Enhancing productivity through efficiency and effectiveness

Converting materials and labor into goods/services

Outputs include both tangible (e.g., goods, utilities) and intangible (e.g., healthcare, finance, transportation) services

Operations Manager: Maximize efficiency in business practices

Inventory Planning & Control: Forecasting inventory needs

Operations Scheduling & Control: Resource timing and task management

Quality Management: Maintain excellence in operations

Traffic Management & Distribution: Organize and control movement of goods and people
