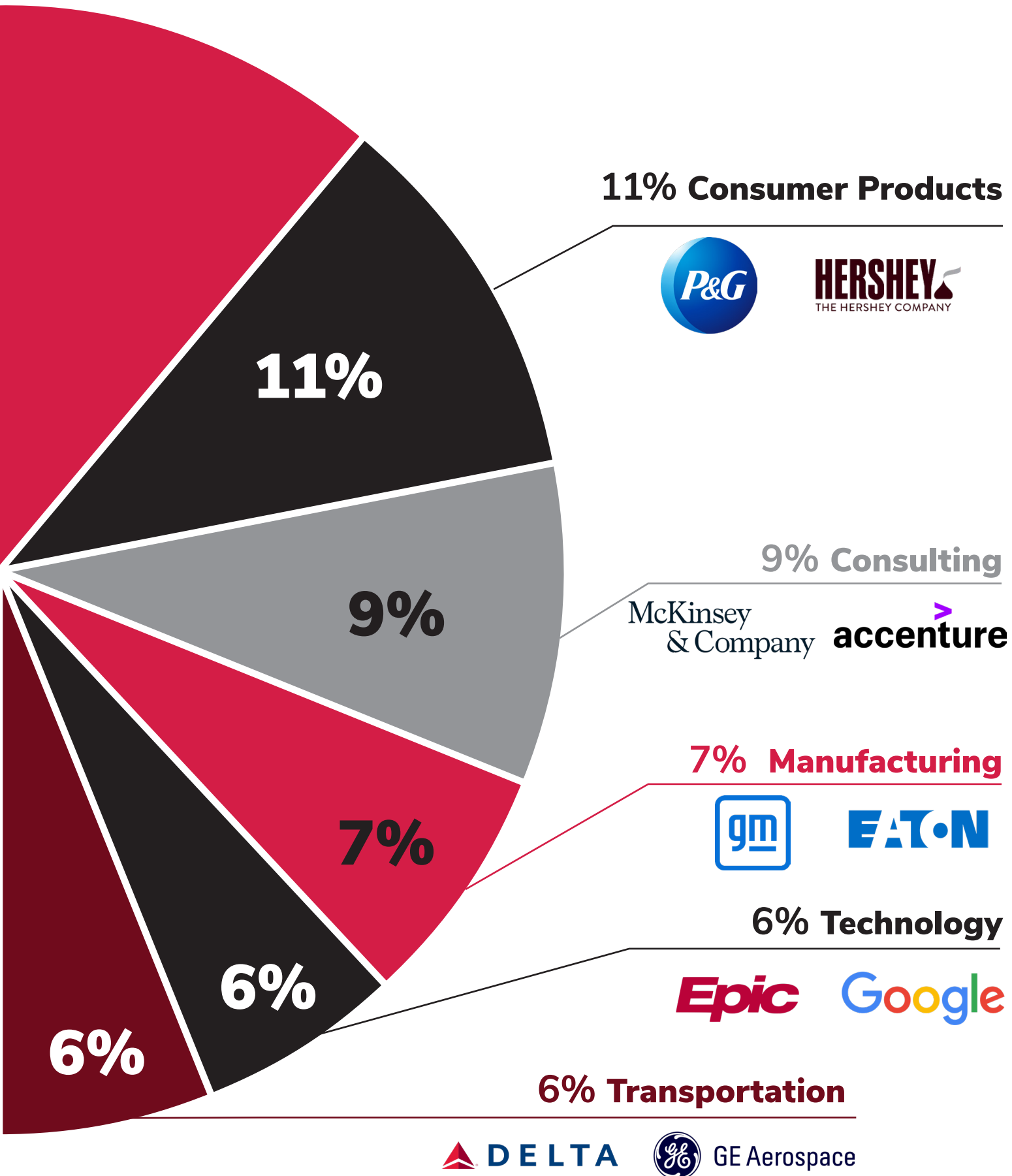
